

## ~CAMELLIA CULTURE CORNER~ JIM TOLAND

Well, the bloom season is over and now it is time to go to work! There is that long line of new 1 gal plants plus all of those that have out-grown their pots that need to be steppedup into larger pots.

Where to get the planting mix? Take your pick; every nursery is loaded with it. Be careful though, last year I got a bag with 50 lbs of granite chunks in it! Beware the colorful bags and wild promises. I have noticed some significant down-sizing of bags and up-sizing of prices! Ask the big winners what they use. Many have their own mix, and most will share their advice.

Now What? You need some space to blend the components of your planting mix. If you have a concrete driveway or parking area, clean it carefully, before you use it. An alternative is to use a kid's plastic water pool. Lay it on the grass and punch holes in it so it will drain when it rains. Now the shovel work begins!

#### CULTURE TIPS FOR THE SUMMER

APRIL: Fertilize both container and landscape camellias. Make sure you have

watered them thoroughly beforehand. Start looking for seed pods forming.

Twist off. Finish pruning.

MAY: Water! But don't over water. You will cause plant failure. Deep watering

only when needed is the best. Keep watching for seed pods. Twist off.

JUNE, JULY, AUGUST: Water, water, and water. It's hot out there! Hand watering container plants is best. It's good therapy! Spraying of foliate in the late afternoon after the sun has gone down is very beneficial. You can hear the camellias smiling! They love to be showered with water. *Fertilize in July.* You can use the camellia azalea fertilizer (5-5-3) in July. Do not use more than the instructions say and deep water the day before fertilizing so as

not to burn the roots.

SEPTEMBER: Continue debudding. Check every week, as those little buggers sneak up on you! Fertilize with 0-10-10 this month. You can find gallon jugs at Lowe's for \$10.
