Culture Corner by Don Lesmeister

This month, there is a LOT of things to do for our Camellias. First, this is about the last month of Winter fertilizing with either 0-10-10 or 2-10-10. The only location I have found this product in either solid or liquid form is Lowes'. ...Next, be sure you have disbudded your plants to get larger flowers. Just leave one bud per terminal. If you have already done this, go back over and check your plants again. Many varieties are famous for re-setting new buds, particularly hybrid plants...Next, if you are going to do any flower gibbing, it is recommended that you commence somewhere around the end of the month. Gib* can be obtained on Ebay for around \$2.00 an ounce, which is enough for 200 or so flowers. "Gib" a few buds, wait a few days and Gib a few more & continue doing this until you program is completed. I identify each branch where I have Gibbed, using a different colored clothes pin, pipe cleaner, yarn or some other identifier.Be sure also to trim any branches that interfere with flower opening....Once you have finished those tasks, take a break & watch TV....Don Lesmeister

(*Technical name for GIB is Gibberellic Acid)
