

Greetings from the South Gate:

My intention for this quarter's article was to be a highlight of this year's main events.

However, as we neared the 249th birthday of our Nation, I did a bit of a dive into the document that has driven this nation to greatness. On July 4, 1776, fifty-six men representing the 13 colonies collaborated to proclaim us free from tyranny. In the midst of a great war that started over a year earlier, and under the penalty of certain death, these men stood side by side to stand up for what was just and right and prudent. It was entitled "The unanimous Declaration of the thirteen united States of America". Known now as the Declaration of Independence".

As many of us know, the list of signees included revered brothers from our own fraternity. From North Carolina to Massachusetts, Freemasons stood side by side with other great men who would not be ruled from an Island nation across the Atlantic. Moreover, they did this at a time in the war when victory was less certain than defeat. Washington had not yet crossed the Delaware, the French had not yet declared their allegiance (that would take some time), and the continental army had not yet survived Valley Forge. Yet, the morality and divine values of the brave signers did not falter.

When reading the Declaration, one can see clearly the influence of our fraternity. The assertion from our forefathers that "All men are created equal" and "that they are endowed by their Creator with unalienable rights" is synonymous with the Worshipful Master asking the Senior Warden one powerful question "Where do Masons meet". It is a core value that allows, despite the structure of the lodge, all of us to have an equal say and enjoy the same privileges.

And what of Brotherhood? As I've written, these men stood side by side in the face of death and tyranny for the purpose of reaching a common goal. They extended to each other their right hands, they took an oath, and they signed side by side as a token of their friendship and brotherly love. The Declaration says it best in the last sentence, while invoking divine providence to protect this endeavor. "And for the support of this Declaration, with a firm reliance on the protection of divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes and our sacred Honor".

Honor and Trust in God. Sound familiar?

As is the case with any collective endeavor, there was dissention and conflict within the representation. Not all of the signers were initially onboard. Differences in opinion regarding trade and economics, war versus diplomacy and slavery kept four of the states from voting in favor. In the end, of course, they worked through their differences and 249 years later, here we are. Great men did these things. I am in a fraternity of great men. Lets all take note of what we can accomplish together. Stand together, honor our brothers, live by our code of conduct and remember our oaths. May Brotherly Love Prevail. A list of Masonic Signers and their Lodges:

- Benjamin Franklin: Was a past Grand Master of Masons of Pennsylvania.
- John Hancock: Made a Mason in Merchants Lodge No. 277 in Quebec and affiliated with St. Andrews Lodge in Boston.
- Joseph Hewes: Member of Unanimity Lodge No. 7 and received Masonic funeral honors.
- William Hooper: Member of Hanover Lodge in Masonborough, NC.
- Richard Stockton: Associated with St. John's Lodge in Princeton, NJ, and was a Charter Master.
- William Ellery: A member of the First Lodge of Boston.


# Introducing the 2025-2026 Grand Master of Masons in Arizona Most Worshipful Leigh Creighton

**Resolution 2024-17** Fellowcraft Circumambulation - Scripture change from Amos to 1 Corinthians - Failed.

**Resolution 2024-18** Ritual Change "The candidate when returning to the lodge Shall Salute the WM" -Failed.

**Grand Masters Recommendation 2025-01** - Use of electronic signature and of electronic member dues cards permitted, beginning 6/7/2025 - Passed.

#### **2025 Legislation**

Resolution 2025-01- Printing updated return address in clear text ritual book - Withdrawn.

Resolution 2025-02- Electronic Perpetual Member Certificate issued from Grandview - Passed.

Resolution 2025-03- Lodge Secretary and Treasurer Bonding - Failed.

**Resolution 2025-04**- Proposal for the GL of AZ to discontinue the purchasing of Directors and Officers insurance covering the constituent lodges -Failed.

#### **2025 Legislation continued**

**Resolution 2025-05-** Requires anyone aspiring to serve as the Grand Secretary and/or Grand Treasurer to submit resumes 90 days prior to the Grand Communication. - Passed

**Resolution 2025-06**- Proposed Ritual Change to the EA degree - "The lecture of this degree etc" - Carries Over.

**Resolution 2025-07**- Approves the use of a Letter of Certification by the Grand Secretary pertaining to Withdrawals, Suspensions or Restorations - Passed.

**Resolution 2025-08-** Proficiency Cards valid for seven years - Passed.

**Resolution 2025-09-** Guidelines for Trial Records Inspection - " Shall be private, not for everyone to view, not to be recorded, copied or photographed". -Passed.




# happy aphelion.

"Every year our sun conjoins the star Sirius, at 13.5 degrees Cancer, during the first week in July; that is, as seen from the earth, the sun lies in front of Sirius which lies at the same celestial longitude as the astrological sign of Cancer in the sky. Interestingly, the major axis of the earth's orbit is such that we are farthest from the sun on July 4th and closest to it on January 3rd each year, so that at the beginning of our current calendar year, the earth lies between the Sun and Sirius, and Sirius "culminates" or "climaxes" (is at it's high point in its nightly path and directly on the north-south meridian line) at midnight; and thus the midnight new year's firework climactic explosions serve as a celebration of the meridian passing of Sirius as we pass between it and the sun, while the fourth of July celebrations express the explosive conjunction or divine union of our Sun with Sirius. "



So we see this date bouncing around a little bit. This is one of the reasons I believe the handing, acceptance, and presentation of this document (*The Declaration of Independence*) was stretched out over several days. It was executed in "ritual" and designed to resonate for a specific period of time. The founding fathers had to have known that this alignment would eventually fall out of sync and resonance would ultimately come to a halt.

This year the aphelion occurs on July 6, But in the past, it occurred earlier. This is due to precession, or the precession of the equinox. Precession is "the advancement of the wobble of the earth due to its tilt off its axis" and this happens 1° every 72 years.



This accounts for the occulted significance of the number 72 as well as its regular manifestation in both ancient and modern-day religion. What's also quite intriguing is how the number 72 permeates the human condition. It is worth pointing out that the celebration of this event has moved three days, or degrees, in the past 210 years. One of two reasons accounts for this.

Either we can presume that the Founding Fathers were off in their celestial calculations, or they chose this date knowing it was going to move.

If it were the latter, one can reason that the founding fathers understood that the energies which helped to form and bless the United States would eventually begin to wane. Forecasting or prophesying, if you will, a time when celestial energies would no longer be conducive to building a perfectly balanced nation. An expiration date, if you will.

"When in the Course of human events it becomes necessary for one people to dissolve the political bands which have connected them with another and to assume among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of mankind requires that they should declare the causes which impel them to the separation."

#### Grand Lodge of Arizona Its History

#### The History of the Grand Lodge of Arizona

In the latter half of the nineteenth century the American frontier was comprised of the western territories from Oklahoma to the Pacific Northwest. The news media of the time focused attention on the western territories and undoubtedly played a significant role in the inexorable wave of intrepid pioneers, settlers, opportunists and prospectors that flooded into the territories. That period of time is often referred to as 'The Old West' or 'The Wild West'.

Arizona is the backdrop of many movies and novels about the Old West. Western novelist Zane Grey regularly spent time on the Mogollon Rim near Payson, Arizona. Early motion pictures depict Arizona cowboys and lawmen portrayed by actors such as Tom Mix and John Wayne. In those movies the heroes and villains were sharply defined and a clean-cut cowboy always, "saved the day."

However, novels and movies seldom depict an even greater legacy that a few pioneers and settlers brought with them as they populated the territories. They brought morals, values and a strong sense of brotherly love, relief and truth with them. They brought Freemasonry to the territories.

In 1863 political concerns and the pressures of the Civil War were largely responsible for the separation of the Arizona territory from the New Mexico Territory. That year President Abraham Lincoln appointed John A. Gurley as Governor of the newly created Arizona Territory. He was to establish a government thus ensuring that Arizona Territory and its resources would be and remain under Union control. Governor Gurley died before he could arrive in the territory. John Noble Goodwin was appointed by President Lincoln in his place.

John Goodwin, a Freemason, and his party arrived in the Arizona territory in December 1863. He established the territorial capital of Prescott, approximately twenty miles from Fort Whipple. In 1864 nine Master Masons held a meeting in Prescott at John N. Goodwin's house. Brother Goodwin presided at the meeting. After satisfying themselves that all present were Master Masons, those nine Masons decided to apply to the Grand Lodge of California for a dispensation to open a Lodge at Prescott. The name selected for the new lodge was Aztlan. Brother John T. Alsap, who later became the first mayor of Phoenix, was chosen as its first Master. Brother Goodwin was chosen to present the petition to the Grand Master of California. Brother Goodwin presented the petition on April 23rd, 1865, and the dispensation it requested was granted.

In January 1867, after the California charter had been granted, Aztlan Lodge No. 177 was duly constituted and the officers installed by Past Master John Martin. Freemasonry had officially arrived in Arizona.

– Thereafter, four more lodges were formed in succession. These four are Arizona Lodge in Phoenix (1879), Tucson Lodge in Tucson (1881), Solomon Lodge in Tombstone (1881), and White Mountain Lodge in Globe. All but White Mountain Lodge were chartered by the Grand Lodge of California. White Mountain Lodge was chartered by the Grand Lodge of New Mexico in 1881.

On the 23rd day of March, 1882, representatives from these four lodges convened in Tucson for the purpose of considering the propriety of establishing a Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons for the Territory of Arizona.

A committee was formed to examine the credentials of the attending delegates, and after its satisfactory report, it was resolved that by virtue of the powers vested in the members assembled it was right and proper that a Grand Lodge for the territory should be formed. A constitution was adopted and it was formally resolved, "That a lodge of Master Masons be opened for the purpose of organizing and opening, in Masonic form, the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons for the Territory of Arizona."

Officers were appointed to fill the stations and places and a Lodge of Master Masons was opened in ancient Masonic form. The various officers were elected as follows: Ansel Mellen Bragg, Grand Master; John Tabor Alsap, Deputy Grand Master; Alonzo Bailey, Senior Grand Warden; William Arthur Harwood, Junior Grand Warden; Abraham Marx, Grand Treasurer; and George James Roskruge, Grand Secretary.

On the 25th day of March, 1882, the grand officers were installed and the Master Masons Lodge was closed in the ancient Masonic form, the convention having accomplished the business for which it was called, adjourned sine die.

The Grand Lodge was then opened in proper form, with music by a choir and prayer by the Grand Chaplain, after which it examined and endorsed the charters held by the various lodges represented. Then it was decided that, "The Grand Lodge claimed as the boundaries of its jurisdiction the whole of the Territory of Arizona," and further, that the Grand Master be authorized to endorse the charter of Aztlan Lodge when called upon to do so.

Aztlan lodge later became a chartered member, and together the five lodges forming the Grand Lodge had a total membership of 274 Masons.

Those five original lodges are still in existence today and are designated 'Territorial Lodges'.

Freemasonry gives you the symbols— but the meaning? That's earned. In the middle of arguments. In the face of setbacks. In the quiet battles nobody applauds.


To be a Mason is to build. To refine. To transform the rough stone of your life with patience, grace, and grit.

#### **Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart**

Initiated into the Viennese lodge Zur Wohltätigkeit in 1784, Mozart went on to compose several pieces specifically for Masonic ceremonies, including the Maurerische Trauermusik (Masonic Funeral Music) and the opera Die Zauberflöte (The Magic Flute), which is widely regarded for its rich allegorical references to Masonic ideals. Closely associated with fellow Masons such as composer Franz Joseph Haydn and librettist Emanuel Schikaneder, Mozart's contributions have been praised by Masonic scholars for their spiritual depth symbolic complexity, reflecting Enlightenment values and the moral philosophy embraced by Freemasonry.


