

CAMELLIA CULTURE CORNER

Our Culture Expert...Don Lesmeister

Even though our Camellias are starting to bloom, there are still tasks we should or should not do. You can discontinue fertilizing. It is too late for winter fertilizing (0-10-10 or 2-10-10) and too early for Nitrogen fertilizers. Pruning is not necessary. However, you can do some "touch up" trimming to remove limbs that could interfere with bloom opening. Be careful in your watering. With the prediction of El Nino rains, be sure not to over water. This is the worst thing you can do to your plants. Camellia plants that are in the ground require very little watering. If it rains once a week, it may not even be necessary. Container grown Camellias still require some water, but a LOT less. A rule of thumb is to extend your watering cycle by about another 3 days for every day of rain. Now is an excellent time to plant Camellias in the ground, or change them to a different container size. Move containerized Camellias (particularly white flowers) to a shadier area, like under a patio, to prevent bloom damage. Also, if you enter your blooms in Camellia Shows, make sure you have an ample supply of extra cups, floral mix, entry cards, etc. And don't forget! DO NOT judge your blooms in your back yard, let the judges do that at the show. Good Luck...

Information will be provided covering ACS Rules and Regulations and how to judge Camellias at ACS approved Shows. 
