## Concealed carry in wedding halls

## Carrying in a New York wedding hall runs into two or even three legal issues:

- 1. ALCOHOL
- "(o) any establishment holding an active license for on-premise consumption...where alcohol is consumed"
  - 2. SCHOOL
- "(m) in or upon any building or grounds, owned or leased, of any educational institutions,...private schools"
  - 3. BANQUET HALL
- "(p)...banquet halls..."

## New Jersey would seem to potentially not have any of these three issues:

- (7) a school, college, university or other educational institution, and on any school bus; Far narrower language that doesn't include the "grounds" or even "building", or "upon" it.
- (15) ~a bar or restaurant where alcohol is served, and any other site or facility where alcohol is sold for consumption on the premises;

Seems to be limited to where alcohol "is sold" — unless it's a bar or restaurant

(17) ~a privately or publicly owned and operated entertainment facility within this State, including but not limited to a theater, stadium, museum, arena, racetrack or other place where performances, concerts, exhibits, games or contests are held;

Banquet halls aren't mentioned.
