



The Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

SEEKING THE LIGHT

In today's readings we find ourselves being drawn more deeply into relationship with Jesus. We are getting to know more about him as we see how he struggles with the news of his cousin John's arrest. His first response is to withdraw, to leave Nazareth and go to Capernaum. There he is perhaps both consoled and challenged by the words of Isaiah that Matthew quotes: "the people who sit in darkness have seen a great light, / on those dwelling in a land overshadowed by death / light has arisen" (Matthew 4:16). Jesus contemplates his cousin's death, perhaps his own death, and he seeks the light. Maybe it is these words of Isaiah that move Jesus out of his withdrawal and into action. He begins to preach, teach, cure disease and illness, and proclaim the gospel of the kingdom.

The Sunday of the Word of God

(Excerpts from the Apostolic Letter "Aperuit Illis" by Pope Francis, September 30, 2019)

At the conclusion of the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy, I proposed setting aside "a Sunday given over entirely to the word of God, so as to appreciate the inexhaustible riches contained in that constant dialogue between the Lord and his people."

Consequently, I hereby declare that the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time is to be devoted to the celebration, study and dissemination of the word of God.

A profound bond links sacred Scripture and the faith of believers. Since faith comes from hearing, and what is heard is based on the word of Christ (cf. *Rom* 10:17), believers are bound to listen attentively to the word of the Lord, both in the celebration of the liturgy and in their personal prayer and reflection.

May the Sunday of the Word of God help his people to grow in religious and intimate familiarity with the sacred Scriptures. For as the sacred author taught of old: "This word is very near to you: it is in your mouth and in your heart for your observance" (*Dt* 30:14).

The Sea of Galilee

The Sea of Galilee, called the Sea of Chinnereth (meaning "lyre-shaped") in the Old Testament (Num 34:11), is actually a freshwater lake about seven miles wide and thirteen miles long, lying between Galilee to the west and the region of the Decapolis (today, the Golan Heights) to the east. From its southern end, the Jordan River flows toward the Dead Sea. In the first century the lake provided a thriving commercial fishing industry for the villages that dotted its shoreline. It is still known for the violent gales that can arise suddenly and pose a danger to small boats.

Galilee

Galilee, the northern part of the promised land, was populated by several of the tribes of Israel when they entered the land in the thirteenth century BC. But after the Assyrians invaded Israel in 722 BC (see Kings 15:29), they deported the ten northern tribes and forcibly planted foreign ethnic groups in their place. Because of its mixed population, the region came to be called "Galilee of the Gentiles," and its inhabitants were looked down on by other Jews as an impure race. Yet the prophet Isaiah announced that one day God would manifest himself in Galilee, and that a "great light" would shine "upon those who dwelt in the land of gloom" (Isa 8:23-9:1). The fact that Jesus began his public ministry there was a sign of the fulfillment of that hope.



Saints of the Week


Monday, January 27th: Saint Angela Merici, Virgin; died 1540 at age 66 at Brescia; orphaned at ten; foundress of the Ursulines, the first teaching order especially for poor young girls; sought re-evangelization of families through the education of future wives and mothers.



Tuesday, January 28th: Saint Thomas Aquinas, Priest, died 1274 at the age of 49, Doctor of the Church; the "Angelic Doctor" who wrote the *Summa Theologiae* and authored *Adoro te devote*, *O salutaris*, *Tantum ergo*, and *Pange lingua*; patron of Catholic schools, colleges, and universities; of philosophers, theologians, and booksellers.



Friday, January 31st: Saint John Bosco, Priest; died 1888 at the age of 73; founded (1859) the Salesians, today numbering over 15,270 members; dedicated to educating youth; with St. Mary Mazzarello (14 May) founded the Salesian Sisters; a pioneer in vocational training; first saint in history to submit to a press interview; 40,000 people filed past his body at his death; first canonized saint in whose honor a national holiday was declared in Italy; patron of editors; known as the 'Apostle of Youth'.



La Intención Mensual del Papa

Enero 2020: Promoción de la Paz Mundial

Por los cristianos, seguidores de otras religiones y todas las personas de buena voluntad para que puedan promover la paz y la justicia en el mundo.

El Domingo de la Palabra de Dios.

(Extractos de la carta apostólica "Aperuit Illis" del Papa Francisco, 30 de septiembre de 2019)

Al concluir el Jubileo extraordinario de la misericordia, propuse establecer "un domingo dedicado enteramente a la palabra de Dios, para apreciar las riquezas inagotables contenidas en ese diálogo constante entre el Señor y su pueblo."

Por consiguiente, declaro que el Tercer Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario se dedicará a la celebración, el estudio y la difusión de la Palabra de Dios.

Un vínculo profundo une las Sagradas Escrituras y la fe de los creyentes. Dado que la fe proviene de escuchar, y lo que se escucha se basa en la palabra de Cristo (cf. Rom 10:17), los creyentes están obligados a escuchar atentamente la palabra del Señor, tanto en la celebración de la liturgia como en su oración y reflexión personal.

Que el domingo de la Palabra de Dios ayude al pueblo de Dios a crecer en familiaridad íntima con las Sagradas Escrituras. Porque como el autor sagrado enseñó en la antigüedad: "Esta palabra está muy cerca de ti: está en tu boca y en tu corazón para tu observancia" (Dt 30:14).

El Mar de Galilea

El Mar de Galilea, llamado Mar de Chinnereth (que significa "en forma de lira") en el Antiguo Testamento (Números 34:11), es en realidad un lago de agua dulce de aproximadamente siete millas de ancho y trece millas de largo, que se extiende entre Galilea al oeste y la región de la Decápolis (hoy, los Altos del Golán) al este. Desde su extremo sur, el río Jordán fluye hacia el Mar Muerto. En el primer siglo, el lago proporcionó una próspera industria de pesca comercial para las aldeas en su costa. Todavía es conocido por los violentos vendavales que pueden surgir repentinamente y representar un peligro para las pequeñas embarcaciones.

Galilea

Galilea, la parte norte de la tierra prometida, fue poblada por varias de las tribus de Israel cuando ingresaron a la tierra en el siglo XIII Antes de Cristo. Pero después de que los asirios invadieron Israel en el 722 a. C. (ver Reyes 15:29), deportaron a las diez tribus del norte y forzaron grupos étnicos extranjeros en su lugar. Debido a su población mixta, la región pasó a llamarse "Galilea de los gentiles", y sus habitantes fueron despreciados por otros judíos como una raza impura. Sin embargo, el profeta Isaías anunció que un día Dios se manifestaría en Galilea, y que una "gran luz" brillaría "sobre los que habitaban en la tierra de la penumbra" (Isaías 8: 23-9: 1). El hecho de que Jesús comenzó su ministerio público allí fue una señal del cumplimiento de esa esperanza.
