FROM THE TREASURER

Assimilation and Engagement

Masonic lodges throughout many countries are faced with similar problems. Member retention and dwindling active membership. Ask yourself how many of the lodge brothers do you actually know, and how many of these brothers would you actually recognize outside of lodge. I have visited many lodges where only approximately 15% of the total membership regularly attend stated meetings. Does this sound like your lodge? Do you personally know the other 85% of the brothers? If not, consider this as a stated objective for the upcoming year.

Take a look at the current active membership of your lodge. Typically, you will find; young newer members with a zest for becoming included in the line, A core group of brothers who are active on a regular basis and have held many stations over their years as masons, and an elderly contingent of brothers who have been the foundation for the lodge. Regardless of the demographics, the problems can be addressed as assimilation or engagement. These issues are easily resolvable within the core values of our brotherhood. Let's address the needs of these demographics.

The Candidate

Assimilation is the key to a fulfilling masonic journey. When the candidate first petitions a lodge for membership, understand that he basically knows only a few brothers. The first 6 months the candidate is expected to come to events and get to know the brothers. What really happens. The few brothers who know the candidate introduce him to the other members. Is he expected to remember everyone he meets, or to recognize them outside of the lodge? The expectation may be there, but the results are too often poor. From another perspective, do the lodge brothers remember the candidate and would they recognize them outside of the lodge event? Again, the results are questionable. Granted the more often a candidate attends, the more often the brothers will start to remember who they are.

First, we need to recognize that often the candidates are younger, and they are in a very demanding stage of their lives. With demands coming from work schedules, family activities, church activities they are often torn between priorities, and too often the lodge activities come in conflict with life demands.

There are several things that will improve the assimilation process for candidates with current lodge brothers. I would encourage all lodges to create a proactive plan of activities for our candidates. The focus should not only be on the candidate but on their families where appropriate.

Recognizing that these activities should not be planned concurrently with tiled lodge meeting. For example, conduct a candidate table lodge with their family and friends. Not in the budget? Make it a potluck, that way the candidate and his family are actively contributing to the masonic experience. When there are children involved, plan some fun activities for the kids during the event. When everyone in the candidate's family participates and is having fun, the smoother the assimilation is to the masonic life. Also consider that if the candidates have children, they may be future DeMolay, Jobs Daughters, or Rainbow girls. Ask these organizations to participate in the events as well. Activities like these should be a bimonthly occurrence.

Break the barrier! Publish a candidate and member directory to all brothers and to the candidates. This will address the sight recognition problem that we all have. Next time you are at a lodge meeting and you see someone you don't know; can you tell if they are a brother or a candidate? Probably not. A current directory will bring us all closer. This is what our brotherhood is all about!

Members who no longer attend lodge generally have had some circumstances in their life that have changed their priority. This could be geographically related, age related, health related or just time related. These members need to be re-engaged. Take a proactive approach, for the brothers who maintain their dues but are no longer in the geographic area, maintain the communication and let them know that you care and are missed. For the brothers that are in the area, if we don't know, then we obviously did not care. That is not what we are about. A calling committee may help in some instances but what about the brother who thinks:

I haven't been to lodge in so long that I don't know anyone anymore.

Or

I can't even remember the ritual; I don't want to embarrass myself.

I again contend that a lodge directory will facilitate communication. I also believe that as a lodge, we should proactively engage these members to return.

How the heck do we do that?

How about a member engagement challenge? If each brother could identify a non-active member living close to them, take the time to go over and meet with them, present them with the lodge directory and offer to pick them up and bring them to the next lodge meeting or activity, not only do we make or renew a friendship, but we are living the precepts of brotherly love.
