





Indoor Liturgy Tips

1. Face Masks- I am not here to offend anyone. I respectfully ask that everyone who enters this place of worship wear a face mask (except infants 24 months or younger). We wear masks not only to protect ourselves, but more so out of consideration for others; so that vulnerable populations are not exposed to dangers we may not even be aware of having and sharing.

2. Books- We do not guarantee that the books have been disinfected. Be prepared before the Mass by finding the readings in your own books or on cell phones. The message board in the atrium has the current readings and homilies posted on them for your viewing. Feel free to take pictures of the pages with your cell phone as you come in. Cell phones may be used during Mass in order to follow the readings. Keep phones in silent mode.

3. Singing- Because singing produces more airborne droplets than speaking, we do not recommend singing. The Cantor will sing for us.

4. Sitting in the Pews- If you are the first to go in a pew, go to the outside end of the pew (by the windows) or go to the inside end of the pew (by the center aisle). Please sit three feet from the end of the center aisle inside end. The reason for the three feet is to ensure that social distancing requirements are met when the communion procession takes place. If you are not the first to go in the pew please enter through the end of the pew where no one is seated. This will maintain social distancing from those already in the pew (this step requires a trip around the pews). Sit six feet apart from individuals and family units. The marked squares on the floor are one square foot.

5. Holy Communion- The process of reception of Holy Communion will be different than usual. One half of the church will proceed first then the other half. The half on the side with the piano will proceed first. Please keep six feet apart during procession. An adult arm length is about two and a half feet for referencing distance. There will be one communion station for those in the atrium.

6. Parish Donations- Two boxes are located in the atrium for the two collections. Feel free to deposit your envelopes in them.

June 11th: University of Alabama is forced to desegregate and enrolls its first two African-American students, Vivian Malone and James A. Hood - 1963



June 13th: Thurgood Marshall, 1st African-American to be nominated to a seat on the U.S. Supreme Court - 1967

Saints of the Week

Tuesday, June 9th: Saint Ephrem, deacon, Doctor of the Church; died 373 at age 67; Syrian theologian and poet who authored biblical commentaries, homilies, and composed many hymns still used today by the Syriac liturgy; founded a theological school at Nisbis; lived in Edessa (in Mesopotamia); known as the “harp of the Spirit”.

Thursday, June 11th: Saint Barnabas, Apostle; died 1st century; preached the gospel in Antioch; companion of St. Paul; attended the Council of Jerusalem; martyred on, and patron of, the island of his birth, Cyprus.

Saturday, June 13th: Saint Anthony of Padua, Priest, Doctor of the Church; died 1231 at age of 36; from Lisbon; devoted student of Scripture; first friar to teach theology to his fellow friars; gifted orator and preacher; known as the “Evangelical Doctor”; patron saint of Portugal, of the poor, of harvests, and lost articles.

The Great Shema

The Shema was and still is the central prayer and confession of faith for Jews. Its full form includes three biblical passages: Deut 6:4-9; 11:13-21; and Num 15:37-41. In fidelity to Deut 6:7 devout Jews recite the Shema every morning and evening. Jewish homes usually have a mezuzah, a little box containing the Shema inscribed on parchment, affixed to the doorpost (see Deut 6:9). Orthodox Jewish men (and sometimes women) wear tefillin (or phylacteries), leather boxes containing the Shema, on their head and hand during prayer (Deut 6:8).

Jesus' emphatic affirmation of the Shema shows that he did not come to reject or overturn Judaism, but to fulfill it. The New Testament never views the proclamation of Christ's divinity as contrary to the Old Testament revelation that God is one. Rather it is a disclosure of God's innermost mystery as a communion of Persons. "We do not confess three Gods, but one God in three persons" (Catechism, 253).

Consejos de Liturgia en Interiores

1. Mascarillas: no estoy aquí para ofender a nadie. Respetuosamente pido que todos los que ingresen a este lugar de culto usen una máscara facial (excepto infantes menores de 24 meses). Llevamos máscaras no solo para protegernos, sino también por consideración a los demás; para que las poblaciones vulnerables no estén expuestas a peligros que ni siquiera podemos ser conscientes de tener y compartir.

2. Libros: no garantizamos que los libros hayan sido desinfectados. Prepárese antes de la Misa encontrando las lecturas en sus propios libros o en teléfonos celulares. El tablero de mensajes en el atrio tiene las lecturas y homilías actuales publicadas en ellos para su visualización. No dude en tomar fotografías de las páginas con su teléfono celular cuando entre. Los teléfonos celulares se pueden usar durante la misa para seguir las lecturas. Mantenga los teléfonos en modo silencioso.

3. Cantar: debido a que el canto produce más gotas en el aire que el hablar, no recomendamos cantar. El cantor cantará para nosotros.

4. Sentado en las bancas: si usted es el primero en entrar en una banca, vaya al extremo exterior de la banca (junto a las ventanas) o al extremo interior de la banca (junto al pasillo central). Siéntese a tres pies (un metro) del extremo del pasillo central. La razón de los tres pies es garantizar que se cumplan los requisitos de distanciamiento social cuando se realiza la procesión de comunión. Si no es el primero en entrar a la banca, ingrese hasta el final de la banca donde nadie está sentado. Esto mantendrá el distanciamiento social de los que ya están en la banca (Este paso requiere que uno dé la vuelta completa alrededor de las bancas). Siéntese a seis pies (2 metros) de distancia de las personas y las unidades familiares. Los cuadrados marcados en el piso son de un pie cuadrado.

5. Sagrada Comunión: el proceso de recepción de la Sagrada Comunión será diferente de lo habitual. La mitad de la iglesia procederá primero y luego la otra mitad. La mitad del lado con el piano procederá primero. Por favor manténgase a seis pies de distancia durante la procesión. La longitud del brazo de un adulto es de aproximadamente dos pies y medio para hacer referencia a la distancia. Habrá una estación de comunión para aquellos en el atrio.

6. Donaciones para la parroquia: dos cajas se encuentran en el atrio para las dos colectas. No dude en depositar sus sobres en ellas.
