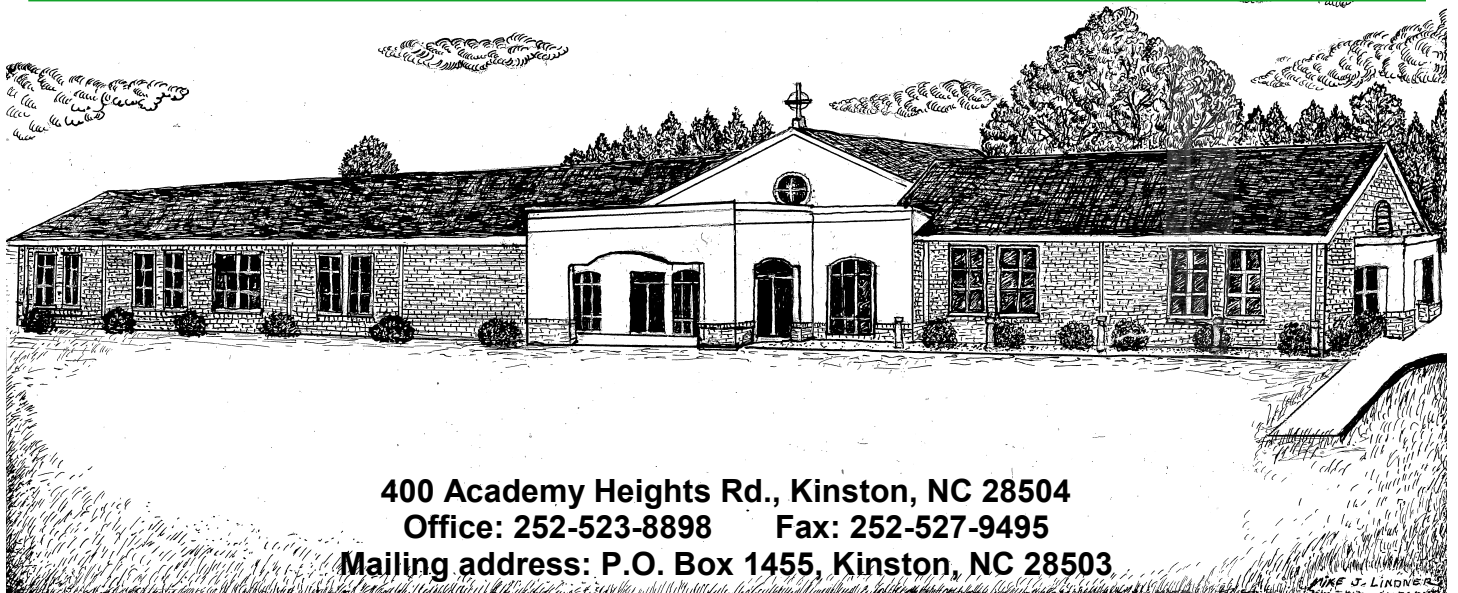

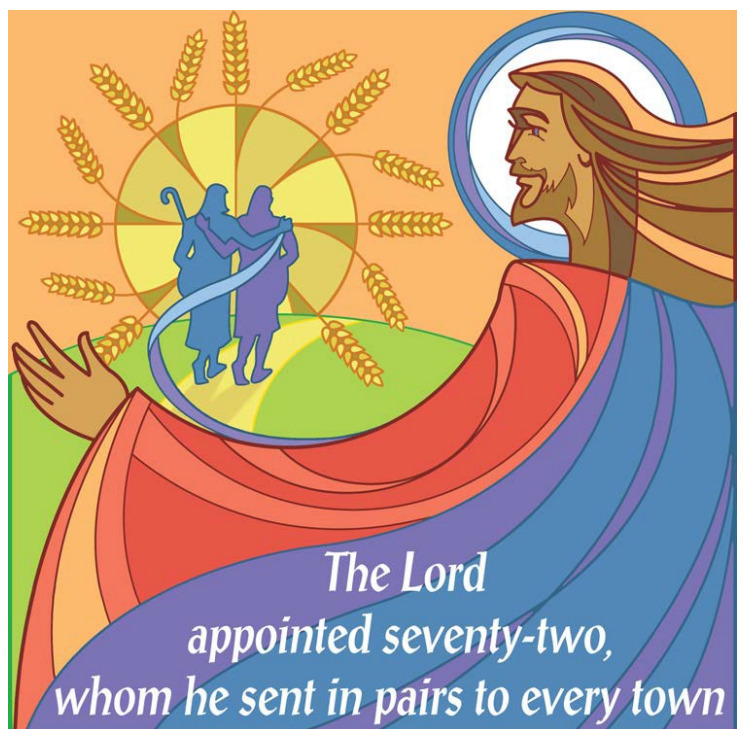

GOD'S PROVIDENCE

Today's readings celebrate God's providence. No matter how wonderful (or heartbreaking) our relationships are, God always provides for us. No one cares for us the way God does.

Isaiah delights us with a deeply intimate image of God caring for us "as a mother comforts her child." The prophet describes us not as the usual "children of God," but as "babies." We should not resist this image, but rejoice in it. Trusting in God's care, we can all let down our guard and rest like infants in the lap of our mother.

Saint Paul's trust in God allows him to be at peace like this. He boldly declares that no one can "make troubles" for him, because he has given himself completely to Jesus. And when Jesus sends his disciples out to preach and heal, he challenges them not to provide for themselves, but to let faith be their guide.

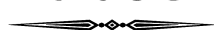

Preface:

This book is a *cri de caeur*, a cry from the heart. I am a lifelong Catholic, and I've been a priest for thirty-three years and a bishop for four years. I have dedicated my life to the Church. The sexual abuse scandal has been for me, for millions of other Catholics, and especially for the victim-survivors, lacerating. I have written this book for my fellow Catholics who feel, understandably, demoralized, scandalized, angry beyond words, and ready to quit. What I finally urge my brothers and sisters in the Church to do is stay and fight— and to do so on behalf of themselves and their families, but especially on behalf of those who have suffered so grievously at the hands of wicked men. Of course, I'm also happy if those outside the Church find some illumination in these chapters as well.

I want to be clear about something at the outset: I am not speaking in the name of my brother bishops, or of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, or the Vatican. I have no authority whatsoever to do so. I am speaking in my own name, as a Catholic, a priest, and a bishop. My prayer is that these reflections might encourage Catholics who are attempting to navigate today in very choppy waters.

July 8th: Lawrence E. Lucas, author, "Black Priest White Church" born NYC - 1933

Saints of the Week

Tuesday, July 9th: Saint Augustine Zhao Rong, Priest, and Companions, Martyrs; Having encountered the presence of the divine, Jacob earns the right to enter Canaan. Jesus prays for laborers for the harvest. The 120 martyrs honored today died between 1648 and 1930. Most of them (eighty-seven) were born in China and were children, parents, catechists, or laborers, ranging from nine years of age to seventy-two. This group included four Chinese priests. The thirty-three foreign-born martyrs were mostly priests or women religious, especially from the Order of Preachers (including St. Francis Capillas, who died January 15, 1648, proto-martyr of China), the Paris Foreign Mission Society, the Friars Minor, Jesuits, Salesians, and Franciscan Missionaries of Mary. Augustine Zhao Rong was a Chinese soldier who accompanied the prisoner Bishop John Gabriel Yaurin Dufresse (Paris Mission Society) to his martyrdom in Beijing. Moved by the bishop's courage, Augustine sought baptism and not long after was ordained a diocesan priest. He was martyred in 1815. Beatified in groups at various times, these 120 martyrs were canonized October 1, 2000 by Pope John Paul II.

Thursday, July 11th: Saint Benedict, Abbot; died 547

at age 67; wrote famous monastic Rule noted for its wisdom and moderation and need for obedience; "Let all follow the Rule as their guide in everything, and let no one rashly depart from it"; founded twelve monasteries including Monte Cassino; Benedictines today number some 7,500 religious; considered the "Patriarch of Western Monasticism"; a patron of Europe.

Saturday, July 13th: Saint Henry; died 1024 at age 52: together with his wife, St. Cunegunda, he assisted the poor; as emperor, he respected the Church's freedom, fostering ecclesiastical and monastic reform; founded the See of Bamberg as a center for missions to the Slavs; patron of Benedictine oblates.

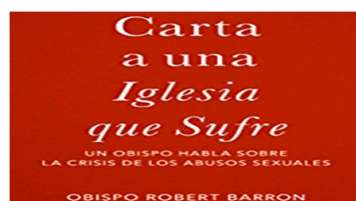

Prefacio:

Este libro es un grito del corazón. Soy católico de toda la vida, y he sido sacerdote durante treinta y tres años y obispo durante cuatro años. He dedicado mi vida a la Iglesia. El escándalo del abuso sexual ha sido lacerante para mí, para millones de otros católicos y especialmente para las víctimas-sobrevivientes. He escrito este libro para mis compañeros católicos que se sienten, comprensiblemente, desmoralizados, escandalizados, enojados más allá de las palabras y listos para renunciar. Lo que finalmente insto a mis hermanos en la Iglesia a que hagan es quedarse y luchar, y hacerlo en nombre de ellos mismos y sus familias, pero especialmente en nombre de aquellos que han sufrido tan gravemente a manos de hombres malvados. Por supuesto, también me alegra que los que están fuera de la Iglesia también encuentren algo de iluminación en estos capítulos. Quiero dejar algo claro desde el principio: no estoy hablando en nombre de mis hermanos obispos, ni de la Conferencia de Obispos Católicos de los Estados Unidos, ni del Vaticano. No tengo ninguna autoridad para hacerlo. Estoy hablando en mi propio nombre, como católico, sacerdote y obispo. Mi oración es que estas reflexiones puedan animar a los católicos que intentan navegar hoy en aguas muy agitadas.
