

### CAMELLIA CULTURE CORNER~ DON LESMEISTER

This has always been an exciting time of the vear for me. All the Camellia repotting and pruning should be completed and it is now time to fertilize. Then, we can watch the little guys grow up to adulthood and the heavy hitters show their new growth. Camellias do better with a mild fertilizing program. For years, I would apply liquid Fish Fertilizer (5-1-1) around the 1st to 15th of April and followed within two weeks with Cotton Seed Meal. and then every month through August. Recently, Cotton Seed Meal has not only become expensive, but difficult to obtain. So I have tried various programs and less expensive replacements, such as Alfalfa and/or Soy Meal with acceptable results. For container plants, it seems the best

program has been fertilizing every two weeks, but at one-half strength. This requires a lot more effort, but the cost is the same. Apply Fish Fertilizer around April 15th at the rate of one tablespoon per gallon of water. Every two weeks after than until around August 1st, apply fertilizer at onehalf strength, whether liquid or solid. REMEMBER, when you try a new program, only do this to a few plants until vou are confident this works for your plants under your conditions. Another new experiment you can try is GIB spraving. With a very mild solution, 200 to 400 PPM, using a bottle sprayer, spray the new growth about once a week or every 10 days. Start this procedure after the new growth has started. which will probably be in a couple weeks.

Discontinue this practice once the new growth has hardened off. You will be amazed at the new growth you will obtain. This will add at least one or two years of new growth to the plant. The down side of this is that the branches sprayed will not set buds until next year. I have used this on several young plants to get them to a larger size quicker. I do not use this practice on the older plants because of the lack of bud set.
