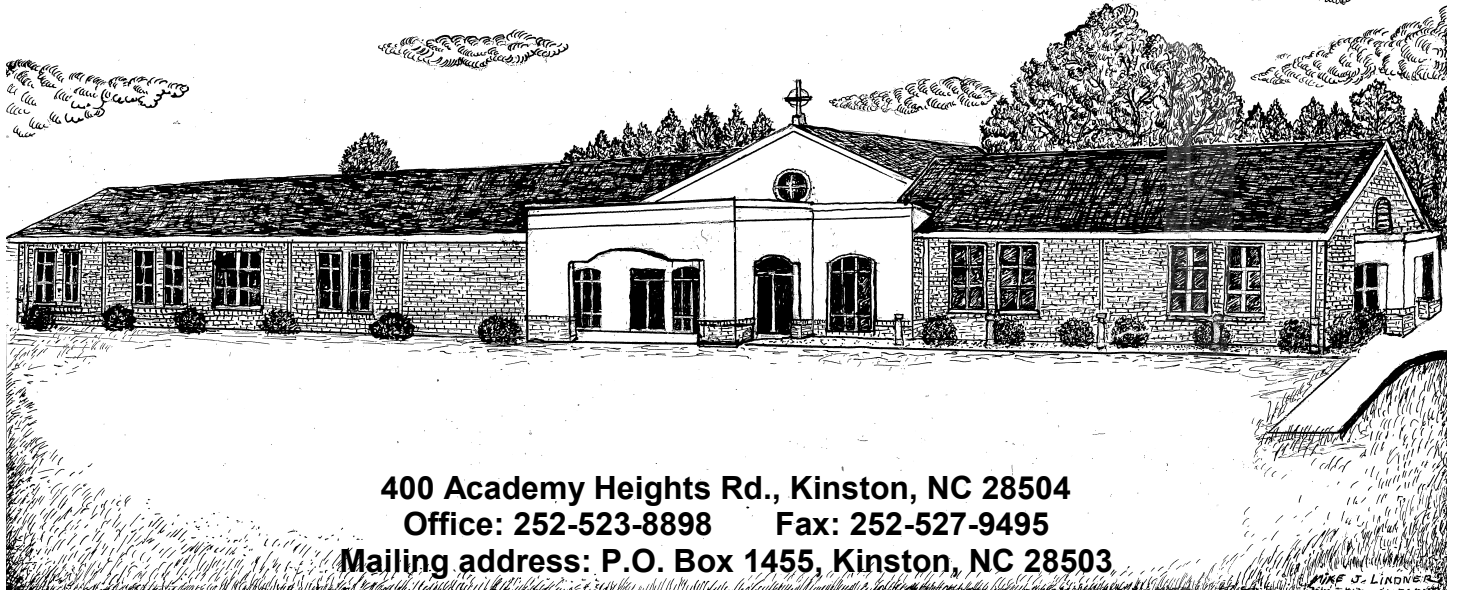

DEN A DIOS LO QUE ES DE DIOS

October 18, 2020
Twenty-Ninth Sunday in
Ordinary Time

IN GOD ALONE

Isaiah speaks to us today of Cyrus, King of Persia, anointed by the Lord. God calls Cyrus by name and leads him in service to the Israelites. In this passage we hear that it is the Lord who gives Cyrus his title, who arms him against his enemies, and who opens doors and unbars gates before him. And God does all of this so that the people will know that “I am the LORD,” and that “there is none besides me” (Isaiah 45:6).

Paul opens his letter with essentially the same notion—that in God alone we find our grace and peace. Paul also gives thanks to God on our behalf, calling to mind our work of faith, hope, and love. And in the familiar Gospel reading, Jesus tells the Pharisees to give to Caesar what is Caesar’s and to God what is God’s.

Dear Parishioners,

Some of you have followed the news from Rome about the beatification of an Italian teenager, Carlos Acutis, who died at 15 in 2006. This step is the step prior to becoming a saint. He would most likely become the first millennial (people reaching young adulthood in the early part of the 21st century) to be declared a Catholic saint.

Pope Francis wrote in his Twitter account, “The witness of Blessed Carlos Acutis indicates to today’s young people that true happiness is found by putting God in first place and serving him in our brothers and sisters, especially the least”.

Anyone interested in learning about Blessed Carlos Acutis may find information in the Vatican website. Blessed Carlos Acutis was beatified at Assisi, on October 10th, 2020, in a Mass presided over by His Eminence Cardinal. Agostino Vallini, Pontifical Legate for the Basilica of Saint Francis.

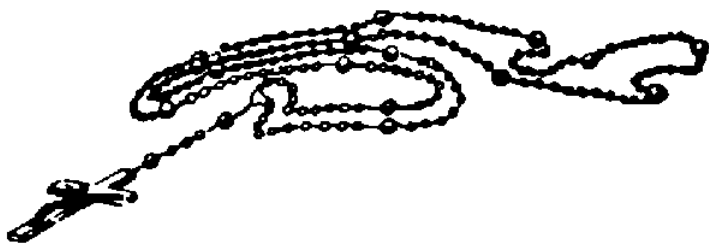

Saints of the Week

Monday, Oct. 19th: Saints John de Brébeuf and Isaac Jogues, Priests, and Companions, Martyrs; French Jesuit and oblate missionaries to the Hurons and Iroquois of North America; Isaac was tomahawked to death by Iroquois on 18 Oct. 1646 near Albany at age 56; John was savagely mutilated and slain 16 Mar, 1649 near Georgian Bay at age 39; other martyrs were Antony Daniel, Gabriel Lalemant, Charles Garnier, Noel Chabanel, and oblates René Goupil and Jean de la Lande; secondary patrons of Canada.

Tuesday, Oct. 20th: Saint Paul of the Cross, Priest; died 18 Oct. 1775 at age 81; born in Liguria; renowned preacher and founder (1720) of the Passionists, today numbering about 2,160 members, who combine the apostolate of retreats and missions with penitential monasticism.

Thursday, Oct. 22nd: Saint John Paul II, Pope; Karol Jozef Wojtyla was born in 1920 in Wadowice, Poland. As archbishop of Krakow, he took part in the Second Vatican Council. On October 16, 1978, he was elected pope and took the name John Paul II. His exceptional apostolic zeal, particularly for families, young people, and the sick, led him to make numerous pastoral visits throughout the world. He left as a heritage to the Church a rich Magisterium and the promulgation of the Catechism of the Catholic Church, the revised Code of Canon Law for the Latin Church and Eastern Churches, and the third typical edition of the Roman Missal. Pope John Paul II departed peacefully in the Lord on 2 April 2005 at age 84. Pope Francis canonized him on 27 April 2014.

Friday, Oct. 23rd: Saint John of Capistrano, Priest; died 1456 at age 70; reformer of the Franciscans and Poor Clares; preached devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus (3 Jan.); animated resistance against the Turks at the battle of Belgrade (1456); patron of military chaplains.

Saturday, Oct. 24th: Saint Anthony Mary Claret, Bishop; died 1870 at age 63; from Catalonia; vigorous reforming bishop of Santiago, Cuba; founded (1849) the Missionary Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary (Claretians), today numbering about 3,000 members; fostered credit unions and the apostolate of the press.

Isaías nos habla hoy de Ciro, el rey de Persia, ungido del Señor. Dios llama a Ciro por su nombre y lo conduce a servir a los israelitas. En este pasaje oímos que es el Señor quien le da a Ciro su título, quien lo arma contra sus enemigos, y quien abre los portones, y no deja nada trancado ante él. Y Dios hace todo esto para que su pueblo llegue a saber que “yo soy el SEÑOR,” y que “no hay otro” (Isaías 45:6).

Pablo abre su carta esencialmente con la misma noción, que sólo en Dios podemos hallar gracia y paz. Pablo también da gracias a Dios en nuestro nombre, recordando nuestro trabajo fatigoso de fe, esperanza y amor. Y en la familiar lectura del Evangelio, Jesús dice a los fariseos que den al César lo que es del César y a Dios lo que es de Dios.

El Papa Francisco escribió en su cuenta de Twitter: “El testimonio del Beato Carlos Acutis indica a los jóvenes de hoy que la verdadera felicidad se encuentra poniendo a Dios en primer lugar y sirviéndole en nuestros hermanos, especialmente en los más pequeños”.
