The late Pope Saint John Paul II in his Angelus message on December 19, 2004 said: "The traditional 'Christmas tree' is a very ancient custom which exalts the value of life, as in winter the evergreen becomes a sign of undying life. In general, the tree is decorated and Christmas gifts are placed under it. The symbol is also eloquent from a typically Christian point of view: It reminds us of the 'tree of life' (see Genesis 2:9), representation of Christ, God's supreme gift to humanity."

"The message of the Christmas tree, therefore, is that life is 'ever green' if one gives: not so much material things, but of oneself: in friendship and sincere affect-ion, and fraternal help and forgiveness, in shared time and reciprocal listening."

My dear sisters and brothers, whether you have a Christmas tree in your home or not the fact remains that we are indeed 'ever green' because of the wondrous and unfathomable truth that God loves us so much that He became one of us. The truth about us is that we are created in the image and likeness of God who is love, and made with the power to love and the yearning to be loved, and with innate dignity that demands respect in all circumstances. Yes, we were made to be 'ever green' for one another!

One of the great and joyous mysteries of our annual celebration of the birth of the incarnate love of God during the Christmas Season is the way in which people are moved with the "Spirit of Christmas" to be more caring, kind and loving to one another. In a way, it's like God's own love taking shape, taking flesh, in our own lives.

May the Lord in his love, touch you and your loved ones this Holy Season with peace of heart and mind, health and great joy in the New Year. May you remain 'ever green' knowing that the peace and joy proclaimed by the angels is meant for shepherds in the fields and for us.
