#### Culture Corner by Don Lesmeister

It sure seems as if the Camellia blooming year is far ahead of past years. AND....., the recent warm rains will probably further speed up the blooming cycle. Some of you may look forward earlier flowers, and welcome this activity. However, if you would rather have later blooms for the Camellia shows, there are a couple of adjustments you can make. First, discontinue any winter fertilizing program, especially ones that include nitrogen such as 2-10-10. This will reduce plant growing activity. It is probably OK to continue your last application of 0-10-10. Second, start your gibbing program for show blooms a little later. How much is anyone guess, but two or three weeks later is not unreasonable. Another seat of the pants theory of mine is to raise your plants off the ground, patio, gravel, etc., to get the colder air circulating under your plants.

Mother Nature could toss a curve into the equation by having several days of cold weather and slow down the current trend. In reviewing my, and the Randall Records, the colder days of Winter generally occur in the first couple weeks of December. When there is significant warm rains in the early fall, the colder days occur towards the end of December.

Other non-weather activities, you should check your plants and disbud as necessary. You can also remove any dead branches or those that prevent buds from fully opening. This is also a good time of year to clean up your yard of any dead leaves & other debris to discourage critter occupation. Good Growing...DON
