PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



- **Pearl Maxwell**—Japonica, soft shell pink. Medium, formal double.
- Man Size—Japonica, white, miniature to small, anemone form.

CAMELLIA CULTURE CORNER~ Don Lesmeister

Well, finally. After all our hard work, the flowers are at the cusp of blooming season. The Show folks, we are really getting excited. And, a new list of To Do items appear. Do your last trip around the garden to disbud where new buds have appeared. Do MINOR pruning to make sure buds that open do not touch other plants or limbs that may touch the blooms when they open, and clothespin leaves back too!

This year it seems like an unusual amount of heat, wind, and little or no rain. So when they do appear, this presents prime conditions for PETAL BLIGHT! The cycle is that it rains, it warms up, and then the wind blows. This causes the spores of PETAL BLIGHT to get blown faster and further. Even if you think your garden is pristine and void of these spores, your neighbors may not be as clean. So, you can assist your neighbors by gracefully explaining the cause and correction of the brown marks on their flowers.

This is getting to be the last few months re-containerizing your plants, It you gently disturb the roots of your containerized plants, you can do this at nearly any time of the year. If you aggressively disturb the plants roots, do so only while the plant is dormant. Generally, the plant comes out of dormancy after completing its blooming. If you transplant a plant from the ground, be extremely easy on the roots,

Lastly, we are in the Camellia Show season, with two shows remaining in Northern California. Try to make it a point to attend at least one of these shows. You will be rewarded. Don, Your Culture Guy
