Sacramento Camellia Society History - Joan Lesmeister

I was wondering about the oldest named camellia and read (actually Googled, then

read!) it's japonica Alba Plena, brought to England from China in 1797. Before that, it was known in the Sung Dynasty as "Great White". Our history here in Sacramento, in your Member Handbook, lists Alba Plena as winning Best of Show in 1939 by Napa County Garden Club and in 1945 by Mrs. J.E. Blackford. Any of our members still grow Alba Plena? It's a beautiful white camellia and we probably see it in many of our old Sacramento neighborhoods! The Gamble Gardens in Palo Alto has one, maybe we should visit it?



Camellia Culture

We are now moving into a new phase of camellia growing . . .some Do's & Don'ts

If your plants have started to grow, **don't** move plants from the ground into another location or container....also, **do not** prune any new growth. You can move your containerized plants into a larger container so long as the feeder roots (TOP ROOTS) are not disturbed.

Do commence your fertilizer program. Plants in the ground require a little less fertilizer. Plants in containers require a more frequent fertilizing program, because of the leaching process. I recommend a MILD fertilizer like Fish Plant Food (5-1-1) at half strength every 15 days from now to the end of August. Also, as the weather warms, **do** increase watering.

REMEMBER, the three worst things you can do to harm your camellias:

- 1) OVER WATER
- 2) OVER FERTILIZE
- 3) FOLLOW MY ADVICE
