The Masonic Connection

Gutzon Borglum, who was master of Howard Lodge 35 in New York City, accepted an invitation to come to the Black Hills to explore a proposal to carve a sculpture at the needles. Borglum quickly rejected the proposal as too small for his grand vision and scoured the Black Hills until selecting the current site for Mount Rushmore. When he found what he believed was the perfect location, he stated:

"Let us place there, carved high, as close to the heavens as we can, the words of our leaders, their faces, to show posteril what manner of men they were. Then breathe a prayer that these records will endure until the winds and rain alone shall wear them away."


Why these four presidents

At the time in our country's history, Washington and Lincoln were considered the two greatest presidents, Jefferson a close third and Teddy Roosevelt was a man Borglum personally admired and supported in his bids for the presidency. In March of 1925 both the United States Congress and the South Dakota Legislature passed legislation allowing the project to occur.

Two of the four presidents sculpted on the mountain were masons. George Washington, the father of masonry in America was a member of the Fredericksburg Lodge in Fredericksburg, Virginia. Teddy Roosevelt, well known in the Dakotas was a member of Matinecock Lodge #806 in Oyster Bay, New York. Abraham Lincoln was not a freemason. He did apply for membership in Tyrian Lodge, Springfield, Illinois; however, shortly after his nomination for presidency in 1860, he withdrew his application because he felt that the perception would be that of a political ruse to obtain votes. He advised the lodge that he would resubmit his application again after he returned from the presidency. On April 17, 1865, after the death of Lincoln, Tyrian Lodge adopted a resolution stating:

"that the decision of Presid<mark>e</mark>nt Lincoln to postpone his application for the honors of Freemasonry, lest his motives be misconstrued, is the highest degree honorable to his memory"


