

Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time
A MINDSET OF SERVICE

There's a lot of traveling, delivering, and visiting going on in our readings today. In Genesis Abraham cares for the needs of three mysterious travelers. The psalm responds, celebrating the kind of righteousness that Abraham practices. Then, in his letter to the Colossians, Saint Paul describes his own ministry as almost like a delivery service: he, God's steward, brings the word of God to their community. Finally, Luke's Gospel shares the well-known story of Mary and Martha, and the different ways they welcome Jesus into their home. Amid all this coming and going, we are invited to pay attention to the ways we tend to the needs of others. Each of us can ask, *How am I present to God and others in my life?*

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TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — Abraham shows hospitality to three visitors (Genesis 18:1-10a).

Psalm — He who does justice will live in the presence of the Lord (Psalm 15).

Second Reading — The mystery hidden from generations past has been manifested; it is Christ in you, the hope for glory (Colossians 1:24-28).

Gospel — Jesus converses with Martha and Mary about service and contemplation (Luke 10:38-42).

4. Catechesis teaches the Christian how to pray with Christ.
5. Catechesis prepares the Christian to live in community and to participate actively in the life and mission of the Church.
6. Catechesis promotes a missionary spirit that prepares the faithful to be present as Christians in society.

Saints of the Week



St.
Mary Magdalene

Monday, July 22nd: Saint Mary Magdalene; died 1st century; healed of possession; disciple of Jesus and present at his crucifixion; in Mark, the first to witness to the risen Lord (hence, called the “apostle of the Apostles”); almost universally agreed today that her being identified as the sinful woman of Lk 7:36-50 is unfounded; patroness of the Order of Preachers (the Dominicans).

Tuesday, July 23rd: Saint Bridget, Religious; died 1373 in Rome at age 70; born in Sweden; mother of eight; mystic prophet and foundress of the Order of the Most Holy Savior (“Bridgettines”); sought to end the luxury and dissipation of the Avignon papacy and the return of the pope to Rome; her Revelations record her spiritual experiences and life; patroness of Sweden; together with St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross [Edith Stein] (9 Aug.) and St. Catherine of Siena (29 Apr.) declared copatroness of Europe by Pope John Paul II (1999).

Wednesday July 24th: Saint Sharbel Makhluf, Priest; died 1898 at age 70; born in 1828 in a small mountain village in north Lebanon, he became a monk of the Maronite Rite and was ordained a priest in 1859. Devote to the Blessed Virgin Mary, he spent the last twenty-three years of his life as a hermit. Despite temptations to wealth and comfort, Sharbel taught the value of poverty, self-sacrifice, and prayer by the life he lived. He possessed the gift of performing miracles even during his lifetime. His tomb at the monastery of St. Maron in Annaya, Lebanon, is a place of pilgrimage.

Thursday, July 25th: Saint James, Apostle; brother of John, is called “the Greater” because he followed Christ before the other apostle of the same name; first of the Twelve to be martyred, being decapitated by order of Herod Agrippa I, venerated at Compostella, Spain; patron of pilgrims, of Spain, Guatemala, and Nicaragua.

Friday, July 26th: Saints Joachim and Anne, Parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary; names for the parents of Mary found in the 2nd century *Protoevangelium of James*; Anne is the patroness of childless women and miners.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

América es un continente nacido del mestizaje que tomó a los europeos, los indígenas y los africanos para engendrar algo nuevo. Normalmente pensamos en el mestizaje de sangre que produjo nuevas razas latinoamericanas. Pero también existe el mestizaje cultural que produce nuevos elementos latinoamericanos. Uno de estos es el sarape, hijo de la tilma pre-colombina y el manto español. Este mestizaje en tela tiene sus principios en el siglo XVIII con una proliferación de talleres en Zacatecas, Saltillo y otros lugares. Esta cobija colorida, de algodón o lana, fue desarrollada para añadir color y belleza a los charros de siglos pasados.

A través de la historia el sarape ha sido usado por vaqueros, jinetes, soldados y revolucionarios. Hoy día el sarape, jorongo, frazada, gabán o cobija se ha convertido en símbolo de tradición mexicana y se encuentra decorando hogares, restaurantes e iglesias. México no es el único país que ha desarrollado un mestizaje en tela, también Guatemala, Colombia, El Salvador y otros más tienen sus telas y tapetes particulares que mezclan los colores y los diseños para celebrar el talento y la creatividad del mestizaje latinoamericano.
