



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
## May 1, 2022

### Third Sunday of Easter

#### GOD'S OVERFLOWING KINDNESS

The superabundance of God's kindness ties all of today's readings together. Especially when life overwhelms us, the Lord provides all we need, and then some. In the Acts of the Apostles, Peter takes the lead when facing the Sanhedrin. We might expect the man who denied Jesus to crumble under the imposing glare of the high priest. Instead, the Holy Spirit helps him testify to his faith in Jesus Christ. What Peter had lacked before, courage and conviction, God provides in abundance. Similarly, today's Gospel shows Jesus providing a surplus of fish for the disciples. They have no luck fishing until the Lord intercedes. Jesus supplies an almost ridiculous number of fish, and he cooks it for them, too. As our reading from Revelation affirms, the overflowing riches of God require constant praise. Countless creatures—"everything in the universe"—cry out to honor the Lord, forever and ever.

#### From the Pastor

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Dear Parishioners,

Bishop Luis Rafael lifted the dispensation from Sunday Mass on April 17<sup>th</sup>, Easter Sunday. The dispensation remains as it has always been for the elderly, sick and vulnerable. Our Bishop considers that it is time to move beyond what we have experienced during the pandemic and return to the regular and weekly encounter with the Lord in the Eucharist.

By resurrecting on a Sunday, the Lord changed the Lord's Day from Saturday to Sunday. By doing this, our Lord was telling his followers that from that moment on, the time that belongs to God within the period of a week is the first 24 hours and not the last 24 hours as in the Old Testament.


We are also reminded of the Old Testament teaching of the first fruits: the first products of the earth, in fact the first child in a family, belonged to God and were to be dedicated to Him and to nothing or no one else but Him. The first day of the week, that is Sunday, belongs to the Lord; all day. The Church tells us that the way to make this dedication of time to God is to rest from work and attend Holy Mass. This is fulfilling the Third Commandment of the Law of God. The observance of this Commandment has been sidelined for many reasons and I think the pandemic has accelerated this trend.

If someone asked me why we should be at Mass on Sundays, I would answer the following: attending Mass every Sunday is a matter of justice. That hour of Sunday belongs to God, and I only have to give it to Him at church in the Holy Mass. In fact, all the time we have belongs to God. God is so generous that he gives us so many hours in the week to work and do our tasks and he only asks us for an hour to return to him. In justice we must give him this hour.

Parents have an even greater obligation, since their decisions in the practice of the faith influence their children. Children by their own means cannot attend the Holy Mass. Children need their parents or guardians to be able to come to the weekly encounter with God. On the day of baptism, God begins a special relationship with these creatures, a relationship that is maintained and strengthened in the Church, especially through the Holy Mass.

I invite you to be faithful in this essential practice of our faith.


**Clase:** Nivel parroquial (todos los fondos se quedan en la parroquia para su uso exclusivo).

- I recognize that part of my God-given make-up is a need to give, and that it is a source of my own peace and happiness.
- I return a portion of my time/skills and possessions to God in a spirit of gratitude.
- I decide on a planned and consistent way of doing this.
- I take it off the top, rather than from what is left over.



## Saints of the Week

**Monday, May 2nd:** Saint Athanasius, Bishop, Doctor of the Church; died 373; forty-five years the bishop of Alexandria; champion of Nicea (325); prolific polemicist against the Arians who exiled him five times; one of the four great doctors of the Eastern Church; wrote On the Incarnation, the Discourse Against the Arians, and the Life of Antony (17 Jan.); known as the "Doctor of the Incarnation."

**Tuesday, May 3rd:** Saints Philip and James, Apostles; St. Philip, from Bethsaida; among the first disciples called by Jesus; tradition holds he preached in Phrygia, dying on a cross at Hierapolis; two apocryphal works attributed to him; with James, venerated as the patron saints of Uruguay.

## May is the Month of the Blessed Virgin Mary

As the Mother of God, the Virgin Mary has a unique position among the saints, indeed, among all creatures. She is exalted, yet still one of us.

Redeemed by reason of the merits of her Son and united to Him by a close and indissoluble tie, she is endowed with the high office and dignity of being the Mother of the Son of God, by which account she is also the beloved daughter of the Father and the temple of the Holy Spirit. Because of this gift of sublime grace she far surpasses all creatures, both in heaven and on earth. At the same time, however, because she belongs to the offspring of Adam she is one with all those who are to be saved. (*Lumen Gentium*, no. 53)

Mary embraces God's will and freely chooses to cooperate with God's grace, thereby fulfilling a crucial role in God's plan of salvation. Throughout the centuries, the Church has turned to the Blessed Virgin in order to come closer to Christ. Many forms of piety toward the Mother of God developed that help bring us closer to her Son. In these devotions to Mary, "while the Mother is honored, the Son, through whom all things have their being and in whom it has pleased the Father that all fullness should dwell, is rightly known, loved and glorified and . . . all His commands are observed." The Church honors her as the Mother of God, looks to her as a model of perfect discipleship, and asks for her prayers to God on our behalf.

### LA BONDAD DESBORDANTE DE DIOS

La superabundancia de la bondad de Dios une todas las lecturas de hoy. Especialmente cuando la vida nos abruma, el Señor nos proporciona todo lo que necesitamos, y más. En los Hechos de los Apóstoles, Pedro toma la iniciativa cuando se enfrenta al Sanedrín. Nosotros podríamos esperar que el hombre que negó a Jesús se desmoronara bajo la imponente mirada del sumo sacerdote. En cambio, el Espíritu Santo le ayuda a dar testimonio de su fe en Jesucristo. Lo que a Pedro le había faltado antes, valor y convicción, Dios se lo proporciona en abundancia. Del mismo modo, el Evangelio de hoy muestra a Jesús proporcionando un excedente de peces a los discípulos. Ellos no tienen suerte pescando sino hasta que el Señor intercede. Jesús les proporciona una cantidad casi exorbitante de peces, y además les cocina algunos. Como afirma nuestra lectura del libro del Apocalipsis, las desbordantes riquezas de Dios requieren una alabanza constante. Innumerables criaturas, “todo en el universo”, clama para honrar al Señor, por los siglos de los siglos.

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### Notas del Párroco

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Estimados Parroquianos,

El obispo Luis Rafael levantó la dispensa de la misa dominical el 17 de abril, domingo de Pascua. La dispensación permanece como siempre ha sido para los ancianos, enfermos y vulnerables. Nuestro Obispo considera que es hora de ir más allá de lo vivido durante la pandemia y volver al encuentro regular y semanal con el Señor en la Eucaristía.

Al resucitar en domingo, el Señor cambió el día del Señor de sábado a domingo. Al hacer esto, nuestro Señor les estaba diciendo a sus seguidores que a partir de ese momento, el tiempo que le pertenece a Dios dentro del período de una semana son las primeras 24 horas y no las últimas 24 horas como en el Antiguo Testamento.

También se nos recuerda la enseñanza del Antiguo Testamento sobre las primicias: los primeros productos de la tierra, de hecho, el primer hijo de una familia, pertenecía a Dios y debía ser dedicado a Él y a nada ni a nadie más que a Él. El primer día de la semana, que es el domingo, pertenece al Señor; todo el día. La Iglesia nos dice que la forma de hacer esta dedicación de tiempo a Dios es descansar del trabajo y asistir a la Santa Misa. Esto es cumplir el Tercer Mandamiento de la Ley de Dios. La observancia de este Mandamiento se ha dejado de lado por muchas razones y creo que la pandemia ha acelerado esta tendencia.

Si alguien me preguntara por qué debemos estar en Misa los domingos, le respondería lo siguiente: asistir a Misa todos los domingos es una cuestión de justicia. Esa hora del domingo es de Dios, y solo tengo que dársela en la iglesia en la Santa Misa. De hecho, todo el tiempo que tenemos es de Dios. Dios es tan generoso que nos da tantas horas a la semana para trabajar y hacer nuestras tareas y solo nos pide una ahora para devolver a él. En justicia debemos darle esta hora.

Los padres de familia tiene una obligación aún más grande, pues sus decisiones en la práctica de la fe influyen en sus hijos. Los niños por sus propios medios no pueden asistir la santa misa. Los niños necesitan de sus padres y guardianes para poder venir al encuentro semanal con Dios. El día del bautismo Dios empieza una relación especial con estas criaturas, relación que se mantiene y se fortalece en la Iglesia especialmente través de la santa misa.

Los invito a que seamos fieles en esta práctica esencial de nuestra fe.




## Mother's Day Cards
