



HOPEFUL EXPECTATION

Our liturgical year begins with the season of Advent—a time of hopeful expectation of the coming of the Lord. On the First Sunday of Advent we look forward to the end of time when we will awaken to the dawn of Christ's new day.

Today we hear Isaiah speak of a day when God's power will have brought universal peace and God's Word will have instructed all people, radiating God's "light" (teachings) into all of human society. Only when humanity walks "in the light of the LORD" (Isaiah 2:5), when all people desire to be instructed "in [God's] ways" (Isaiah 2:3), will the world be set aright and our deepest longings fulfilled. The reading from Romans calls us to "awake from sleep" for this final "day is at hand" (Romans 13:11, 12). Together this Sunday's scriptures proclaim our Christian faith that Jesus is the One who will finally come to fulfill God's plan of salvation.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Long ago in northern Europe, the growing dark and winter weather in Advent forced people to remove the wheels from their carts and replace them with snow runners. The wheels were hung high in the rafters of the house, fitted out with lanterns, and wound tightly with evergreen boughs. The first wreaths were windows into heaven, a source of light, a comforting sign of the victory of the light of Christ over our world's dark wildernesses, its mountainous obstacles, its valleys of need.

The Advent wreath started in the home, and only later appeared in church. Its four candles represent the four Sundays of our journey: typically three purple, one rose. Why not set a wreath in your own home as a place for Advent prayer? Don't let a shortage of purple candles discourage you: some use a deep blue, others have white candles and weave blue and purple flowers, seashells, and pine cones into the green. When the sun sets tonight, light a single candle, sing a verse of a well-loved Advent hymn, and name a mountain to be leveled, a valley to be filled.

Saints of the Week

Tuesday, Dec 3rd: Saint Francis Xavier, Priest; died 1552 at age 46 on the island of Sancion off the China coast; from Navarre; one of the founding Jesuits; preach in India, Sri Lanka, Malaysia, and Japan; with St. Thérèse of the Child Jesus (1 Oct.), co-patron of the Apostleship of prayer and foreign missions.




Wednesday, Dec. 4th: Saint John Damascene, Priest, Doctor of the Church; died 749 at age 73; born in Damascus, a Muslim city; raised a Christian yet served as a finance minister or "grand vizier" at the court of the caliph where he was respected for his competence, fairness, and humility; became a monk, later a priest at the monastery of St. Sabas, near Jerusalem;



first of the East to formulate a comprehensive synthesis of Christian dogma; main dogmatic work: The Fount of Knowledge; defended the veneration of images against iconoclasts; composed hymns and preached many homilies in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary, especially her assumption; last of the Greek Fathers.

Friday, Dec. 6th: Saint Nicholas died in the 4th century. He was the bishop of Myra in Asia Minor; model pastor noted for charity; popularized as Santa Claus (anglicized from Dutch "Sinter Claus"); patron of children, bankers, pawnbrokers, sailors, performers, brides, unmarried women, travelers, fishermen, dock workers, brewers, poets and prisoners; also of Russia, Greece, Sicily, Lorraine, and Apulia in Italy where his relics are enshrined in Bari.



Saturday, Dec. 7th: Saint Ambrose, Bishop, Doctor of the Church, died on Holy Saturday at age 57; born in Trier of noble parents; classically educated; while a catechumen, chosen by popular acclaim as bishop of Milan and consecrated Dec. 7th, 374; his allegorical exegesis and rhetorical skill made him a compelling preacher; defender of orthodoxy against Arianism; brought Theodosius to public penance; composed several liturgical hymns; baptized Augustine; along with Sts. Jerome, Augustine and Gregory I, declared one of the four great doctors of the Latin Church by Pope Boniface VIII in 1298.

Angel Tree


