CAMELLIA CULTURE CORNER~ DON LESMEISTER

There are three tasks to accomplish during this month. First, when we have rain followed by warm days, this is prime time for petal blight. So you should pick older blooms before they get infected with this virus and fall to the ground and perpetuate the cycle. It is a good idea to do the same with your neighbors blooms, or at least make them aware of the situation. Also, check around your plants and drain holes on container plants and remove the small dark mushrooms that send their spores to your flowers. REMEMBER, when you remove infected blooms and/or mushrooms, put them in the garbage,

not the green waste cans. Otherwise, infected blooms, if not properly treated, could end up as mulch in your neighborhood gardens.

Secondly, this is about the last window to transplant Camellia plants, particularly the larger ones...
Container plants can be transplanted at nearly any time, so long as the roots are not drastically disturbed. I usually finish up container transplanting when the plants finish blooming.

Lastly, it is nearly time to fertilize your Camellia plants. Liquid fertilizers break down and enter your plants system within hours, so you can

wait until the end of the month to apply. Solid fertilizers usually take longer to break down, so this should be applied somewhere around the middle of the month. Remember, more is not necessarily better for Camellias. A fertilizer with a small Nitrogen composition (usually less than 10) is not only safer, but best for your plants.

Good luck in your gardening and stay tuned to next month...
