



CONFIDENCE IN THE LORD

We are nearing the end of the liturgical year. Today's readings remind us that our own lives will draw to a close one day, and we can be certain that the Lord will encourage, strengthen, and save us—both now and at the last. The astonishing story of the Maccabees invigorates our faith as we behold an entire family willing to die rather than deny the Law of Moses. The psalm response echoes the faithful cries of the Maccabees: "I call upon you, for you will answer me, O God." That same confidence appears in Saint Paul's letter to the Thessalonians. "The Lord is faithful," he testifies; "he will strengthen you and guard you from the evil one." In the Gospel, Jesus explains just how long God's protection will endure. The children of God whom God guards, Jesus says, will live forever like angels.

On July 5, 2017, Pope Francis named Bishop Zarama the sixth bishop of the Diocese of Raleigh, North Carolina.

Bishop Zarama's motto is "God is love." For his coat of arms, Bishop Zarama adopted a design to reflect his life and ministry as a priest.

On a blue field is displayed an extra wide chevron of Gold (yellow). This device gives the

illusion of two mountains; a gold one and a blue one. The gold mountain (the chevron) is charged with a scattering (semé) of red crosses to represent the bishop's home city of Pasto, in southwestern Colombia, which is known as "The Theological City." The lower mountain (part of the blue field) has a golden lion's head to represent the Evangelist, Saint Mark, who is the titular patron of the parish in Clarkesville, Georgia, on a mountain, where Bishop Zarama served as pastor.

Above the chevron are a gold rose for Saint Theresa of the Child Jesus, also known as "The Little Flower," and a silver (white) lily for Saint Joseph, the Foster Father of Jesus, who have served as Bishop Zarama's particular patrons throughout his life as a priest and now as a bishop.

The achievement is completed with the external ornaments, which are a gold episcopal processional cross that is placed in back of and which extends above and below the shield, and the pontifical hat, called a "galero," with its six tassels, in three rows, on either side of the shield, all in green.

A diocesan bishop shows his commitment to the flock he shepherds by combining his personal coat of arms with that of the diocese, in a technique known as impaling. The shield is divided in half along the pale, or central vertical line. The arms of the diocese appear on the dexter side—that is, on the side of the shield to the viewer's left, which would cover the right side (in Latin, dextera) of the person carrying the shield. The arms of the bishop are on the sinister side—the bearer's left, the viewer's right.

Saints of the Week

Monday, Nov. 11th: Saint Martin of Tours, Bishop; died 397, aged 80+; from Pannonia (in Hungary); soldier turned Christian at eighteen; disciple of St. Hilary; at Ligugé, founded the first monastery in the West; bishop of Tours; first non-martyr with annual feast in the Western Church; patron of soldiers, wine producers, and of France.

Tuesday, Nov. 12th: Saint Josaphat Kuncevych, Bishop, Martyr; died 1623 at age 43; born in Poland, raised Ukrainian Orthodox, becoming at Vilna a Basilian monk of the Ruthenian Rite; bishop of Polotsk; his fidelity to the Roman See and his desire for union between the Ukrainian Church and Rome led to his murder at Vitebsk; first formally canonized saint of the Eastern Rite (1867).

Wednesday, Nov. 13th: Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini, Virgin; died in Chicago, 22 Dec. 1917 at age 67; from Lombardy; youngest of thirteen children; founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart; for twenty-eight years labored in U.S. and South America, established some sixty-seven institutions (schools, hospitals and orphanages); first U.S. citizen canonized (1946); patroness of immigrants and migrants.

Friday, Nov. 15th: Saint Albert the Great, Bishop; died 1280 at Cologne at age 80; from Swabia; master of philosophy, theology, and the natural sciences, especially Aristotle; teacher of St. Thomas Aquinas; Provincial of the German Dominicans (1254-1257), becoming bishop of Regensburg; prolific writer; wrote on the cult of the Sacred Heart; patron of scientists.

Saturday, Nov. 16th: (1) Saint Margaret of Scotland; died 1093 at age 48; from Hungary; wife of King Malcolm III of Scotland and mother of eight children; helped root out paganism; her love for the poor became legendary; patroness of Scotland. **(2)** Saint Gertrude, Virgin; called "the Great", died 17 Nov. 1301 at age 46; born in Thuringia; Benedictine mystic of the famous Benedictine abbey of Helfta in Saxony; wrote on the meaning of suffering, the Sacred Heart, the Trinity, and God's love.

COLLECTION FOR THE ARCHDIOCESE FOR THE MILITARY SERVICES, USA

On the Sunday before Veterans Day, every third year, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops takes up a collection nationwide to support the Archdiocese for the Military Services. This unique Archdiocese is faced with many challenges, including a severe shortage of Catholic priest-chaplains, a flock spread out among military installations across the world, and in constant transition. The Archdiocese receives no funding from the military or the government and must rely solely on private donors. This year the Sunday before Veterans Day is November 10th. The monthly collection for Outreach has been scheduled for that date at Holy Spirit. There will not be a third collection for the Archdiocese for the Military Services on November 10th. Envelopes prepared for this collection are available in the atrium and anyone who would like to support this Archdiocese may use them. 

El 5 de julio de 2017, el papa Francisco nombró al obispo Zarama el sexto obispo de la diócesis de Raleigh, Carolina del Norte.

El lema del obispo Zarama es "Dios es amor". Para su escudo, el obispo Zarama adoptó un diseño para reflejar su vida y ministerio como sacerdote.

En un campo azul se muestra un galón extra ancho de oro (amarillo). Este dispositivo da la ilusión de dos montañas; uno dorado y uno azul. La montaña de oro (el galón) está cargada con una dispersión (semé) de cruces rojas para representar a Pasto, la ciudad natal del obispo, en el suroeste de Colombia, que se conoce como "La Ciudad Teológica". La montaña más baja (parte del campo azul) tiene una cabeza de león de oro para representar al evangelista, San Marcos, quien es el patrón titular de la parroquia en Clarkesville, Georgia, en una montaña, donde el obispo Zarama sirvió como párroco.

Sobre el galón hay una rosa de oro para Santa Teresa del Niño Jesús, también conocida como "La Florecilla", y un lirio plateado (blanco) para San José, el Padre adoptivo de Jesús, que han servido como patronos particulares del Obispo Zarama su vida como sacerdote y ahora como obispo.

El diseño se completa con los adornos externos, que son una cruz procesional episcopal de oro que se coloca detrás y que se extiende por encima y por debajo del escudo, y el sombrero pontificio, llamado "galero", con sus seis borlas, en tres filas, a cada lado del escudo, todo en verde.

Un obispo diocesano muestra su compromiso con el rebaño que pastorea combinando su escudo personal con el de la diócesis, en una técnica conocida como empalar. El escudo se divide por la mitad a lo largo de la línea vertical central. El escudo de la diócesis aparece en el lado diestro, es decir, en el lado del escudo a la izquierda del espectador, que cubriría el lado derecho (en latín, dextera) de la persona que porta el escudo. El escudo del obispo está la lado siniestro: la izquierda del portador, la derecha del espectador.
