Camellia Culture - December 2023

Here are some items which should be accomplished as we come closer to Show season...

- 1. This will be the last month to apply 0-10-10 or 2-10-10 fertilizers.
- 2. Gibbing can be accomplished through December.
- 3. Disbud (again) particularly review hybrid camellias.
- 4. Minor pruning so blooms can fully open.
- 5. Perfect time to transplant camellias from one location to another.
- 6. You can increase the number of days between watering, but be sure to keep your plants moist. Particularly on nights where the temperature nears freezing.
- 7. Prepare for show season:
 - ⇒ move plants where necessary
 - ⇒ clean show boxes
 - ⇒ obtain cups & clothes pins
 - ⇒ clean refrigerator/floral box
 - ⇒ review show schedules
- 8. Attend society meeting!
