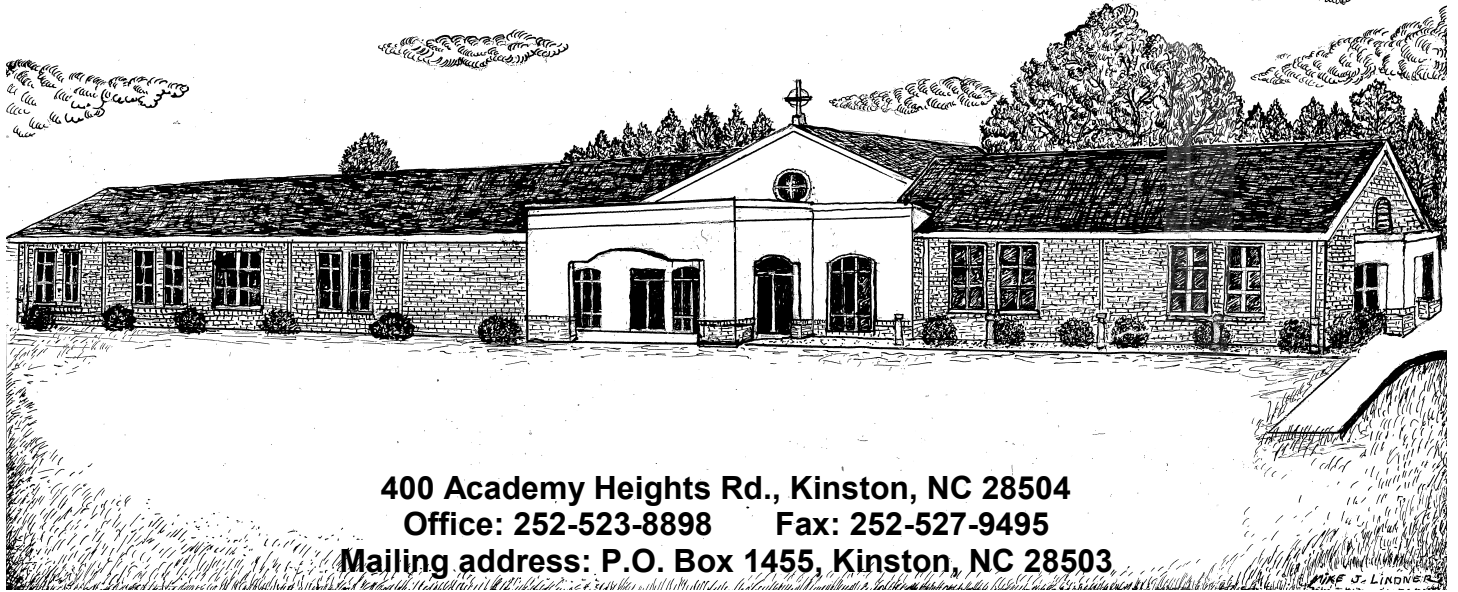

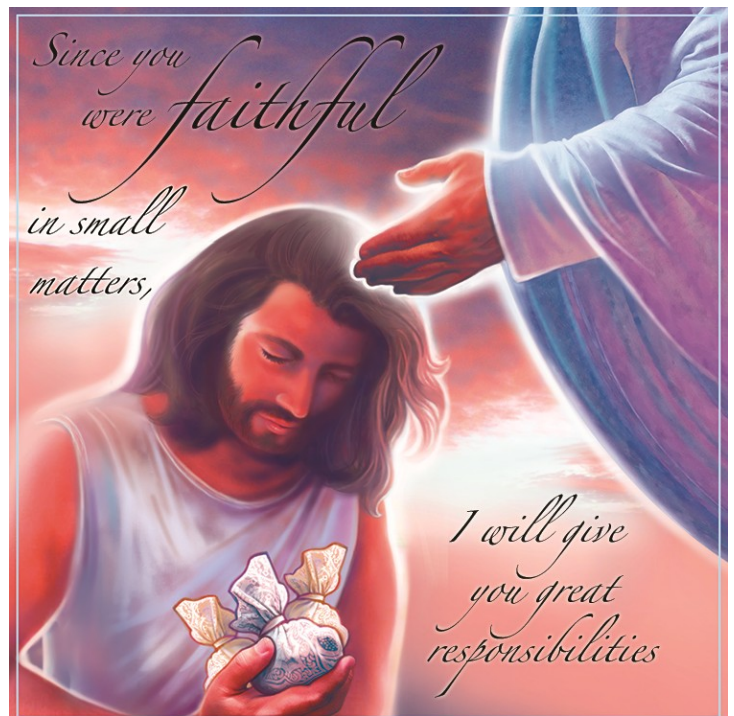

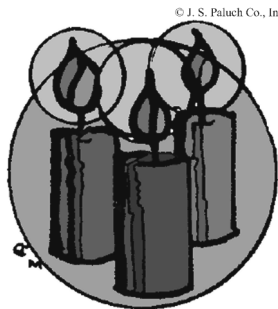

The letters of Paul to the Thessalonians are among his earliest writings, and are driven by his belief and the belief of the entire early Christian community that the return of Christ was imminent, and that devoting time or attention to anything else was foolish.

As time progressed, this fervor subsided a bit. Today we may wonder, when we hear these readings about the coming end-times, if we should take them to heart, if we really believe that Christ still may come upon us as a “thief at night” (1 Thessalonians 5:2). Does this mean that we are to stop our long-range goal-setting, get rid of our yearly calendars and planners, or stop putting money in the college education fund? Of course not. What it does mean is that we need to change our lives, living like children of the light and illuminating the world around us with the light of the gospel. Then, on that day, when the details of our daily living become unimportant, we will be ready to find our peace and security in Christ Jesus.

African American History & Heritage

Nov. 17th: Capture of George Latimer in Boston led to first of the fugitive slave cases which embittered North and South. Boston abolitionists raised money to purchase Latimer from his slaveholder. – 1842

Saints of the Week

Monday, Nov. 16th: (1) Saint Margaret of Scotland; died 1093 at age 48; from Hungary; wife of King Malcolm III of Scotland and mother of eight children; helped root out paganism; her love for the poor became legendary; patroness of Scotland.

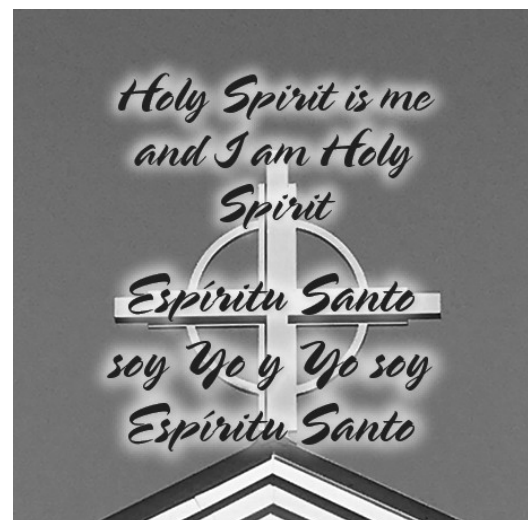
(2) Saint Gertrude, Virgin; called "the Great", died 17 Nov. 1301 at age 46; born in Thuringia; Benedictine mystic of the famous Benedictine abbey of Helfta in Saxony; wrote on the meaning of suffering, the Sacred Heart, the Trinity, and God's love.

Tuesday, Nov. 17th: Saint Elizabeth of Hungary, Religious; died 1231 at age 23; wife of Louis VI of Thuringia and mother of three; as a widow, she became a Franciscan tertiary, dedicated to the needs of the poor and the sick; canonized only four years after her death; patroness of the Franciscan Third Order and of Catholic charities.

Wednesday, Nov. 18th: (1) The Dedication of the Basilicas of Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles; around 330 Constantine built a basilica over the tomb of St. Peter. Reconstruction began in the 14th century and the present basilica of St. Peter was consecrated 18 Nov. 1626 by Pope Urban VIII. The construction of St. Paul's on the Via Ostiense was begun by Valentinian II in 386, taking the place of a smaller church built by Constantine. Destroyed by fire in 1823, the new basilica was consecrated 10 Dec. 1854 by Pope Pius IX who joined in one solemn celebration the dedication of these two basilicas.

(2) Saint Rose Philippine Duchesne, Virgin; died 1852 at age 83 at St. Charles, Missouri; from Grenoble, France; founded the first American house of the Religious of the Sacred Heart; opened the first American free school west of the Mississippi; known for her courage and desire to serve Native Americans, especially, the Potawatomi who called her "the woman who prays always".

Saturday, November 21st: The Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary; this memorial finds its origins in a 2nd century apocryphal source, the *Protoevangelion* or *Book of James*, and the dedication on 21 Nov. 543 of the Basilica of St. Mary the New in Jerusalem.



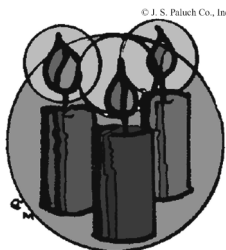

Por supuesto que no. Lo que significa es que necesitamos cambiar nuestra vida, vivir como hijos de la luz e ir iluminando el mundo que nos rodea con la luz del Evangelio. Entonces, en aquél día, cuando los detalles de nuestra vida diaria se tornen poco importantes, estaremos listos para encontrar nuestra paz y seguridad en Cristo Jesús.

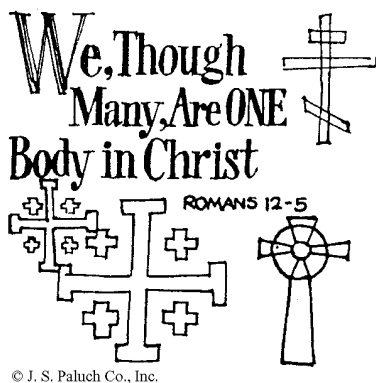
