
You can't get rid of us that easily! We thought a summer edition of the Camellia Times would help to keep us all in touch and give you tips for over the summer months.

Summer Fertilizing

When people see large Camellia blooms, the first thing they want to know is how much the grower fertilizes. My experience is that Camellias require very little fertilizer. The secret is not how much, but how often. This applies to both plants in the ground, but even more so for container Camellias. Liquid fertilizers become available to the plant in a matter of hours. Solid fertilizers take a couple of weeks to break down. In Sacramento, you can cause plant damage by fertilizing during 100+ degree weather, so it is difficult to get the timing correctly. Many growers therefore miss fertilizing completely anticipating 100+ days. The safe way is to reduce the amount of fertilizer, but apply more often, regardless of whether you use liquid or solid fertilizers. If the fertilizer instructions read: Monthly from May through August, apply one tablespoon of liquid per gallon of water, change this program to 1/2 tablespoon per gallon of water every 2 weeks. For solid fertilizer, change application to 1/2 tablespoon per gallon size plant every 2 weeks. This requires a little more work, especially if you have over 200 plants, but the final result is a lot better blooms.

Use fertilizer like Fish Emulsion (PU!) or Black Gold, which is 5-5-3.
