### BLAST FROM THE PAST - By Lana Paulhamus, Historian

Results from a phone conversation with Jim Nuccio on Jan.31, 2022.

Nuccio's Nursery was founded in 1935 by Tom and Jim's dad Julius and their Uncle Joe. They started the nursery in their backyard in Alhambra. In 1946 they bought the current property and began selling plants other than Camellias, strictly wholesale. Eventually sales went retail and they focused mainly on camellias and azaleas.

Earliest camellias sold were Pink Perfection, Herme, Purity, amongst others. Currently their sales are 50% camellias, 50% azaleas (roughly).

They don't ship overseas anymore. They mail order to 49 states except Mississippi. Most frequent sales are CA, Carolinas, FL, GA, WA, OR.

Most popular sasangua ordered: White Doves, Shishi Gashira, Yuletide.

Most popular Retic: Frank Houser, Var. (Retics aren't as popular as Japonicas)

Most popular Hybrids: High Fragrance, Taylors Perfection

Most favorite Japonicas: Nuccio's Gem, Nuccio's Pearl, Silver Waves.

Most popular red Japonica: Ace of Hearts.

They sell more white camellias than any other color. Nuccio's Gem and Ragland Supreme

They have no procedure for naming camellias. In fact, they took the name for a camellia off a towel.

(Royal Velvet!)
