

A LITTLE FAITH

Today our readings are about faith, frustration, and how much is enough. Habakkuk is a complainer having an argument with God. Timothy is encouraging a community challenged by cowardice and the apostles want more faith than they have. Things aren't happening fast enough for any of them or for us. All of them and we want God to do something sooner rather than later and we want God to give us a reason to believe that it will all work out. What does God do? God puts it back on them—and us—telling Habakkuk to describe the world he wants; telling the apostles to do more than the expected. Doing more with less is a familiar phrase today and a reminder that a little faith may be enough even for the most difficult times.

October is Respect Life month in the Catholic Church. The first Sunday in October is Respect Life Sunday. During this month, and especially this Sunday, the Church invites us to reflect on the precious gift of life. Respect life is vast subject that not only deals with respect of the unborn. Abortion is the chief theme in respect for human life, followed by other themes such as euthanasia, suicide, intentional homicide, capital punishment, and legitimate defense. The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains all these themes under the teaching on the Fifth Commandment (numbers 2258-2283).

During this month we will include petitions of respect of human life in our Sunday liturgies. We will also include some small articles on the subject in the bulletin this month.

Please keep this theme of Respect Life in your prayers during his month.

HOW TO BUILD A CULTURE OF LIFE

Watching the news and reading the headlines, we may feel helpless seeing the heartbreaking lack of respect for human life. *How do we respond?* Changing the culture is a process of conversion that begins in our own hearts. When we encounter Christ, experience His love, and deepen our relationship with Him, we become more aware of our own immeasurable worth and that of others. His unchanging love is the source of our God-given dignity, which, therefore, cannot be taken away. When someone is facing great trials, we need to walk with them on their journey, intercede for them, and be open to sharing Christ's love however He directs. We simply need to follow where He leads.


Saints of the Week

Monday, Oct. 7th: Our Lady of the Rosary; this memorial, established by Pope St. Pius V (30 Apr.) in thanksgiving for the victory at Lepanto, 7 Oct. 1571, recalls the rosary and its meditation on the mysteries of Christ and our salvation.

Wednesday, October 9th: (1)Saint Denis, Bishop and Companions, Martyrs; Denis died 258 at age 22; first bishop of Paris; martyred with the presbyter, Eleutherius, and the deacon, Rusticus, on Montmartre (or "mount of martyrs"); patron of Paris and of France.

(2)Saint John Leonardi, Priest; died 1609 at age 68 in Rome; from Lucca; founded (1574) the Congregation of Clerics Regular of the Mother of God, today numbering about ninety members; in 1579 he formed the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine, and published a compendium of Christian doctrine in use until the 19th century; cofounded with St. Philip Neri (26 May) at Rome the Collegio Urbano which, under the direction of the Congregation for the Evangelization of Peoples, trains priests for the foreign missions.

Friday, October 11th: Saint John XXIII, Pope; Born of a farming family in Sotto il Monte in northern Italy in



1881, Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli was ordained a priest in 1904. After serving in World War I as a stretcher-bearer, he was later made national director of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. In 1925 he became a papal diplomat, serving in Bulgaria, Turkey, and in France. With the help of Germany's ambassador to Turkey, Roncalli helped save an estimated 24,000 Jewish people during World War II. Named a cardinal and appointed patriarch of Venice in 1953 by Pope Pius XII, he was elected pope in 1958 at age seventy-eight. He convoked (1959) the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965). "Good Pope John" died of stomach cancer 3 June 1963 at age 82. His feast day, 11 October, recalls the day of the first session of the Second Vatican Council (1962). Declared a Blessed in 2000, he was canonized, together with Pope John Paul II, by Pope Francis on 27 April 2014.

Todos ellos y nosotros queremos que Dios haga algo mucho más pronto que tarde y queremos que Dios nos dé una razón para creer que todo saldrá bien. ¿Qué es lo que quiere Dios? Dios se lo devuelve a ellos, y a nosotros, diciéndole a Habacuc que describa el mundo que él quiere; diciéndole a los apóstoles hacer más de lo que se espera. Haciendo más con menos es una frase muy conocida hoy y un recuerdo que un poco de fe puede ser suficiente incluso en los momentos difíciles.

Venta del Plato de Pollo



#2258 *Human life is sacred* because from its beginning it involves the creative action of God and it remains for ever in a special relationship with the Creator, who is its sole end. God alone is the Lord of life from its beginning until its end: no one can under any circumstance claim for himself the right directly to destroy an innocent human being.

#2258 *La vida humana es sagrada*, porque desde su inicio es fruto de la acción creadora de Dios y permanece siempre en una especial relación con el Creador, su único fin.
