Camellia Culture by Don Lesmeister

We are now transitioning from primarily Susanqua and a few early Japonica blooms into nearly all other species. This means that local parks, nurseries, etc. will be having blooms to see. You can observe varieties that you might want to purchase. While nurseries now have Camellias for sale, most are standard varieties. Both older & newer flowers can be observed at Camellia Shows in Redwood City, Santa Clara, Sacramento, Walnut Creek and Modesto where you can enter blooms. These shows are on weekends, beginning on Feb. 9th. and will have newer varieties to observe and many to purchase at reasonable prices. We usually have around 200 plants for sale at our Camellia Show in Sacramento. Speaking of that, our new Camellia Show Location is at the Elks Lodge at 6446 Riverside Blvd. in Sacramento, on March 2 and 3, 2019.
