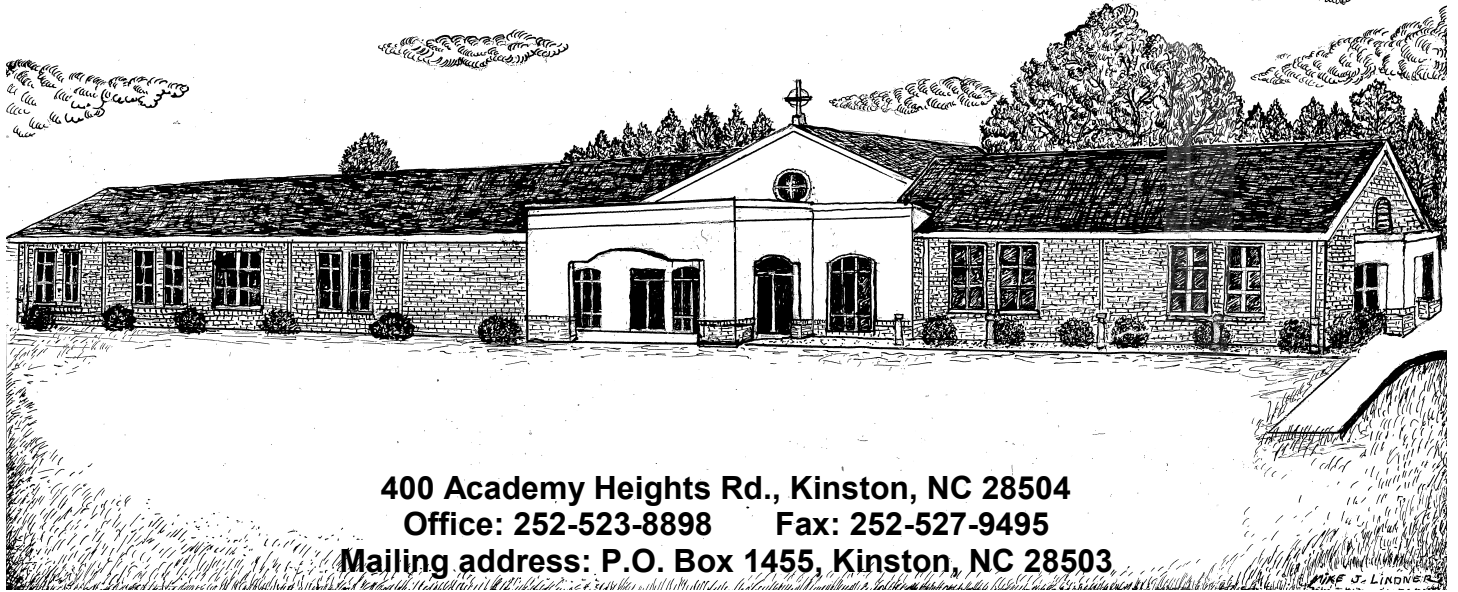

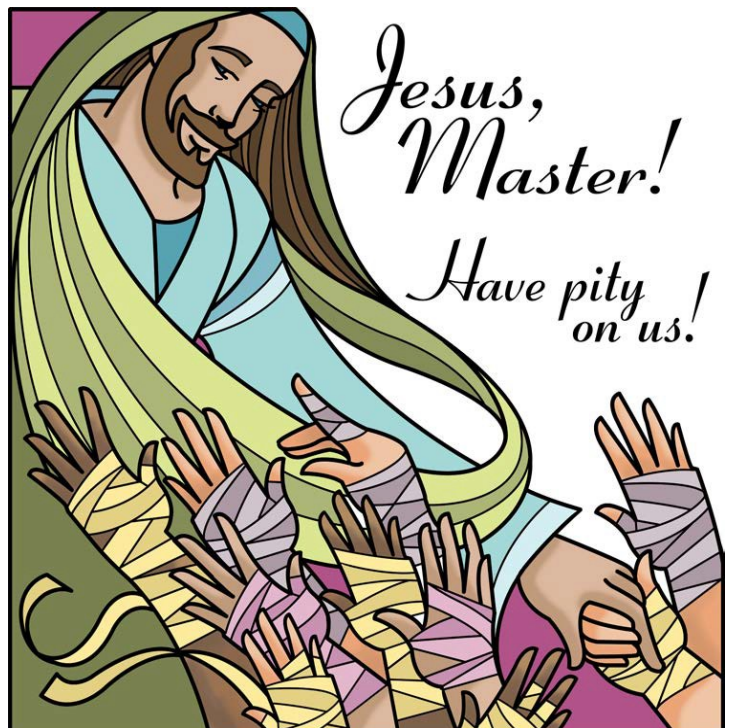

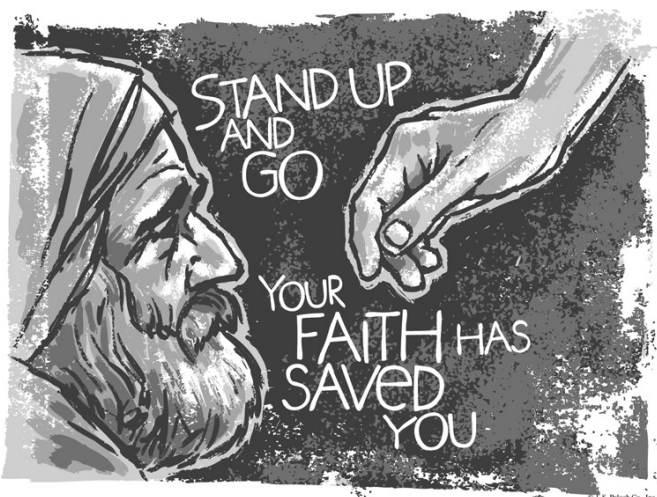

HEALING AND SALVATION

The readings today speak of healing and salvation. In Second Kings, Naaman, a commander of the army of the king of Syria, develops leprosy. He goes to a stranger, a prophet from Israel, when no one else can cure his disease. Much to his surprise, after a simple bath in the river, he is cured. In Luke's Gospel, Jesus cures ten lepers and sends them to the priest. Only one, a Samaritan, returns to thank Jesus for his cure and only he hears the words, "Your faith has saved you." The psalm and Timothy remind us that salvation involves justice, kindness, and faithfulness and forever links us with Jesus. In a world as broken as ours, both healing and salvation are necessary.

Today I would like to highlight the canonization of John Henry Newman. The event takes place this Sunday, October 13th, at the Vatican. We will be able to read Pope Francis's homily for the Mass of canonization at the Vatican website. Better yet, we will be able to hear and see the pope on YouTube.

John Henry Newman is a prominent figure of the Church of England in the 19th Century. He is arguable the most important theologian of the 19th Century. Many universities around the United States have "Newman Centers" as places where Catholic students gather to worship and reflect on theological themes. They are places for dialogue with other Christian denominations (Ecumenism) which Newman championed in his life.

Anyone interested in reading some of his many books, "An Essay on the Development of Christian Doctrine" would be a good start.

WHAT TO DO WHEN A FRIEND IS CONSIDERING ABORTION

When a woman is facing a difficult pregnancy, the reaction of the first person she tells tends to set the tone for her decision-making. How do we respond to our friend in a loving way that is life-affirming for both her and her baby? First, prioritize listening over speaking. Ask her about her feelings, thoughts, values, beliefs, and wants. When her story is fully shared, it is your turn to provide factual information, always in a loving and caring way. Encourage her.

Help her set and work towards goals that extend beyond her due date to help her see life beyond her pregnancy. Reassure her there is always hope and she is not alone, and provide practical support. Pray with her, offering Christ's love at a crucial life-saving and life-defining moment.

Saints of the Week

Monday, Oct. 14th: Saint Callistus I, Pope, Martyr; died 222; incurred the ore of Tertullian an St.

Hippolytus over *lapsi* controversy; organized the first official Christian cemetery in Rome and instituted Ember Day fasts.

Tuesday, Oct. 15th: Saint Teresa of Jesus, Virgin, Doctor of the Church; died in 1582 at Alba at age 67; Spanish mystic who, with St. John of the Cross (14 Dec.), founded the reformed (Discalced) Carmelite friars and nuns, for which she had to endure great trials; authored Way of Perfection, Interior Castle, and an autobiography; first woman



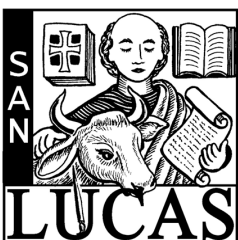
declared “Doctor of the Church” (1970); patroness of Spain.

Wednesday, Oct. 16th: (1) Saint Hedwig, Religious; died 1243 at age 69; born in Bavaria; duchess of Silesia and mother of seven children; peacemaker dedicated to the poor and prisoners; as a widow, retired to a Cistercian convent.

(2) Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque, Virgin; died 17 Oct. 1690 at age 43; French Visitandine mystic who promoted devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, a feast which helped free the Church from the spirit of Jansenism; promoted first Friday devotion.

Thursday, Oct. 17th: Saint Ignatius of Antioch, Bishop, Martyr; died year 107 under Trajan in Rome's amphitheater; from Syria; Apostolic Father known as the second successor of St. Peter in Antioch; wrote seven letters to local communities on church unity and structure; first to use the term “Catholic Church” as a collective designation for Christians.

Friday, Oct. 18th: Saint Luke, Evangelist; Syrian Physician from Antioch and companion of St. Paul; authored Acts of the Apostles and a gospel for gentile Christians; it speaks of God's mercy, universal salvation, love of the poor and the marginalized, absolute renunciation, prayer, and the Holy Spirit; represented by a winged ox (cf.



Ezekiel); patron of the medical profession, painters, artists, sculptors, and butchers.

Saturday, Oct. 19th: Saints John de Brébeuf and Isaac Jogues, Priests, and Companions, Martyrs; French Jesuit and oblate missionaries to the Hurons and Iroquois of North America; Isaac was tomahawked to death by Iroquois on 18 Oct. 1646 near Albany at age 56; John was savagely mutilated and slain 16 Mar, 1649 near Georgian Bay at age 39; other martyrs were Antony Daniel, Gabriel Lalemant, Charles Garnier, Noel Chabanel, and oblates René Goupil and Jean de la Lande; secondary patrons of Canada.

El Salmo y Timoteo nos recuerda que la salvación involucra la justicia, la bondad y la fidelidad y nos vincula para siempre con Jesús. 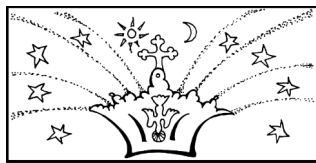
