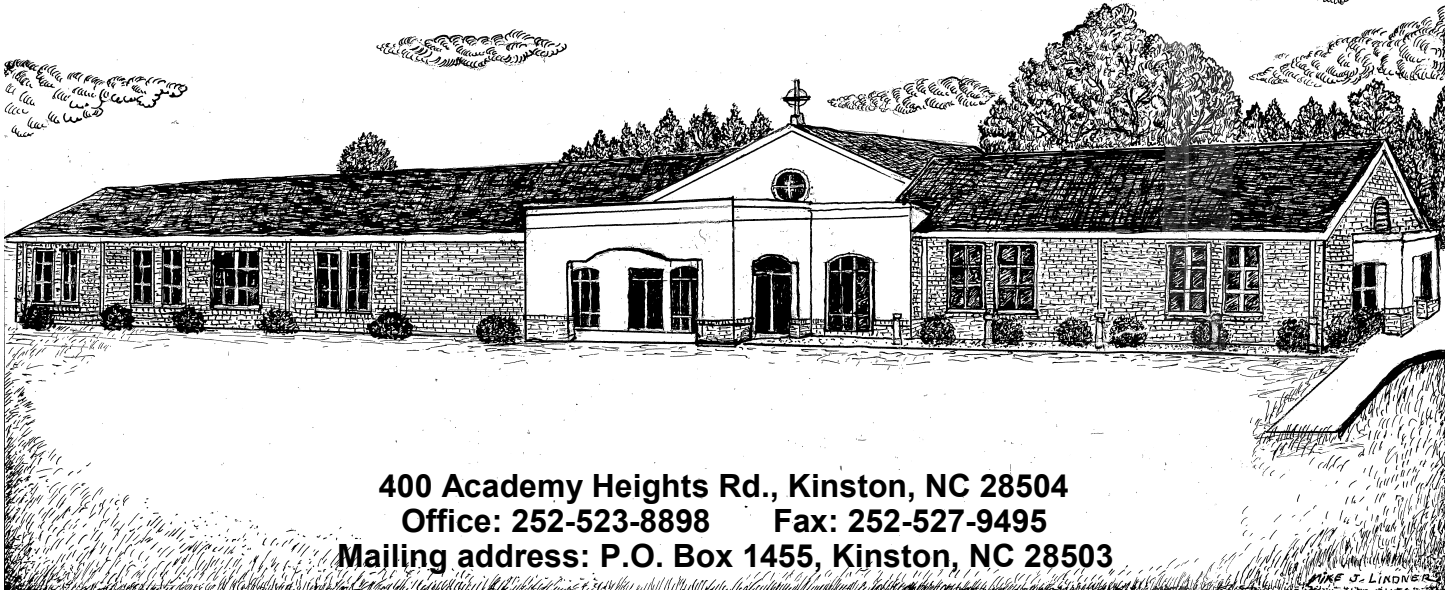

DISCIPLESHIP'S COSTS

In today's first reading, God tells the prophet Elijah to prepare Elisha to succeed him. Succeeding Elijah will be no easy task; he has spent his life facing threats from the kings he has confronted about their infidelity to the God of Israel. The psalm illustrates the emotional and spiritual distress that the prophets' steadfast faithfulness to God brought them. Paul's description of the Christian's freedom from the law as opposed to "the desire of the flesh" puts this struggle at the very heart of Christian identity. The reading from Luke's Gospel recounts Jesus' decision to journey toward Jerusalem, where he knows he will meet his earthly fate. Following Jesus—like succeeding Elijah as prophet—will now become more difficult. Unlike his calls to the first disciples, Jesus encounters those who are not ready or are not strong enough to journey with him.

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TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — The LORD tells Elijah to anoint Elisha as prophet to succeed him (1 Kings 19:16b, 19-21).

Psalms — You are my inheritance, O Lord (Psalm 16).

Second Reading — Use your freedom in Christ to serve one another through love (Galatians 5:1, 13-18).

Gospel — While journeying to Jerusalem, Jesus speaks of the costs of discipleship (Luke 9:51-62).

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The pilgrim experience of going by foot to Santiago de Compostella, the shrine of St. James, reaches its high point a month from now at the feast of the Apostle. By now, tens of thousands of pilgrims are already on the road. Typically, they cover twelve to twenty miles a day through rough territory. The difficult journey and the often primitive lodging facilities are made bearable by the joy of the pilgrims, their songs and prayers. When their journey is documented properly, they receive the scallop shell, a reminder not only of James the fisherman, but also his call to fish for human beings and to baptize the nations. In the Middle Ages, those who wore this badge on their hats were granted lodging and hospitality wherever they went. Next to the palm, the sign of a Jerusalem pilgrim, the scallop shell was most highly prized.

In the Middle Ages, some people so enjoyed the pilgrim road, although it was filled with discomfort and danger, that they spent most of their lives on the road. Today, some people take up the route for exercise, but are drawn gradually into the spirituality of the journey. As you make your summer travels, always fold in an element of pilgrimage: a long walk through beautiful countryside, a visit to a church, a prayer of gratitude for your journey through life's hills and valleys.

Out of the fire...

The church for St. Thomas Anglican Parish on Fifth Ave. in New York burned down in 1905. This was a "carriage trade" parish, which drew some of New York City's wealthiest people, including Vanderbilts and the Fargos.

Anxious to rebuild, the people had raise about \$1.5 million (almost \$20 million in today's dollars) which was enough money for a new church when, on Apr. 18, 1906, San Francisco had the great earthquake and fire.

The parish (which had a long tradition of assisting the city's growing number of immigrant families, as well as working mothers and the poor) didn't hesitate. Church records don't indicate how much money the parish gave to the earthquake victims, but a New York newspaper in reporting the donation called it "a considerable amount."

Public response to St. Thomas' generosity was forthcoming. Eventually, the parish raised its \$1.5 million and was able to build the new church. The cornerstone for this structure, which still stands today, was laid in 1911.

Parish historians note that in the midst of the shock over the destruction of their own church, the congregation stepped forward to help others in greater need.



Saints of the Week

Monday, June 27th: St. Cyril of Alexandria, Bishop, Doctor of the Church; died 444; defended Mary as ("God-bearer") at the Council of Ephesus (431) against the Nestorians; spokesman for orthodoxy; noted especially for his Christological formulations; supported growth of Egyptian monasticism.

Tuesday, June 28th: Saint Irenaeus, Bishop, Martyr; died in the year 202 at age 72; from Smyrna; disciple of Polycarp; for twenty-five years the bishop of Lyons; wrote against the Gnostics, first to provide a coherent rationale for a Christian Bible including both testaments, and the first to offer a comprehensive account of belief in God's universal providential and redemptive economy.

Wednesday, June 29th: (1) Saint Peter, Apostle; died in the year 64 in Rome under Nero; Galilean fisherman; spokesman for the Twelve who became "Prince of the Apostles"; two epistles are ascribed to him; patron of those in the fishing industry; principal patron of Rome and mentioned in the Roman Canon.

(2) Saint Paul, Apostle; according to tradition, was martyred in Rome in the year 67; Pharisee who became the "Apostle of the Gentiles"; his letters may be dated from century 50-65; patron of the lay apostolate, the Cursillo Movement and Catholic Action; also of Malta and Greece, principal patron of Rome and mentioned in the Roman Canon.

Thursday, June 30th: The First Martyrs of the Holy Roman Church; those many Christians who were tortured, crucified, and burned alive in the year 64 in Nero's garden on the Vatican Hill are honored today. Both the pagan writer Tacitus, in his Annales, and Pope St. Clement I, in his letter to the Corinthians, testify to these events.

Friday, July 1st: Saint Junípero Serra, Priest; died 1784 at age 70; from Petra, Majorca, Spain; missionary who arrived in New Spain in 1750; established nine of the California missions; baptized over 6,000 native peoples; recognized as the builder of the state of California; "an exemplary model of the selfless evangelizer" (Pope John Paul II).

EL VALOR DEL DISCIPULADO

En la primera lectura de hoy, Dios le dice al profeta Elías que prepare a Eliseo para que sea su sucesor. Ser sucesor de Elías no será una tarea fácil, él ha pasado su vida enfrentado las amenazas de los reyes a los que ha confrontado por sus infidelidades al Dios de Israel. El salmo ilustra la angustia emocional y espiritual que la firme fidelidad de los profetas a Dios les produjo. La descripción de Pablo de la libertad del cristiano frente a la ley en contraposición al “deseo de la carne” pone esta lucha en el corazón mismo de la identidad cristiana. La lectura del Evangelio de Lucas relata la decisión de Jesús de viajar a Jerusalén, donde él sabe que encontrará su destino terrenal. Seguir a Jesús, así como suceder a Elías como profeta, será menos fácil. A diferencia de sus llamadas a los primeros discípulos, Jesús se encuentra con aquellos que no están preparados o no son lo suficientemente fuertes para viajar con él.

Summer Safety Tips

With school out and Summer well under way, everyone will be making Summer plans with their family, but in order to keep everything fun and safe we have listed below some tips to keep in mind: **(1)**The hottest part of the day is between 10:00am-4:00pm. If you are out during these hours, please be sure to take precautions. Stay in the shade as much as possible, cover up, stay hydrated, and use proper sunscreen practices! **(2)**With the summer heat, it is important to stay hydrated. Children and adults should drink often if they are outside, or supplement fluid intake with water rich fruits like grapes, watermelons, and citrus fruits. Remember you are already dehydrated if you are thirsty so be proactive. **(3)**Fun in the water is a staple of summer, but it makes sunscreen less effective. Sunscreen should be reapplied each hour during water activities to maintain effectiveness. For dry activities apply every two hours. **(4)**The CDC website has in depth information for summer safety and more, so check it out!

Seguridad de Verano

Con la escuela en vacaciones y el verano bien encaminado, todos harán planes de verano con su familia, pero a fin de mantener todo divertido y seguro, hemos enumerado a continuación algunos consejos para tener en cuenta: **(1)**Las horas más calurosas del día son entre las 10:00 a.m. a las 4:00 p.m. Si está fuera durante estas horas, asegúrese de tomar precauciones. ¡Permanezca en la sombra todo lo posible, cúbrase, manténgase hidratado y use las prácticas adecuadas de protección solar! **(2)**Durante del verano, es muy importante mantenerse hidratado. Los niños y adultos deben beber con frecuencia si están afuera, o comer las frutas ricas en agua como uvas, sandías y frutas cítricas. Recuerde que ya está deshidratado si tiene sed, así que sea proactivo. **(3)**Jugar en el agua es divertido en verano, pero hace que la protección solar sea menos efectiva. El protector solar se debe volver a aplicar cada hora durante las actividades acuáticas para mantener la efectividad. Para actividades secas aplicar cada dos horas. **(4)**El sitio web de los CDC tiene información detallada sobre seguridad en el verano y más, ¡así que échale un vistazo!
