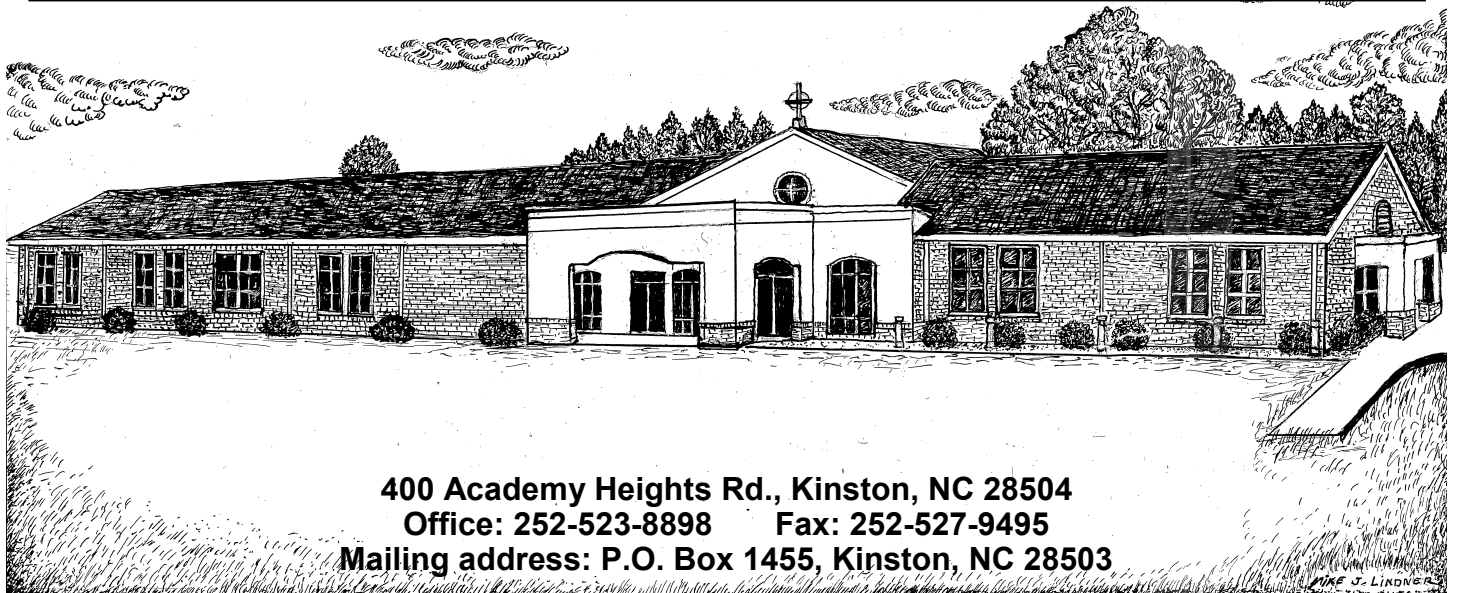

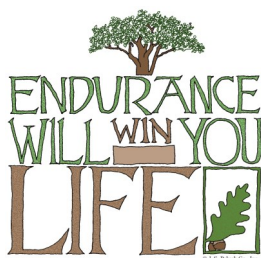

Name: Campaign for Human Development

Purpose: To address the root causes of poverty in the United States through promotion and support of community-controlled, self-help organizations and transformative education.

Type: National level (all funds are sent to the Conference of Bishops to support the Church's works of social justice, evangelization, and education both domestically and around the globe; small donations like \$1.00-\$2.00 go a long way in this nationwide pool of donors).

Second collections are optional. Parishioners are given this choice at the moment of passing the baskets.

Segunda Colecta del Siguiete Domingo

Nombre: Campaña Católica para el Desarrollo Humano

Propósito: Atacar las causas de la pobreza en Estados Unidos a través de la promoción y el apoyo a organizaciones de auto-ayuda.

Clase: Nivel nacional (todos los fondos son enviados a la Conferencia de Obispos para apoyar el trabajo de justicia social, evangelización y educación tanto en el país como en el exterior; donaciones pequeñas como \$1.00-\$2.00 contribuyen a una colecta grande a nivel nacional).

Las segundas colectas son opcionales. A los parroquianos se les da ésta opción al momento en que circula la canasta.

Saints of the Week

Tuesday, Nov. 15th: Saint Albert the Great, Bishop, Doctor of the Church; died 1280 at Cologne; from Swabia; O.P. master of philosophy, theology, and the natural sciences, especially Aristotle; teacher of St. Thomas Aquinas (28 Jan.); Provincial of the German Dominicans (1254-1257), becoming bishop of Regensburg; prolific writer (thirty-eight quarto volumes in print); wrote on the cult of the Sacred Heart; patron of scientists.

Wednesday, Nov. 16th: (1) Saint Margaret of Scotland; died 1093 at age 48; from Hungary; wife of King Malcolm III of Scotland and mother of eight children; helped root out paganism; her love for the poor became legendary; patroness of Scotland.

(2) Saint Gertrude, Virgin; called "the Great", died 17 Nov. 1301 at age 46; born in Thuringia; Benedictine mystic of the famous Benedictine abbey of Helfta in Saxony; wrote on the meaning of suffering, the Sacred Heart, the Trinity, and God's love.

Thursday, Nov. 17th: Saint Elizabeth of Hungary, Religious; died 1231 at age 23; wife of Louis VI of Thuringia and mother of three; as a widow, she became a Franciscan tertiary, dedicated to the needs of the poor and the sick; canonized only four years after her death; patroness of the Franciscan Third Order and of Catholic charities.

Friday, Nov. 18th: (1) The Dedication of the Basilicas of Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles; around 330 Constantine built a basilica over the tomb of St. Peter. Reconstruction began in the 14th century and the present basilica of St. Peter was consecrated 18 Nov. 1626 by Pope Urban VIII. The construction of St. Paul's on the Via Ostiense was begun by Valentinian II in 386, taking the place of a smaller church built by Constantine. Destroyed by fire in 1823, the new basilica was consecrated 10 Dec. 1854 by Pope Pius IX who joined in one solemn celebration the dedication of these two basilicas.

(2) Saint Rose Philippine Duchesne, Virgin; died 1852 at age 83 at St. Charles, Missouri; from Grenoble, France; founded the first American house of the Religious of the Sacred Heart; opened the first American free school west of the Mississippi; known for her courage and desire to serve Native Americans, especially, the Potawatomi who called her "the woman who prays always".

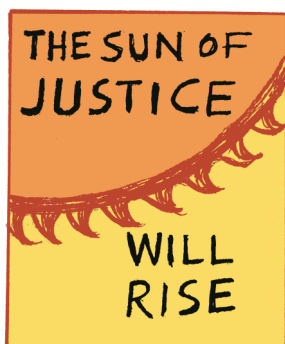
Colecta de despensa de alimentos
