THIS MONTH'S PLANT RAFFLE - Bill Kitagawa

Debutante - Japonica. Light pink, medium, full peony form.

Elegans Splendor - Japonica. Light pink edged white.

Freedom Bell - Hybrid. Bright red, vigorous compact upright growth.

Show Time - Japonica. Pink with yellow anther and light yellow filaments.

Camellia Culture - Don Lesmeister

Required camellia culture and care makes November one of the busiest months of the year. Some of the projects are:

- \Rightarrow Apply a low/no nitrogen fertilizer such as 0-10-10 or 2-10-10. This will aid in the bud setting process for your plants.
- ⇒ Where there are two (2) or more buds set on the terminal branches, or buds set down the branch, you should remove one of the buds. This is not as important on miniature & small flowers.
- ⇒ Any seeds your plants have need to be harvested prior to the seed pod opening and the seed falling to the ground. Please see me if you have questions and the American Camellia Society (ACS) fact sheet No. 9 also explains this process.
- ⇒ Ants are placing aphids on your plants for their winter food. This damages both the leaf and flower buds. Use a hand sprayer with any mild spray to kill the aphids.
- ⇒ Now is the time to do any flower "gibbing". Thanksgiving until Christmas is the ideal time. It is suggested you only "gib" a few buds on large plants, but none on smaller one-gallon plants. Also spread this over a few weeks rather than all buds at once.
- ⇒ Your camellia plants are going into dormancy, so now is the perfect time to transplant plants in the ground from one location to another. If you disturb the top (feeder) roots you can apply Vitamin B-1 to reduce the shock.
- ⇒ Remove any dead branches and those branches that will prevent flowers from fully opening.


