THIS MONTH'S PLANT SALE—Bill Kitagawa

Freedom Bell—Hybrid, Bright Red. Small, bell shaped semidouble. Vigorous, upright, compact growth

Night Rider—Hybrid, Very dark black Red. Miniature to small, semidouble. Average, upright growth

Bella Jinhua—Japonica, Dark red with black veining on the interior of the petals and lighter red on the edges of the petals. Medium, formal double. Slow, bushy, upright growth. Leaves are burgundy red for months before finally turning light green with black streaks and flecks

Elegans Splendor—Japonica, Light pink edged white with deep petal serrations. Large to very large, anemone form

CAMELLIA CULTURE CORNER~ DON LESMEISTER

With the fall season weather change, there are several new camellia items that need to be accomplished. First, an application of 0-10-10 fertilizer is very important. This sets the stage for setting strong flower buds. I suggest application at 1/2 the manufacturer's recommended strength (1 Tbs. per gallon of liquid, monthly) every 15 days from now through December. Also, as the weather drops, you can reduce the frequency of watering, especially for containerized camellias. I also add an additional day for each day it rains

Disbudding is very important. Leave only one bud per terminal. Miniature varieties can be neglected somewhat, and most hybrids usually need more attention. Try to disbud at least once a month from now until the plant begins to bloom.

Also, get prepared for November gibbing. Enjoy your Camellia plants and friends, see you at our monthly meetings!
