CAMELLIA CULTURE CORNER - Don Lesmeister

General Culture - While some believe this is the time of the year just to sit back and watch the "bloomin" things, and it is, there still are some things which need tending to:

- Plants still require watering, Watch your containers moisture content.
- Watch for ants and spray with ant and aphid spray
- Good time to transplant plants into ground or re-containerize
- Start thinking about grafting for February and early March
