



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## October 4, 2020 Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

### THE GIFT OF THE REIGN OF GOD

Matthew's Gospel today expands on Isaiah's ballad considerably. A comparison with the same story in Mark's Gospel clearly shows us that here the author is busy teaching this community of Jewish Christians: "This is a story about Israel a long time ago; this is also a story about Jesus and the skeptical leaders."

Jesus as much as told these Jewish leaders that they were the tenants who first stoned their own prophets. And he told the leaders they were the tenants who would soon even dispose of him—Jesus—and, in doing so, would forfeit their privileged place of presenting to the world the promised Messiah.

"And this," says Matthew's Gospel, "is a story about you, the inheritors of what was first offered to Israel." The reign of God was first opened to Israel and is now given to the whole world, but it must be received as a gift. The first Christians are the new tenants in the vineyard. The deeper reality of the reign or kingdom of God is that it is available to everyone on the face of the earth—Israel included.

**Second Reading** — God's peace will guard your hearts and minds (Philippians 4:6-9).

**Gospel** — The kingdom of God will be given to those who will produce its fruit (Matthew 21:33-43).

Saturday, October 3, the Holy Father went to Assisi where he celebrated Holy Mass at the tomb of Saint Francis and signed the text of the encyclical.

The theme of the encyclical is universal fraternity and social friendship. The title of the encyclical is taken literally from the writings of Saint Francis. Although it seems that it was addressed only to men and not to women, the expression must be seen as it was seen in the time of San Francisco and encompassed everyone regardless of gender.

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## Saints of the Week

**Monday, Oct. 5th:** Blessed Francis Xavier Seelos, Priest; born in Germany in 1819, entered the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer and was sent to North America. Ordained a priest in 1844, he began his pastoral ministry in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania as assistant pastor of his confrère, Saint John Neumann, serving also as Master of Novices and dedicating himself to preaching. He became a full-time itinerant missionary, preaching in both English and German in a number of different states. A kindly confessor and dynamic mission preacher, he ministered mainly in Pennsylvania, Maryland, and Michigan, and directed two seminaries. During the Civil War, he petitioned President Lincoln to exempt seminarians from the draft and, when refused, he ordained them because priests were exempt; in 1866 he began working with immigrants in New Orleans and died in a yellow fever epidemic on October 4, 1867 at age 48.

**Tuesday, Oct. 6th:** (1)Saint Bruno, Priest; died 1101 in Calabria; celebrated teacher at Reims and close advisor to his former pupil, Pope Urban II (1088-1099); founded (1084), near Grenoble, La Grande Chartreuse (or Charterhouse), the mother house of the Carthusians, who today number around 320 religious; sought "to seek God assiduously, to find God promptly, and to possess God fully"; their motto: "While the world changes, the Cross stands firm".

(2) Blessed Marie Rose Durocher, Virgin; died 1849 at age thirty-eight; born in St.-Antoine, Québec; began the first Canadian parish sodality for young women; founded the Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary for Christian Education.

**Wednesday, Oct. 7th:** Our Lady of the Rosary; this memorial, established by Pope St. Pius V (30 Apr.) in thanksgiving for the victory at Lepanto, 7 Oct. 1571, recalls the rosary and its meditation on the mysteries of Christ and our salvation.

**Friday, Oct. 9th:** (1)Saint Denis, Bishop and Companions, Martyrs; Denis died 258 at age 22; first bishop of Paris; martyred with the presbyter, Eleutherius, and the deacon, Rusticus, on Montmartre (or "mount of martyrs"); patron of Paris and of France.

(2)Saint John Leonardi, Priest; died 1609 at age 68 in Rome; from Lucca; founded (1574) the Congregation of Clerics Regular of the Mother of God, today numbering about ninety members; in 1579 he formed the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine, and published a compendium of Christian doctrine in use until the 19th century; cofounded with St. Philip Neri (26 May) at Rome the Collegio Urbano which, under the direction of the Congregation for the Evangelization of Peoples, trains priests for the foreign missions.

#### EL REGALO DEL REINO DE DIOS

El Evangelio de hoy según san Mateo amplía considerablemente la balada de Isaías. Una comparación con el mismo relato en el Evangelio según san Marcos muestra que aquí el autor se ocupa de enseñar a su comunidad de judío-cristianos: "Este es un relato sobre el Israel de antaño; y es también un relato sobre Jesús y los dudosos líderes".

Jesús llegó a decir a estos líderes judíos que ellos eran los viñadores que primero apedrearon a sus propios profetas. Y le dijo a los líderes que ellos eran los viñadores que pronto se desharían de él, Jesús, y que, al hacerlo, renunciarían a su papel privilegiado de presentar al Mesías prometido al mundo.

"Y éste", dice el Evangelio según san Mateo, "es un relato sobre ustedes, los herederos de lo que fue primeramente ofrecido a Israel". El Reino de Dios fue abierto primero para Israel y ahora es ofrecido a todo el mundo, pero debe ser recibido como un regalo. Los primeros cristianos son los nuevos viñadores. La más profunda realidad del Reino de Dios es que está a disposición de toda persona sobre la faz de la tierra, incluso a Israel.




