For more information—read on—and see the great work that you all do! ----*Ann*

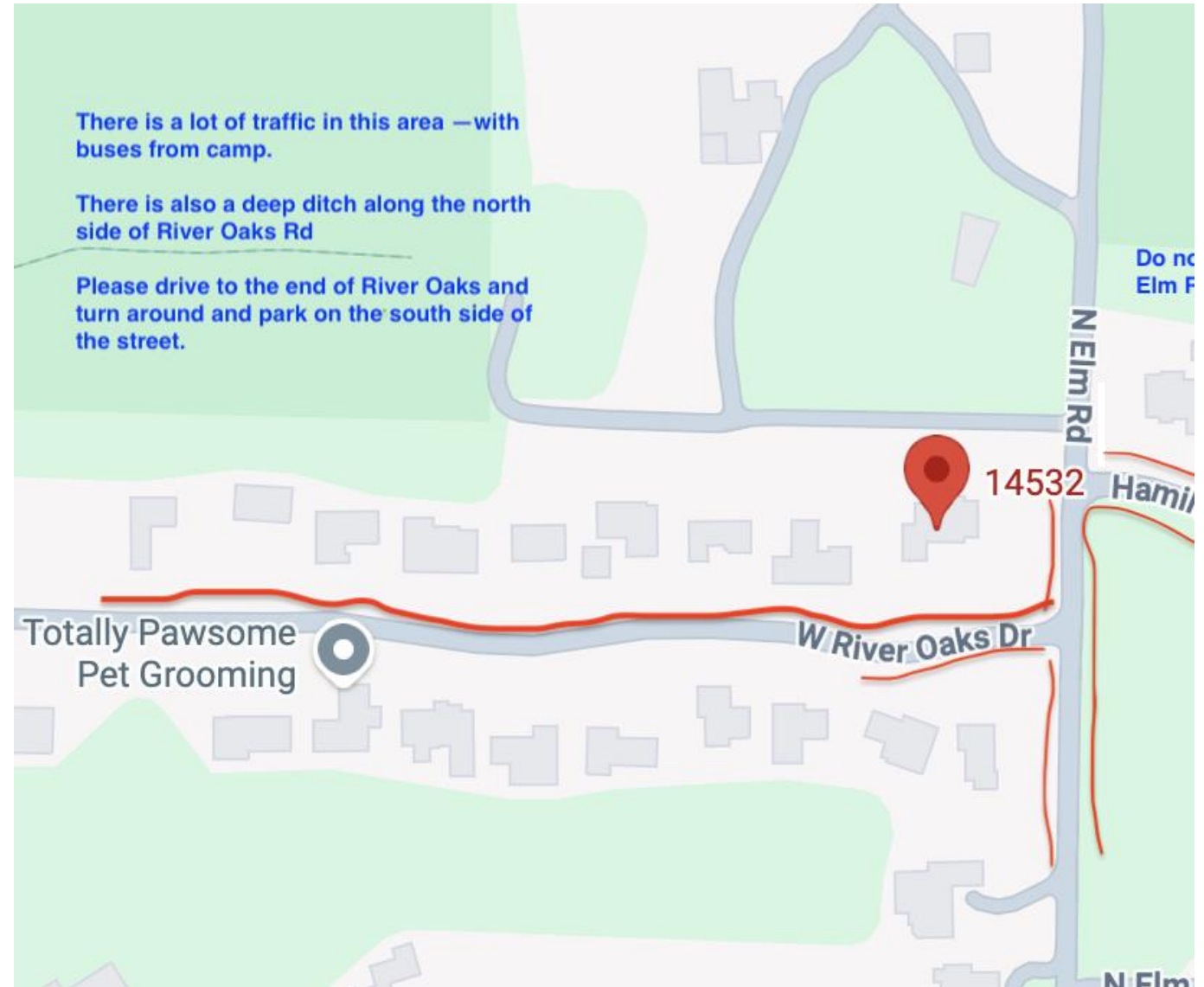
