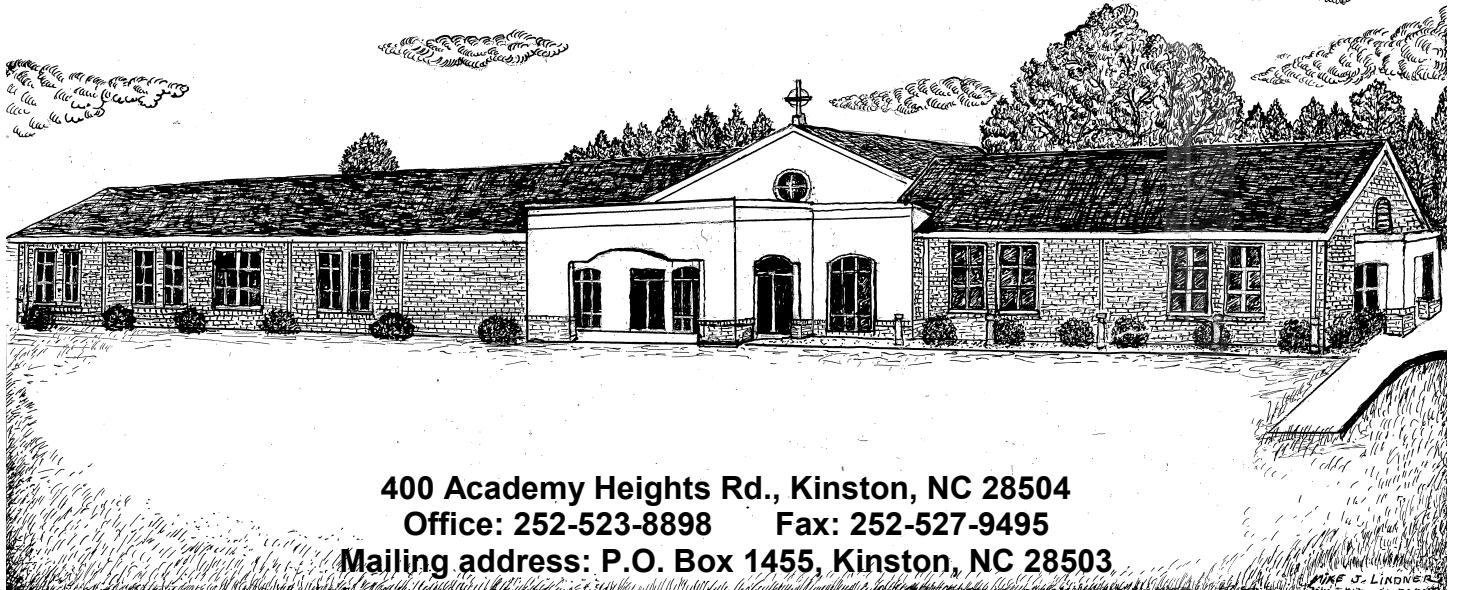

**Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time**  
**RADICAL TRANSFORMATION**

On this Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, the readings describe anything but an ordinary time. They are disturbing and they leave us disturbed. The Old Testament reading recounts a young man's radical break with the past to follow a new path. The Gospel describes how life as we know it is abruptly changed if we follow the call of Christ. The psalm and Paul assure us that such life-altering change is possible only because of the power of God's love. We are presented with a stark choice. To love as God loves, we must leave our old lives behind. We must leave behind not just the bad, the selfish, and the evil but the ordinary, our daily work, and the important, our families, our lives. Loving as God loves requires a radical transformation, not a smooth transition.

**TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**

Processions are life's journey distilled. We move with companions, aware that Christ accompanies us, as we move to the altar for Communion or to the font for baptism, or carry a loved one to a place of rest. In Europe, the season of pilgrimage is beginning now, and tens of thousands of people are moving by foot on well-worn paths. Some take as long as six weeks to walk the last few hundred miles of the medieval pilgrimage route to the Shrine of St. James the Apostle in Compostella, in northern Spain.

Those who make the journey by foot, hiking, or by bicycle, have a kind of passport stamped at villages and monasteries on the road. When they present this document at the cathedral, they are given the emblem of a pilgrim, the scallop shell of St. James. High over their heads at Mass, a huge *botafumero* twirls clouds of sweet incense through the cathedral. Cynics say it is to mask the odor of smelly feet. The pilgrims know better. Seeing through the clouds the happy faces of those they met along the road, they recognize a foretaste of the welcome into heaven, and the joy of meeting loved ones in the Kingdom of God.

## African American History & Heritage

**July 2nd:** President Lyndon B. Johnson signs the Civil Rights Act into law - 1964

**July 3rd:** First Black baseball player in the major leagues, Jackie Robinson, named to Baseball Hall of Fame-1962

**July 5th:** Arthur Ashe becomes 1st African-American male to win Wimbledon after defeating Jimmie Connors - 1975

**July 6th:** Althea Gibson becomes 1st African-American to win a championship at Wimbledon - 1957

## Saints of the Week

**Monday, July 1st:** Saint Junípero Serra, Priest; died 1784 at age 70; from Petra, Majorca, Spain; missionary who arrived in New Spain in 1750; established nine of the California missions; baptized over 6,000 native peoples; recognized as the builder of the state of California; “an exemplary model of the selfless evangelizer” (Pope John Paul II).

**Wednesday, July 3rd:** Saint Thomas, Apostle; his doubting gave way to faith when he saw the risen Lord; associated with founding the Church in south India; patron of builders, India and Pakistan.

**Friday, July 5th: (1)** Saint Anthony Zaccaria, Priest; died 1539 at Cremona at age thirty-six; doctor turned priest; popular preacher who founded in Milan the Clerics Regular of St. Paul for the reform of society; today they number some 375 members; sought collaboration between the clergy and the laity; promoted frequent communion.

**(2)** Saint Elizabeth of Portugal; died 1336 at age 65; named after her great-aunt, St. Elizabeth of Hungary (died 1231); queen and mother; lover of the poor; peacemaker in the royal family; later a Franciscan tertiary; patroness of Catholic charities.

**Saturday, July 6th:** Saint Maria Goretti, Virgin, Martyr; died 1902 at age twelve; born near Ancona; she was stabbed to death, preferring to die than to be raped; with her mother present, she was canonized in 1950 before the largest crowd ever assembled in Rome for a canonization; patroness of teenage girls.

La lectura del Antiguo Testamento cuenta acerca de un joven que rompió radicalmente con el pasado para seguir un nuevo camino. El Evangelio describe cómo repentinamente cambia la vida que conocemos si seguimos la llamada de Cristo. El Salmo y Pablo nos aseguran que ese cambio de vida es posible solo a causa del poder del amor de Dios. Se nos presenta una dura elección. Para amar como Dios ama, debemos dejar atrás a nuestras vidas antiguas. Debemos dejar atrás no solo lo malo, el egoísmo y el mal sino lo ordinario, nuestro trabajo diario y lo importante, nuestras familias, nuestras vidas. Amar con Dios ama requiere una transformación radical, no una transición tranquila.

Allí él les contó su vida pecaminosa y su deseo de encontrar un Miserere (Salmo 51) digno de expiar sus pecados ante Dios. El músico afanado por encontrar su Miserere, corrió a la montaña donde escuchó aquel lamentoso y bello canto.
