

PRAYER AND SERVICE


How do we bring balance and joy to our lives of prayer and service to our loving God?

In the Gospel today, Jesus tells Martha that her concern about doing the right thing as dictated by Jewish tradition might not be the best use of her energies. Her sister, Mary, who sits in rapt attention at Jesus' feet, should not be rebuked. Is Jesus trying to show Martha that she needs to make time for her spiritual nourishment?

Abraham and Sarah in the first reading seem to be just like Martha. And yet Abraham's eager welcome and joyful serving of his "visitors" seems almost spiritual. How like Paul, in the second reading, rejoicing in his service to the gospel!

We hear in the psalm that those who do justice will live in the Lord's presence. Prayer and service—what greater joy could there be?

Second collections are optional. Parishioners are given this choice at the moment of passing the baskets.


Segunda Colecta del Siguiente Domingo

Saints of the Week

Wednesday, July 20th: Saint Apollinaris, Bishop, Martyr; died 1st century; early accounts report that he was ordained bishop by St. Peter himself and sent as a missionary bishop to Ravenna during the reign (41-54 AD) of the emperor Claudius. Renowned for his power to heal in the name of Christ, he was frequently exiled, tortured, and imprisoned for the faith, and finally, martyred.

Thursday, July 21st: Saint Lawrence of Brindisi, Priest, Doctor of the Church; died 1619 at age 60; Capuchin, linguist, military chaplain, diplomat, and minister general; learned exegete, forceful preacher, and controversialist; fifteen volumes of his writings are extant.

Friday, July 22nd: Saint Mary Magdalene; died 1st century; healed of possession; disciple of Jesus and present at his crucifixion; in Mark, the first to witness to the risen Lord (hence, called the “apostle of the Apostles”); almost universally agreed today that her being identified as the sinful woman of Lk 7:36-50 is unfounded; patroness of the Order of Preachers (the Dominicans).

Saturday, July 23rd: Saint Bridget, Religious; died 1373 in Rome at age 70; born in Sweden; mother of eight; mystic prophet and foundress of the Order of the Most Holy Savior (“Bridgettines”); sought to end the luxury and dissipation of the Avignon papacy and the return of the pope to Rome; her Revelations record her spiritual experiences and life; patroness of Sweden; together with St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross [Edith Stein] (9 Aug.) and St. Catherine of Siena (29 Apr.) declared copatroness of Europe by Pope John Paul II (1999).

African American History & Heritage

July 18th: The first African-American municipal judge in Clarksdale, Mississippi Carlos Moore removed the Mississippi flag from the court on his first day due to its display of a Confederacy emblem– 2017

July 19th: Forerunner of the National Dental Association for African American dentists in the U.S., the Tri-State Dental Association is formed-1913

July 20th: The 14th Amendment, validating citizenship rights for all persons born or naturalized in the U.S., was ratified-1868

July 21st: The National Association of Colored Women is established in Washington, DC- 1896

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

América es un continente nacido del mestizaje que tomó a los europeos, los indígenas y los africanos para engendrar algo nuevo. Normalmente pensamos en el mestizaje de sangre que produjo nuevas razas latinoamericanas. Pero también existe el mestizaje cultural que produce nuevos elementos latinoamericanos. Uno de estos es el sarape, hijo de la tilma pre-colombina y el manto español. Este mestizaje en tela tiene sus principios en el siglo XVIII con una proliferación de talleres en Zacatecas, Saltillo y otros lugares. Esta cobija colorida, de algodón o lana, fue desarrollada para añadir color y belleza a los charros de siglos pasados.


A través de la historia el sarape ha sido usado por vaqueros, jinetes, soldados y revolucionarios. Hoy día el sarape, jorongo, frazada, gabán o cobija se ha convertido en símbolo de tradición mexicana y se encuentra decorando hogares, restaurantes e iglesias. México no es el único país que ha desarrollado un mestizaje en tela, también Guatemala, Colombia, El Salvador y otros más tienen sus telas y tapetes particulares que mezclan los colores y los diseños para celebrar el talento y la creatividad del mestizaje latinoamericano.

Clases de Catecismo para Niños


