

In today's responsorial psalm the Church sings out: "Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth." All three readings describe how God has answered that prayer already.

In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles and in the Gospel passage from John, we read of astonishing events that called cowering disciples to step out of hiding and proclaim news that would condemn them and change the world forever! In the second reading Paul's words reach out into the future to us: "we were all given to drink of one Spirit"

(1 Corinthians 12:13).

It is our task to truly pray today's psalm response. Let us together beg the Holy Spirit to renew the earth by renewing the Church, sending many more men and women to serve in its various ministries.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The roots of today's "birthday of the Church" are in an ancient Jewish festival of springtime harvest, seven weeks after Passover. Now, seven weeks after Easter, our great fifty days of rejoicing come to an end. In the countries where the Church first came to life, this is a time of harvest, and the first fruits appear: apricots and lemons, cherries and strawberries. Even in our gardens, herbs are abundant and asparagus, that close relation of the Easter lily, comes fresh to our tables. The earth is laden with so much new life, and that has always been a sign to Christians of Easter's glory.

Pentecost means "fifty" and our fifty days of Easter joy are complete. This Sunday is a day to savor the glory of Easter once more: picnics and cookouts, walks by the water, time in the garden—are all ways of extending the feast.

Notice the paschal candle today, still burning during Mass. Our Easter celebration now complete, the candle will soon be moved to a place near the baptismal font, and be lighted at baptisms and funerals as a silent witness to Christ's abiding presence.

African American History & Heritage

May 23rd: Major General Frederic E. Davidson, 1st African-American to lead an army division - 1972.

Saints of the Week

Tuesday, May 25th: (1)Saint Bede the Venerable, Priest, Doctor of the Church; died 735 at age 63; born in Northumbria; called "Venerable" while still living; authored the *Ecclesiastical History of the English People* and wrote Scriptural expositions, commentaries, and homilies; known as the "Father of English history".

(2)Saint Gregory VII, Pope; died 1085 at age 65; from Tuscany; championed reform of the clergy against simony, clerical marriage, and lay investiture, leading to the excommunication of Henry IV; expanded the authority of the Roman See.

(3)Saint Mary Magdalene de'Pazzi, Virgin: died 1607 at age 41; Carmelite mystic of Florence who led a hidden life of prayer and self-denial, praying particularly for the renewal of the Church and encouraging her fellow sisters in holiness; instrumental in the reform of her Order.

Wednesday, May 26th: Saint Philip Neri, Priest; died 1595 at age 80; founded (1575) the Congregation of Priests of the Oratory, today numbering about 570 members, to promote holiness of priestly life and foster effective preaching; noted for his joyful and simple spirit, and his use of short, wise maxims; known as the "Apostle of Rome" and "Reformer of the Eternal City".

Thursday, May 27th: Saint Augustine of Canterbury, Bishop; died 26 May 604 at age 70; monk of Mt. Coelius in Rome; sent with forty other monks by Pope Gregory I to England; baptized Ethelbert, king of Kent; ordained a bishop in 597; established the Sees of Canterbury, London, and Rochester; in 601, received the pallium as Primate of England.

Saturday, May 29th: Saint Paul VI, Pope; (Giovanni Battista Montini) was born 26 September 1897 in Concessio, Italy. Soon after his ordination in 1920, he began his service to Popes Pius XI and Pius XII. During World War II, he worked to find shelter for persecuted Jews and refugees. Appointed Archbishop of Milan (1954), he worked with great care for the diocese. Four years later, he was elected a Cardinal by Pope John XXIII, and, following his death, was elected to the See of Peter on 21 June 1963. Immediately continuing the work begun by his predecessors, he brought the Second Vatican Council to its completion and begun many initiatives that showed his solicitude for the Church and the contemporary world. He exercised his Supreme Magisterium favoring peace, promoting the progress of peoples, the inculcation of the faith, ecumenism, and liturgical reform. By his authority he promulgated the Calendar, the Missal, the Liturgy of the Hours, the Pontifical, and nearly all of the Ritual for the Roman Rite. He died at Castel Gandolfo on 6 August 1978. His feast day is the anniversary of his ordination to the priesthood (1920).

Este monje había profetizado que estaba por llegar una época del Espíritu Santo en la cual se viviría por fin una Utopía o sea el Reino de Dios. Muchos de los primeros franciscanos adoptaron sus ideas pero lamentablemente el joaquinismo, poco a poco, se transformó en herejía por su extrema crítica a los Sacramentos y la jerarquía.

Al pasar de casi tres siglos los frailes franciscanos que llegaron a nuestro continente vinieron con la idea de inaugurar la Iglesia del Espíritu Santo, la cual reformaría los errores y las debilidades de la vieja Iglesia Europea. Esta Iglesia también sería la que defendería al nativo y al mestizo de los abusos del Conquistador. Este sueño de Utopía, se quedó en sueño pero, es un sueño que continúa en el pueblo latino y su devoción al Espíritu Santo de la Santísima Trinidad.
