

Pluggin-Purple - Hybrid. Brilliant deep orchid pink. Single, slightly tubular. Compact.

Nuccio's Jewel - Japonica. White shaded to pink on edges. Bushy.

Pearl Maxwell - Japonica. Soft shell pink. Medium formal double. Compact.

Show Time - Japonica. Clear light pink. Semi-double with fluted petals. Very large. Upright, vigorous growth.

CAMELLIA CULTURE CORNER~

As we move into the Camellia blooming season, there are a few things we have to remember......

First, even though we have had a very rainy season, plants still require watering and when flowers begin to open, considerably more water is required for the blooms to open properly. Similar to the human body, flowers are a very high percentage of water. Since it takes a few hours for the plants to absorb water, I usually water mine early in the morning.

Second, because of the high amount of moisture from previous rains, petal blight will probably be a little higher than usual. Try to pick your flowers from the plant before they fall naturally. By doing so, the spores from this disease will not have as much an opportunity to develop. In days gone by, I used to go through the neighborhood picking up the neighbors' blooms.

Also, you may have noticed that most of the local nurseries have closed and the big box stores have increased the prices of their camellias and only have a few 1 and 2 gallon plants in stock. Place your order for plants you want NOW with our Society so you can obtain the plant(s) you desire. There will be a list of camellias available for purchase at our February meeting.

THIS N' THAT



We have had many requests for Joan's Raspberry Trifle recipe so it is included below. Enjoy!!

Easy Raspberry Trifle (aka Mary's Dessert)

Ingredients:

- 1 package Betty Crocker 1-step White Angel Food Cake Mix
- 1 ½ cups cold water (as called for on cake mix package directions)
- 2 cups boiling water
- 1 package (8 oz) sugar-free raspberry-flavored gelatin (can use regular jello, if preferred)
- 2 packages (10 oz each) frozen unsweetened raspberries, thawed (can use sweetened, if preferred)
- 3 containers (6 oz each) Yoplait Light and Fit 99% fat free red raspberry yogurt

Directions:

- Bake and cool cake as directed for Angel Food tube pan
- Tear cake into ¾ inch pieces
- Pour boiling water on gelatin in a large bowl, stir until gelatin is dissolved
- Add raspberries. (if desired, save a few raspberries for garnish)
- Refrigerate gelatin mixture for 15 minutes or until thickened, but not set
- Layer ½ each of the cake pieces, gelatin mixture and yogurt in a 3-quart glass bowl
- Repeat layers
- Garnish with reserved raspberries
- Refrigerate at least 2 hours until firm
- Cover and refrigerate and remaining dessert
- Serves 16
