- **Circus**, a very promising mutation of Ferris Wheel, japonica, pinker than Ferris Wheel, LG, semi double to loose peony.
- **Blue Twilight,** retic, bluish pink with yellow anthers and pinkish filaments. LG, semi double with ruffled petals.
- Elaine's Betty, japonica, Pale peach pink with occasional rose red stripes and spots shading to deeper pink at petal edges. Medium, peony form to rose form double with highly ruffled petals
- **Holy Pure**, retic, inner two whorls white lightly tinged pink, outer whorls slightly darker pink with light purple margins, sometimes frosted white with yellow anthers and white filaments. Lg to VL, rose form double to semi double.

## CAMELLIA CULTURE CORNER~ DON LESMEISTER

My annual repetitive comment regarding Camellias is:

The two worst things you can do is to

1. OVER WATER

2. OVER FERTILIZE

I use a very loose mix for my Camellia plants, 99% of which are in containers, and require Summer watering every 3 to 4 days, depending on heat. I seldom water over 2 to 3 inches per container. If you use a more solid mix, you can add a day or so to this schedule. If your plants are in the ground, the watering will require less.

For fertilizing, there are basically three levels. 1. Immediate release fertilizer which is a liquid composition, 2. Slow release, and 3. Solid fertilizer, which are both solid. Most commercial growers use the slow or solid release fertilizer, primarily because it is less costly and labor intensive. For Summer, I use a liquid fertilizer at half strength, every 2 weeks beginning around the first to mid April. Regardless of the type of product you use, DO NOT exceed factory recommendations. MORE IS NOT BETTER in Camellia Land.

If you have any suggestions regarding the subject matter of our Monthly Camellia programs, please let me know. There are a couple of months open and perhaps we can use your suggestion for the next Camellia year.


