Recently I attended the annual Grand Lodge Leadership Conference and I thought I'd provide an overview of the event for the ones that could not attend.

When: The leadership conference is generally the same time each year, at the end of March, this year the actual dates were from Friday thru Sunday, 3/24 thru 3/26. There were 33 lodges in attendance with approximately 90-100 attendees.

Where: In the past years the Leadership conference was many times held in Casa Grande AZ due to its central location to several lodges and the relatively inexpensive hotel costs. That hotel has since changed ownership and costs associated to the conference have drastically risen.

With that said, the Grand Lodge was in search of a suitable facility to allow for several breakout rooms, comfortable lodging, with attractions in the area for family members that decided to come with the attending brother. This year the event was held at the Prescott Convention Center in Prescott Arizona which fit all the requirements mentioned above. It is my hope that we use this facility again next year but we'll see how it all comes together as we get closer to March 2024. I personally like this location since the staff was great to work with and it helped immensely that WB Steve Bracety (Aztlan #1) is the General Manager.

There has been lots of news concerning our Grand Officers and Chapter members.



# EDUCATION ARTICLES

#### Candidate Assimilation

It goes without saying that a lodge's future is not sustainable without a robust candidate assimilation program. Ask yourself the questions, where will we be in twenty years, and what will we be? Examine the current active membership. Are your pillar officers mostly past masters, are all of the chairs filled at each meeting? Do you have a designated brother who actually accepted the initiative to work with each individual candidate personally to introduce them to the fraternity and our brotherhood.

Do you know the candidates?

As a lodge brother, how do you personally know (or find out) who is interested in joining the masonic order? If you wait for your secretary to read his name at your stated meeting, you're already on a downhill slide to failure. Every brother has access to our Grand Lodge's Grandview system. Use it! Within the system, under your lodge, you will find the Membership Manager which includes all the people who have inquired about joining the masonic order. The grand lodge subsequently assigns these contacts to individual lodges based on home address information provided with the inquiry, candidates who have not inquired through grand lodge but are accompanied by current members are not on the Grandview system; however, they are added manually most often by the lodge secretary.

So now you know who, what should you do?

Effective communication is the key. The problem is, what is effective? It varies for each candidate. We start with a cordial introduction via phone, text, email, or all of these. The objective is to establish an open line of communication. Our initial communication included the lodge point of contact, and a brief personal history within masonry, followed with a request to verify their contact information and to indicate their preference for future communications about the lodge. This may sound trivial however we found the initial information provided on line when inquiring is often selective to eliminate future scam communications, work phone numbers and alternate email addresses are used to cull unwanted messages. Resoundingly the preferred method of communication resulted in text messaging with only a few exceptions.

After a successful line of communication had been established, the objective is to establish a personal connection with the candidate and start a bonding process. To achieve this, we include a short bio synopsis for their point of contact. And ask them to share similar information and a photo.

Organization now becomes the challenge; some lodges have a few candidates and others may have many. Constant personal communication is the key. Many candidates do not feel a personal connection with group e-mails or text messages. The Grandview system has not yet evolved to be used as a functional communications management system where you can send and receive individual messages. For this reason, you either need to invest in a CRM software system or use some creativity with your existing technology. In our case I use a coding system with my cell phone. Simply defined, I want to keep all the candidate information separated from my alphabetical phone list. Simply I code each contact with a method to keep them together. IE AAAP58 – AC01 – candidate name. This keeps the candidate in a convenient location at the top of my alphabetical list (AAA). The p58 obviously is our lodge designation and the AC indicates that this is an active candidate contact and the 01 is just a number count of contacts.

With an organizational system in place, the candidates must be encouraged to engage with us in person. Personal invitations are sent for every event or meeting. Upon their arrival it is imperative to introduce them to all the brothers present. And to encourage all brothers and candidates to get to know each other. Our lodge also has open house meetings where the candidates are encouraged to attend and bring family and friends if they choose to. These meetings may include other lodges and consist of masonic education topics and open Question and answer sessions.

How successful is this approach?

Phoenicia 58 is currently on track to add at least 12 new members within the next year, not counting two who have recently petitioned. How do we keep track of the assimilation progress? We utilize a masonic clock spreadsheet as both a communications tool and a tracking device.

All lodge members are encouraged to use the list and reach out to the candidates throughout the process.

Assimilation is communication on a timely basis for positive results.

#### The Gentleman in the Room

Anyone who has been around a toddler knows their emotional unpredictability. Maybe you cut their sandwich the wrong way or they demand to wear their shoe on the wrong foot. Anything can set them off and five minutes later they are giggling and all smiles.

A toddler is trying to understand their world, learn boundaries, and try to control what they can do with their limited knowledge, language skills, and experience. Imagine if you have only had red Kool-Aid and you don't yet know the colors. Someone serves you green Kool-Aid. You don't want green Kool-Aide. You may not even recognize it as Kool-Aid. How do you communicate your displeasure? If you're a toddler, you have a tantrum. An adult's job becomes teaching the toddler the vocabulary and the social skills necessary to communicate effectively. It becomes the adult's responsibility to provide the experiences and then allow enough control as the child grows.

An argument can be made that we, as a society, behave like toddlers. Tantrums seem to be commonplace. With changes in technology coming fast and constant. With social mores and conventions in constant flux. With the loudest voice gaining attention we struggle to control our lives. Our vocabulary seems inadequate. Frustration grows. Who will be the adult? We can give society a "time-out" or put society's "Karen's" in a corner.

It sure would be nice if we could set up civility classes. Imagine if we had courses for everyone in proper social behavior. With no diploma for bring nice how do we help change society? Toddlers learn more by observation than by direct teaching. Society needs role models. Society needs examples to follow. That role model is you. People do observe what you do. People remember the way you treat them and others. People remember the way you speak and the words you use.

You have the power to make society better. Simply by being the best man you can be. What type of language do you use, is it gruff? Rude? Is your vocabulary filled with cursing and profane language or is it filled with fifty cent words to made you look superior? Or have you learned and practiced how to communicate with people to help them feel comfortable and understand? Can you voice your opinion without anger or force? Can you voice your displeasure

in a calm and collected manner without profanity or putting someone down? It takes work and practice, but people will remember.


