Culture Corner by Don Lesmeister

Us Camellia growers are seeing our plants set buds and are getting ready for the blooming season. This changes the items we must do in order to get really good blooms. First, we should add either 0-10-10 or 2-10-10 fertilizer. I prefer the liquid fertilizer because this is easy to apply for me because of the number of plants we have. If you have a limited number of plants, 50 or less, the solid version of this fertilizer works just fine, and is much less expensive. We apply this liquid winter fertilizer at half strength every two weeks for a couple of months. Three or so monthly applications of the solid fertilizer will work just fine. Another thing is to disbud. Leave one flower bud per terminal. This is good for obtaining show flowers. Heavy disbuding is not necessary for nonshow flowers and miniatures. Also, SOME reticulata plants do not require this disbuding after the cold weather passes. I also do some LIMITED pruning where limbs will not allow buds to fully open. Another item is to harvest the seed pods and plant the seeds. If you do not have any seed pods, you can look at plants in the various Camellia gardens around town. If you really want to get high tech, you can start rooting Camellias. Both the practices can be very satisfying. The American Camellia Society has a variety of Fact Sheets that describe how to do these two practices. Copies of these will be available at our October meeting for you to take home and follow. ACS has a variety of the fact Sheets, covering many/most growing subjects. If you have a Camellia question, contact the ACS website and obtain these FREE sheets.....
