



SALVATION IN DAILY LIFE

This Sunday is the feast of the Holy Family, which comes on the first Sunday after Christmas Day. Today's feast celebrates how the humanity of Jesus (including his entire family life) has brought saving significance into the daily rhythms of our human family life.

The scriptures offer instruction and encouragement on how to share—within our families, parish families, and the wider human family—the love that God shares with us in Jesus. Selections from Sirach, Psalm 128, and Colossians encourage us to reflect divine love and thus find holiness in all our human relationships. The reading from Matthew's Gospel offers a living example of love in the actions Joseph took to protect his young family from danger and to nurture them within the larger family of faith of their time.

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TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — Those who honor and comfort their parents shall never be forgotten (Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14).
Psalm — Blessed are those who fear the Lord and walk in his ways (Psalm 128).

Second Reading — You are called into one body. Bear with one another; forgive one another; let Christ's peace control you (Colossians 3:12-21 [12-17]).

Gospel — Joseph rose, took the child and his mother, and fled to Egypt (Matthew 2:13-15, 19-23).

In 1969, it became a feast of Christmas.

The prayers today remind us not only of family life, but of life in the community of faith. We ponder the mystery of a God who loves us dearly enough to embrace the struggles, joys, and daily sorrows of family life. The message of Christmas shines through: God-with-us is available to us in the ordinary patterns of our lives and commitments. The lives of people who raise their children in difficult circumstances, and of people who remain faithful to life in the Church in spite of some of their own family struggles, occupy a special place in our hearts today in prayer.

Saints of the Week

Tuesday, Dec. 31st: Saint Sylvester I, Pope; died 335 at age 50; as bishop of Rome (314-335), organized public worship and dedicated the Lateran basilica; represented at the Council of Nicea which condemned Arianism; one of the first non-martyrs venerated as a saint.

Thursday, Jan. 2nd: Saints Basil the Great and Gregory Nazianzen, Bishops, Doctors of the Church.

Basil died 1 Jan. 379; hermit who became bishop of Caesarea in Cappadocia; noted for his learning; foe of Arianism; wrote a rule on monasticism; source of Eucharistic Prayer IV.

Gregory Nazianzen died 25 Jan 389; Patriarch of Constantinople; noted for his knowledge of sacred Scripture; called theologus for his outstanding teaching abilities and eloquence. St. Basil the Great, St. Gregory Nazianzen, St. Athanasius (2 May), and St. John Chrysostom (13 Sept.), are considered the four great doctors of the Eastern Church.

Saturday, Jan. 4th: Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton,

Religious; died 1821 at age 47; raised Episcopalian; wife and mother of five children; foundress (1812) of the first congregation for women religious in USA, the sisters of Charity, devoted primarily to the education of the poor and to teaching in parochial schools; first native born citizen canonized (1975).

African American History & Heritage

Jan. 1st: The Emancipation Proclamation, issued by President Lincoln, went into effect, liberating all enslaved inhabitants of the United States.-1863

January 1st: The Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God

In the encyclical *Marialis Cultus* (1974) Pope Paul VI states: "This celebration, assigned to January 1 in conformity with the ancient liturgy of the city of Rome, is meant to commemorate the part played by Mary in this mystery of salvation. It is meant also to exalt the singular dignity which this mystery brings to the 'holy Mother... through whom we were found worthy... to receive the Author of life.' It is likewise a fitting occasion for renewed adoration of the newborn Prince of Peace, for listening once more to the glad tidings of the angels, and for imploring from God, through the Queen of Peace, the supreme gift of peace. For this reason... we have instituted the World Day of Peace, an observance that is gaining increasing support and is already bringing forth fruits of peace in the hearts of many" (no. 5).

SALVACIÓN EN LA VIDA DIARIA

Este domingo es la fiesta de la Sagrada Familia que cae en el primer domingo después del Día de Navidad. La fiesta de hoy celebra cómo la humanidad de Jesús (incluso toda su familia) ha dado significado salvífico a los quehaceres diarios de nuestra propia vida familiar.

Las lecturas ofrecen instrucción y aliento sobre cómo compartir –dentro de nuestras familias, en la familia de la parroquia y en la más amplia familia humana– el amor que Dios comparte con nosotros en Jesús. Selecciones de Eclesiástico, del salmo 128 (127), y colosenses nos alientan a ser reflejo del amor divino y así encontrar la santidad en todas nuestras relaciones humanas. La lectura del Evangelio según Mateo ofrece un ejemplo vivo de amor en las medidas que José tomó para proteger a su joven familia del peligro y para que creciera dentro de la gran familia de fe de su época.

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LECTURAS DE HOY

1 de enero: La Solemnidad de María, Madre de Dios

En la encíclica Marialis Cultus (1974), el Papa Pablo VI declara: "Esta celebración, asignada al 1 de enero de conformidad con la antigua liturgia de la ciudad de Roma, está destinada a conmemorar el papel desempeñado por María en este misterio de salvación. También tiene el propósito de exaltar la dignidad singular que este misterio trae a la 'santa Madre ... a través de la cual fuimos hallados dignos ... Para de recibir al Autor de la vida'. También es una ocasión apropiada para la adoración renovada del recién nacido Príncipe de paz, por escuchar una vez más las buenas nuevas de los ángeles y por suplicar a Dios, a través de la Reina de la Paz, el don supremo de la paz. Por esta razón ... hemos instituido el Día Mundial de la Paz, una celebración que está ganando cada vez más apoyo y ya está dando frutos de paz en los corazones de muchos "(número 5).
