PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Camellia Friends.

Happy New Year! We hope your holidays were fun with family and friends. This new year has come with some bittersweet news about the Nuccios. Tom has been in the hospital for an undiagnosed illness for a while now. We were going to have you all send cards to his little place on Chaney Trail...but then, as we have all been watching, Southern California is on fire. The Eaton Fire, centered in Altadena, has touched the lives of our Nuccio family. Below is the latest information from Brad King, president of the Southern CA Camellia Society:

Camellia Friends,

Jim Nuccio called me this afternoon with an update about the damage from the Eaton Canyon Fire to the Nursery. The house and propagation structures and carts are all destroyed. The office and most of the plants have survived. Two vans also ok! The bad news is there is no water currently to care for the plants. No information about when water will be available. Therefore, with dry weather (no rain predicted) there

may be loss of plants...Jim and staff are not allowed into the area. The Nuccio Nursery phone is not working and so far, no method to get the calls transferred to him. I offered local help when needed.

Jim confirmed this is the Nurseries' last season and could be shortened if there is no way to water and care for the camellias and azaleas in pots. He will call me with updates and if those of us in the area can be of help. Jim's house and family in the area (Altadena Ca.) survived the fire. The fire losses as reported on the news are tremendous and accurate. We feel for those who have lost their homes and businesses. I will give updates when they become available.

Nuccio's Nurseries, as you all know, is a world-famous camellia and azalea nursery entering their 90th year of business. None of us will ever see it replicated. Best regards,

Have you ever noticed that good growers all have a special technique they use to grow/show their camellias? If so, you are in for a special treat. We will have several documents available at our January meeting with their ideas for you as well as several of our members sharing their favorite tips and ideas.

A few additional things to remember:

- Since it hasn't rained in a bit, remember to water.
- It is prime time to transplant camellias in the ground or from one location/container to another.
- Your fertilizing and gib programs can be discontinued.
- The American Camellia Society (ACS) #6 fact sheet explains grafting techniques which can commence near the end of January.

Northern California Camellia Shows begin in mid-February, so make sure you have adequate items ready to bring your blooms to the show. We will discuss everything you need at our January meeting.
