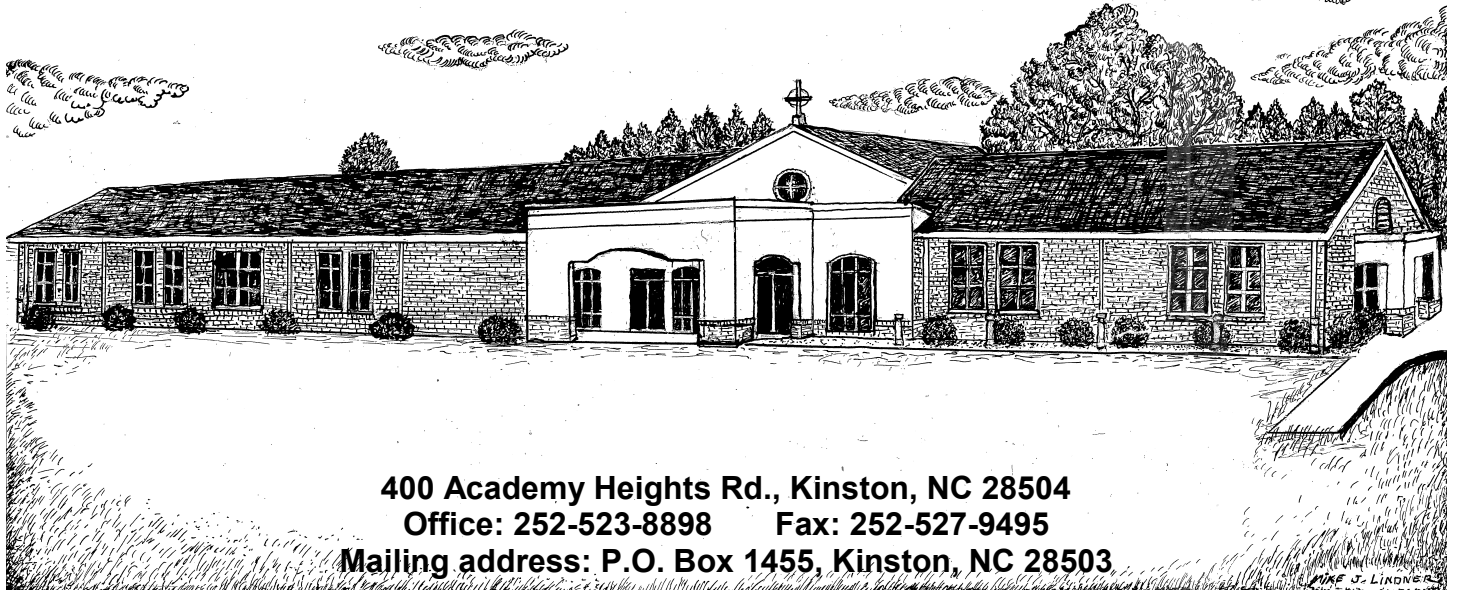

GOD WANTS TO BE KNOWN

The Old Testament reading from Deuteronomy praises God for inscribing the commandments in our very bodies. God's law is not distant or foreign, but a natural part of us. In his letter to the Colossians, Saint Paul echoes Moses, praising God for becoming one of us. The truly human, flesh-and-blood Jesus reminds us that God always wants to be recognizable and familiar to us. Jesus, who is also truly God, wants to be on intimate terms with each of us.

God's passionate desire to be known by us is almost too wonderful to take in. Luke's Gospel helps us understand how to respond. The Good Samaritan parable provides practical advice for those who believe in God's intimate love for them and want to share that love with others.

**Our Lady of Mount Carmel
July 16th**

This is the patronal feast of the Carmelites. The Order of Carmelites takes its name from Mount Carmel, which was the first place dedicated to the Blessed Virgin and where a chapel was erected in honor before her Assumption into heaven.

July 16 is also the feast of the "Scapular of Mount Carmel." On that day in 1251, pious tradition says, the Blessed Virgin appeared to St. Simon Stock, General of the Carmelites at Cambridge, England, showed him the scapular and promised supernatural favors and her special protection to his Order and to all persons who would wear her scapular.

To obtain the indulgences and other benefits promised to those who wear the Carmelite scapular, a person must be invested by a priest who has the requisite faculties and must lead a consistent Christian life.

African American History & Heritage

July 16th: In Paris, jazz trumpeter Miles Davis was named a Knight in the (French) Legion of Honor, one of that nation's highest cultural honors.-1991

July 19th: Forerunner of the National Dental Association for African American dentists in the U.S., the Tri-Sate Dental Association is formed.-1913

July 20th: The 14th Amendment, validating citizenship rights for all persons born or naturalized in the U.S., was ratified.-1868

Saints of the Week

Monday, July 15th: Saint Bonaventure, Bishop, Doctor of the Church; died 1274 at age 53; minister general of the Franciscan Order for seventeen years; Cardinal Bishop of Albano; authored biblical commentaries and many ascetical and spiritual treatises; known as the "Seraphic Doctor."

Tuesday, July 16th: Our Lady of Mount Carmel; the scriptures speak of the beauty of Mount Carmel in Galilee where the prophet Elijah defended the faith of Israel in the living God. There, at the beginning of the 13th century, under the title of "St. Mary of Mount Carmel," the Order of Carmelites (today numbering about 1,975 religious) had its formal beginning.



Thursday, July 18th: Saint Camillus de Lellis, Priest; died 1614 at Rome at age 64; born at Chieti in the Abruzzi in 1550; soldier addicted to gambling; his conversion led him to found (1582) a society (Camillians), today numbering 1,120 religious, which established hospitals and cared for the sick with affection and diligence; patron of nurses, of the sick, and of hospitals.

Saturday, July 20th: Saint Apollinaris, Bishop, Martyr; died 1st century; early accounts report that he was ordained bishop by St. Peter himself and sent as a missionary bishop to Ravenna during the reign (41-54 AD) of the emperor Claudius. Renowned for his power to heal in the name of Christ, he was frequently exiled, tortured, and imprisoned for the faith, and finally, martyred.

Diocesan Grant for Office Flooring

The Diocese of Raleigh has recently awarded the parish with a grant (amount of \$5,000) for the replacement of the parish office and parlor's room flooring. The office carpet will be replaced first. Plans are underway to accomplish this project in August (hopefully before Faith Formation classes will start).

Evangelio — Ser un vecino, mostrar amor tratando a otros con misericordia (Lucas 10:25-37).

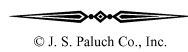

Nuestra Señora del Monte Carmel 16 de Julio

Esta es la fiesta patronal de los carmelitas. La Orden de los Carmelitas toma su nombre del Monte Carmelo, que fue el primer lugar dedicado a la Santísima Virgen y donde se erigió una capilla en honor antes de su Asunción al cielo.

El 16 de julio es también la fiesta del “Escapulario del Monte Carmelo”. Ese día, en 1251, según la tradición piadosa, la Santísima Virgen se apareció a San Simón Stock, General de los Carmelitas en Cambridge, Inglaterra, le mostró el escapulario y prometió favores sobrenaturales y su protección especial para su Orden y para todas las personas que lo usarían como escapulario.

Para obtener las indulgencias y otros beneficios prometidos a quienes usan el escapulario carmelita, una persona debe ser investida por un sacerdote que tenga las facultades necesarias y debe llevar una vida cristiana coherente.
