

Sacramento Camellia Society History - Joan Lesmeister

With the November elections, I recall a President's wife I got to see up close. Did you know that one year the cover of our show program featured a 1st Lady? Pat Nixon visited our March 4th, 1972 Camellia Show that was held at the Memorial Auditorium. She was joined by Nancy Reagan, our Governor's wife, and they were escorted through the show by camellia society members Beth Grebitus, Trophy Chairperson and Richard Ray, Society President.

The camellia named Pat Nixon was a 1969 Kramer Nurseries flower propagated from a sport of the camellia named Richard Nixon. Don and I were at that show, as were a few of our current members. I was helping on the trophy table and Don was working the show. I was thrilled to see both 1st ladies! What a treat!

Camellia Culture

November is a very busy month of the year for camellias... Here are things we need to do......

- 1. Apply a low/no nitrogen fertilizer such as 0-10-10 or 2-10-10.
- 2. Spray ants and camellia plants (water is usually sufficient) where ants have placed their winter food (aphid). Aphid stakes can also be in your plant areas.
- 3. Harvest seed pods as they begin to open. You can also place a small vented bag around the seed pods so they do not get any contamination by hitting the ground.
- 4. Begin disbudding all but one bud on plant terminal branches. This is not necessary in the case of small & miniature varieties, or where buds are not distinguishable yet.
- 5. Prune or remove branches that prevent flowers from fully opening or from being bruised.
- 6. Commence your gibbing. If you gib, a few flower buds every other day or so as this will spread the flower openings rather than all together.
- 7. Plants are starting to go dormant, so now is the best time to transplant.
