



#### FROM THE SOUTH

Greetings, from the South Gate,

What a beautiful degree Brothers Tony Rossi and Miguel Vargas received from a very impressive degree team. Well done, brethren.

Just before the candidate's circumambulation, I whispered to a visiting DDGM that this scripture did not makes sense to me. Then, why do we use it? So, I delved, and to my delight and further enlightenment, here is what I learned and understand:

behold how good and pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity. It is like the precious ointment upon the head that ran down upon the beard, even Aaron's beard, that went down to the skirts of his garments...... and so forth.

To dwell together in unity.... the happiness of brotherly love, promoting each other's welfare with mutual services.

What ointment? And, why was ointment poured on his head?

In Hebrew the meaning of the name Aaron is: Lofty; exalted; high mountain. Biblically, Aaron was Moses' older brother (and keeper by God's command). He was first high priest of the Israelites, remembered for the miraculous blossoming of his staff or rod. Even the Quran contains numerous references to Aaron, as a prophet of God, saying that both Moses and Aaron were entrusted to establish places of dwelling for the Israelites in Egypt, and to convert those houses into places of worship for God (Quran 10:87). The Quran repeatedly calls Aaron a "believing servant," as well as one who is "guided" and one of the "victors."

Because Moses complained that he could not speak well, God appointed Moses and Aaron "prophets" (Exodus 4:10-17; 7:1) where Aaron served as his younger brother's spokesperson. Part of the Law (Torah) that Moses received from God at Sinai granted Aaron the priesthood for himself and his male descendants, and he became the High Priest of the Israelites. The Gospel of Luke records that John The Baptist is a descendent of Aaron.

The Jewish rabbis particularly praise the brotherly sentiment between Aaron and Moses. When Moses was appointed ruler and Aaron high priest, neither betrayed any jealousy; instead they rejoiced in each other's greatness. When Moses, at first, declined to go to Pharaoh, saying: "O my Lord, send, I pray, by the hand of him whom you will send" (Exodus 4:13), he was unwilling to deprive Aaron of the high position the latter had held for so many years; but the Lord reassured him, saying: "Behold, when he sees you, he will be glad in his heart" Indeed, Aaron was to find his reward, for that heart which had leaped with joy over his younger brother's rise to glory, greater than his, which were to "be upon Aaron's heart when he goeth in before the Lord". Moses and Aaron met in gladness of heart, kissing each other as true brothers, and of them it is written: "Behold how good and how pleasant [it is] for brethren to dwell together in unity!" (Psalm 133:1). Of them it is said: "Mercy and truth are met together; righteousness and peace have kissed [each other]," for Moses stood for righteousness (Deuteronomy 33:21) and Aaron for peace (Malachi 2:6). And we, as brethren, should dwell together in unity and brotherly love, righteousness and peace.

When Moses poured the oil of anointment (scented with myrrh, cinnamon, cane and cassia, a recipe from God) upon Aaron's head, Aaron modestly shrank back and said: "Who knows whether I have not cast some blemish upon this sacred oil so as to forfeit this high office." Then the Shekhinah spoke the words: "Behold the precious ointment upon the head, that ran down upon the beard of Aaron, that even went down to the skirts of his garment (representing God's overflowing, plentiful blessings), is as pure as the dew of Hermon" (Psalm 133:2-3). Mt. Hermon is the highest peak (9000 ft) in Israel and receives more moisture than Mt. Zion, making it more lush and pure. Without that dew, Mt. Hermon and Mt. Zion would be as dry and dusty as the desert below them. The dew symbolizes what is refreshing and invigorating... a fitting symbol of the Lord's blessings.

And, that, my brethren, gave me a whole new enlightenment to the Chaplain's scripture reading during the candidates' circumambulation.

#### FROM THE SECRETARIES DESK

What does your secretary do for you... well, take note:

Secretary duties over the summer when he's not winning the bowling tournaments.

June,

Our Farmers Insurance policy is due in June. It should be paid immediately on receipt. I recommend that you use the Lodge Debit card to do it.

Upon payment being completed, you will need to send out copies of our current certificate of insurance to:

Grand Lodge of Arizona: Request that they be named as an "additional insured". – Note: Amber's office may take care of this automatically, but it does not hurt to confirm.

PVST #29: Request that they be named as an "additional insured".

ROJO Hospitality Group as an "additional insured".

Send to Grand Lodge the monthly Form 14.

July,

You the Secretary must give a report at the June or July stated meeting on the current number of members and candidates (and their progression). The format will be something like this example: "We have 41 members in good standing, 1 MM working on his proficiency, 17 PLMs, 2 SLMs, 2 Reg 19s for a total of 63 members. We also have 2 EAs and 2 FCs working on proficiencies." There is a report in the database where you can get this summary information.

You must also report on dues received for the current year and a summary report on any brothers who are delinquent, how far in arrears they may be, and whether or not you have had any contact with them. I strongly recommend that you do not mention these brother's names in the minutes. For example, you could say: "We have 41 dues paying members in the Lodge, of which 37 are current and 4 are delinquent. Of the delinquent brothers, I have contacted all of them, 2 have committed to getting their dues current in the next couple of months." There is a report in the database for this purpose.

You should be prepared to report on Candidate proficiency progress.

Send to Grand Lodge the monthly Form 14.

#### August,

Sometime during this month, the trustees should audit the 1st half of the year. Send to Grand Lodge the monthly Form 14.

Keep an ongoing true and accurate record of Enter lodge business into the database
Keep up with all lodge correspondence
Coordinate with the lodge master to keep his term agenda rolling
Check the mail, answer emails

There are not less than 28 emails to the lodge since our last stated meeting June 11th 2019.

Coach, advise and mentor lodge members and candidates when assigned

Visit ill and ailing members and widows

Send get well cards

Track dues payments and contact delinquent members

Track new members on degrees, fees, educational material,

#### FROM THE CHAPLIN

"FELLOWSHIP

We come to Masonry in many ways. It may be through our family, a friend, a desire to be a part of something or even simple curiosity. If we stay active in Masonry and progress on our Masonic journey, we learn many things. Some become more important to us than others. In the end however, there is one thing more than any other that keeps us active in Masonry. This attribute of our society is not dependent upon whether we go "up

through the line", whether we gain high Masonic honors, are a toiler in the vineyards, or a perennial sideliner. What is this one attribute that rises above all the other gifts that Masonry bestows upon us? It is Fellowship. But what, really, is fellowship?

The word fellowship comes from the Greek word koinonia, which could be translated "fellowship," "partnership," or "communion." And it even could be translated "to be generous." So this word koinonia encompasses all those ideas. It is far more than socializing. It is where people get together to talk about the things of God.

The things of God? Religion is one of the topics expressly forbidden in discussion in Lodge. Yet, although Masonry is not a religion, it is essentially religious. We preface our meals by asking God's blessing upon the food and upon the people there assembled. We open our Lodges, whether for business or Work, with prayer. We close with prayer that we may keep out of the Lodge those values we learn in our Lodges.

So, Fellowship is praying together. It is serving together. It is giving together. We look around and see that it is aging together. These are the fibers of fellowship. Fellowship with God and with His people go together. And if you find yourself out of fellowship with God, you will soon find yourself out of fellowship with other people, including your Brothers in Lodge, as well.
