



JESUS' EXAMPLE OF HELPING OTHERS

In today's second reading Paul offers a wonderful argument to his converts at Corinth for seeking to help those in need. He is dealing with a practical problem, arranging a collection for the poor of the church of Jerusalem; but as he often does, he develops an important teaching about Jesus to make his point.

After asking that they show their faith by generous gifts, he reminds them of the "gracious act of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, for your sake he became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich" (2 Corinthians 8:9). In the Incarnation our Lord assumed our human nature, certainly becoming poor for one who is God. The ultimate gracious act of this poverty was going to the cross with all its terrible sufferings. By this act of poverty we definitely become rich. Now our sins can be forgiven; we can share in the very life of God through the sacraments; we can attain eternal salvation!

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

As Independence Day draws near, we think of the men and women of the military who serve with courage and competence, some far from home. How does the Church accompany them? In 1939, Pope Pius XII created an independent jurisdiction of the Catholic Church called the "Military Vicariate." In 1985 Pope John Paul II created the "Archdiocese for Military Services, USA." Spanning the globe and serving nearly one and a half million Roman Catholics, more than one thousand priests minister in hospitals, on military bases of all the armed forces, on ships at sea, and on the battlefield. The AMS does not ordain priests, but accepts priests on loan from religious orders and dioceses.

In 1824 a Jesuit priest named Adam Marshall enlisted in the Navy and died at sea in 1825. He was assigned as a "schoolmaster," but he sought out and ministered to Catholic sailors. Twenty years later, President Polk was worried that the war with Mexico was seen as anti-Catholic, so he recruited two Jesuit priests to serve in the army as chaplains. At the time of the Civil War, only about ten percent of Americans were Catholic. Military policies forced Catholic soldiers to attend Protestant services. The Church protested this rule, and many priests volunteered to become chaplains. Their witness and the courage of the "Nuns of the Battlefield" (several orders of sisters who assisted Civil War victims) helped temper prejudice against Catholics and pave the way for the life and ministry of this vigorous and unique archdiocese.

Saints of the Week

Monday, June 28th: Saint Irenaeus, Bishop, Martyr; died in the year 202 at age 72; from Smyrna; disciple of Polycarp; for twenty-five years the bishop of Lyons; wrote against the Gnostics, first to provide a coherent rationale for a Christian Bible including both testaments, and the first to offer a comprehensive account of belief in God's universal providential and redemptive economy.


Tuesday, June 29th: (1) Saint Peter, Apostle; died in the year 64 in Rome under Nero; Galilean fisherman; spokesman for the Twelve who became "Prince of the Apostles"; two epistles are ascribed to him; patron of those in the fishing industry.

(2) Saint Paul, Apostle; according to tradition, was martyred in Rome in the year 67; Pharisee who became the "Apostle of the Gentiles"; patron of the lay apostolate, the Cursillo Movement.

Wednesday, June 30th: The First Martyrs of the Holy Roman Church; those many Christians who were tortured, crucified, and burned alive in the year 64 in Nero's garden on the Vatican Hill are honored today. Both the pagan writer Tacitus, in his Annales, and Pope St. Clement I, in his letter to the Corinthians, testify to these events.

Thursday, July 1st: Saint Junipero Serra, Priest; died 1784 at age 70; from Petra, Majorca, Spain; missionary who arrived in New Spain in 1750; established nine of the California missions; baptized over 6,000 native peoples; recognized as the builder of the state of California; "an exemplary model of the selfless evangelizer" (Pope John Paul II).

Saturday, July 3rd: Saint Thomas, Apostle; his doubting gave way to faith when he saw the risen Lord; associated with founding the Church in south India; patron of builders, India and Pakistan.

El último acto de gracia de esta pobreza fue subir a la cruz y sus terribles sufrimientos. Con este acto de pobreza sin duda nos hemos hecho ricos. Ahora nuestros pecados pueden ser perdonados; podemos compartir la vida de Dios por medio de los sacramentos; ¡podemos alcanzar la salvación eterna!

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Esta semana conmemoramos al apóstol santo Tomás, el cual es normalmente recordado por haber dudado de la resurrección de Jesucristo. La incredulidad de este santo es explicada en el Evangelio según San Juan (20:19-31) con la famosa frase: “Si no veo en sus manos la señal de los clavos y no meto mi dedo en el agujero de los clavos y no meto mi mano en su costado, no creeré.”

Los latinos somos de culturas religiosas que consideran la incredulidad como algo pecaminoso y camino al ateísmo. Hay que aceptar que la duda es algo normal en el ser humano. Dudo que exista alguien que nunca haya dudado de su fe. Sólo al aceptar esta duda estaremos abiertos a la invitación de Jesús: “Acerca aquí tu dedo y mira mis manos; trae tu mano y métela en mi costado, y no seas incrédulo sino creyente.” Santo Tomás aceptó esta invitación y llegó a su gran proclamación de fe: “Señor mío, y Dios mío”. La duda no es mala, para muchos es el camino a una fe más profunda y a un compromiso mayor.

Summer Safety Tips

With school out and Summer well under way, everyone will be making Summer plans with their family, but in order to keep everything fun and safe we have listed below some tips to keep in mind: **(1)**The hottest part of the day is between 10:00am-4:00pm. If you are out during these hours, please be sure to take precautions. Stay in the shade as much as possible, cover up, stay hydrated, and use proper sunscreen practices! **(2)**With the summer heat, it is important to stay hydrated. Children and adults should drink often if they are outside, or supplement fluid intake with water rich fruits like grapes, watermelons, and citrus fruits. Remember you are already dehydrated if you are thirsty so be proactive. **(3)**Fun in the water is a staple of summer, but it makes sunscreen less effective. Sunscreen should be reapplied each hour during water activities to maintain effectiveness. For dry activities apply every two hours. **(4)**The CDC website has in depth information for summer safety and more, so check it out!

Seguridad de Verano

Con la escuela en vacaciones y el verano bien encaminado, todos harán planes de verano con su familia, pero a fin de mantener todo divertido y seguro, hemos enumerado a continuación algunos consejos para tener en cuenta: **(1)**Las horas más calurosas del día son entre las 10:00 a.m. a 4:00 p.m. Si está fuera durante estas horas, asegúrese de tomar precauciones. ¡Permanezca en la sombra todo lo posible, cúbrase, manténgase hidratado y use las prácticas adecuadas de protección solar! **(2)**Durante del verano, es muy importante mantenerse hidratado. Los niños y adultos deben beber con frecuencia si están afuera, o comer la frutas ricas en agua como uvas, sandías y frutas cítricas. Recuerde que ya está deshidratado si tiene sed, así que sea proactivo. **(3)**Jugar en el agua es divertido en verano, pero hace que la protección solar sea menos efectiva. El protector solar se debe volver a aplicar cada hora durante las actividades acuáticas para mantener la efectividad. Para actividades secas aplicar cada dos horas. **(4)**El sitio web de los CDC tiene información detallada sobre seguridad en el verano y más, ¡así que échale un vistazo!
