Despite Covid, the Lodge has pressed on this summer continuing to not only meet and conduct Lodge business, but also confer degrees. My Brothers, Covid-19 is going to take a very big toll on a number of organizations, nonprofits, Lodges, and the like here in 2020. It is going to be a struggle for many Lodges to get

through this pandemic. With the meeting restrictions for large groups, mask requirements, and overall fear of contracting this virus, Lodges find themselves "out of sight and out of mind". Despite efforts to use zoom as a medium to still meet up, participation overall is well below our norm. Opportunities, through fundraisers, to raise needed funds for our Community Service endeavors, are limited – if not eliminated. Opportunities to get out and about in our community, to be seen and do good, and further promote not only Phoenicia #58 but Masonry in general, simply do not exist in the current environment. Overall, this was the 3<sup>ed</sup> bottle of GW Whiskey we have raffled, totaling more than \$5,000 in collected funds for the Lodge. The Masonic Guitar also brought in more than \$1,000 in additional funds – funds that will be put to excellent use. With those over, well, it's time to get another fundraiser rolling.

Second, it needs a group of Trustees to maintain the long-term financial interest of the lodge. Finally, it needs two Brothers who are charged with the current financial and administration of the lodge.

It is the final set of elected officials that we need to change how we do business as a lodge. These are critical positions to the lodge that require time and dedication. However, they have

a history of burning brothers out, or causing a brother to be thrown into the position with no opportunity to learn the job before the job needs to be done. This is due to the longevity of the tenure in position with no plan to transition or learn the role. Our lodge simply cannot continue this practice. There is simply two much weight on key positions for too long. "Coming together is a beginning. Keeping together is progress. Working together is success. "~ Henry Ford

Our current Secretary and Treasure are doing a great job. Now is the perfect time to train more of our lodge on the What and How the lodge is truly run. So here is my call to action: Review the duties of the positions below and determine when you can start to learn these vital skills and processes to help keep this lodge a success. Reach out to me with any questions or concerns. If we continue to wait for "someone else" we will be waiting until we are in crisis again.

Secretary Duties:

- •Observe the Worshipful Master's will and pleasure
- •Record the proceedings of the Lodge and to transmit a copy to the Grand Lodge, if required
- •Keep the records of the Lodge regularly, fairly and faithfully
- •Receive all monies due to the Lodge and pay the same to Treasurer
- •Make a written Financial Report to the Lodge at the Quarterly Stated Meetings
- •Make a report to the Grand Lodge at the close of the Masonic Year
- •Keep the seal of the Lodge and affix it to all official documents emanating from the Lodge or his office
- •Notify the Brothers of delinquencies in their dues
- •Send all notices and summons when ordered by the Worshipful Master or other competent authority
- •To notify the Grand Secretary of any expulsions or suspensions
- •To keep a visitor's book
- •To attend upon trials and meetings for taking evidence
- •To furnish copies of all evidence taken on trials where an appeal to Grand Lodge is demanded
- •To furnish diplomas, demits and certificates, duly signed and sealed, by order of the Lodge

Treasurer Duties:

- •Receive all monies from the Secretary and give him a receipt for the same
- Keep an accurate account of all money

- •Pay out money duly signed by the Worshipful Master and countersigned by the Secretary with the consent of the Lodge
- •Keep all property (stocks, bonds and land) owned by the Lodge in his possession
- •Submit a report of financial transactions at the Stated meetings
- •When requested, present a detailed account of the receipts and disbursements, and the amount of funds on hand
- Preserve all accounting books and vouchers and transfer the same to his successor
