



August 1, 2021 Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

THE BREAD OF LIFE

Today's Gospel has the crowd asking Jesus three questions. First, "When did you get here," to which Jesus responds by rebuking them for their failure to grasp his miracle as a "sign," an occasion to put faith in him. Their second question about accomplishing the "works of God" has Jesus respond that faith is the "work" that God wishes. Many scholars believe this is John's answer to the faith-works dichotomy emerging in the early Christian community. Faith is the work of God in the believer, John would have us understand. The third question asked by the crowd is a request for a "sign" that would allow them to put faith in Jesus, as the manna in the desert allowed the Israelites to put faith in the Lord God. Jesus answers by revealing himself as the "bread of life" that "comes down from heaven and gives life to the world."

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TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — The people of Israel receive bread from heaven in response to their grumbling (Exodus 16:2-4, 12-15).

Psalm — The Lord gave them bread from heaven (Psalm 78).

Second Reading — Put on the new self that has been created in God's way (Ephesians 4:17, 20-24).

Gospel — I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger (John 6:24-35).

Saint John Vianney

Saint John Vianney is the patron saint of parish priests. Let us pray for the parish priests of the entire world, especially on his feast day, August 4th.

A busy pastor jokingly suggests the secret of John Vianney's holiness: "He died seventeen years before telephones!" Call they didn't, but visit they did, keeping Vianney eighteen hours a day in the confessional. Stories abound of reading hearts and exorcisms, but Vianney's first miracle was getting ordained. Difficulty with studies delayed him, prompting the rector's apology to the bishop, "So far to ordain just one, especially this one!" The bishop, who could not know he was ordaining the future patron saint of parish priests, replied, "No burden to ordain one good priest!" In Ars, only an elderly handful attended Mass, "praying," one told Vianney, "for a priest with brains." But he stayed forty-two years, fulfilling the promise he made the day he arrived. In a sculpture just outside the village Vianney points skyward: "Show me the way to Ars," he tells a boy, "and I'll show you the way to heaven." To someone who feared there was no heaven beyond the grave, Vianney smiled, "My child, it would have been heaven enough to have lived as Jesus' disciple on earth." —Peter Scagnelli, Copyright (c) J. TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

If the alb is the premier baptismal garment, then why are there so many other styles of vesture in evidence in our parishes? In some places, altar servers and other ministers might wear a garment, usually black, called a cassock. Over that is normally worn a white garment (a "surplice"), reminiscent of the alb but much shorter, often of starched linen and trimmed with lace. The cassock is not a liturgical garment, but a clerical robe. Its origins lie in the religious habit of monks. By the late Middle Ages, diocesan priests and clerics increasingly were encouraged to emulate religious priests. Very small boys were often apprenticed to monasteries, especially for music education, and would be invested with a cassock and sometimes even inducted into the ranks of clerics.

For centuries before the Reformation, it was required that all men entering higher education be clerics, and so the cassock and its variations became familiar academic garb. At the Reformation, many ministers retained a form of the cassock as ordinary dress, rejecting liturgical garments. In the seventeenth century, the English Civil War was in part provoked by the Archbishop of Canterbury's insistence that ministers wear surplices. Although the Episcopal Church now retains "cassock and surplice" as the normal dress for lay men and women assisting at liturgy, Catholics are increasingly attentive to the deeply traditional treasure of the alb, our baptismal robe, when special liturgical vesture is needed.

Saints of the Week


Monday, August 2nd: (1) Saint Eusebius of Vercelli, Bishop; died 371 at age 88; considered the founder of the canons regular in the West; defender of St. Athanasius; exiled to Palestine by Constantius; with St. Hilary (13 Jan.), an opponent of Arianism.

(2) Saint Peter Julian Eymard, Priest; died 1 August 1868 at age 57; born at La Mure d'Isère, France, 4 Feb. 1811; founded (1856) the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament, today numbering some 900 members, devoted to the worship and apostolate of the Eucharist as the center of the life of the Church and society; in 1858 founded the Servants of the Blessed Sacrament, a contemplative women's community; influenced the founding of the Eucharistic Fraternity for the laity, the Association of Priest Adorers, and international Eucharistic congresses.

Wednesday, August 4th: Saint John Vianney, Priest; died 1859 at age 73; universally known as the "Curé of Ars"; compassionate spiritual counselor who spent usually no less than eleven hours every day in the confessional in the winter, sixteen in the summer; patron of priests and the parish clergy.

Thursday, August 5th: The Dedication of the Basilica of Saint Mary Major; following the declaration of Mary as Teotokos ("God-bearer") by the Council of Ephesus in 431, Pope Sixtus III erected in Rome this oldest basilica in the West dedicated to the Mother of God.

Saturday, August 7th: Saint Sixtus II, Pope, and Companions, Martyrs; were arrested on 6 Aug. 258 while celebrating the Eucharist in the cemetery of Callistus; by order of Valerian, they were decapitated that same day.

EL PAN DE VIDA

El Evangelio de hoy presenta a la gente haciéndole tres preguntas a Jesús. Primero: “¿cuándo llegaste acá?”, a la que Jesús responde con una reprimenda por su incapacidad para entender el milagro como una “señal”, una ocasión para poner la fe en él. La segunda pregunta tenía que ver con la realización de las “obras de Dios” a la que Jesús responde que la fe es la “obra” que Dios desea. Muchos eruditos creen que esta es la respuesta de Juan a la dicotomía fe-obras que estaba surgiendo en la primera comunidad cristiana. La fe es la obra de Dios en el creyente, Juan nos quiere hacer entender. La tercera pregunta que hace la multitud es una “señal” que les permita poner su fe en Jesús, como el maná en el desierto permitió a los israelitas poner su fe en el Señor Dios. Jesús responde con la revelación de que él es el “pan de vida” que “baja del cielo y da la vida al mundo”.

San Juan Vianney

San Juan Vianney es el santo patrón de los párrocos. Oremos por los párrocos de todo el mundo, especialmente en su día festivo, el 4 de agosto.

Un pastor ocupado sugiere en broma el secreto de la santidad de John Vianney: "¡Murió diecisiete años antes que los teléfonos!" No llamaron, pero sí visitaron, manteniendo a Vianney dieciocho horas al día en el confesionario. Abundan las historias de lectura de corazones y exorcismos, pero el primer milagro de Vianney fue la ordenación. La dificultad con los estudios lo retrasó, lo que provocó la disculpa del rector al obispo: "¡Hasta ahora, para ordenar solo uno, especialmente este!" El obispo, que no podía saber que estaba ordenando al futuro santo patrón de los párrocos, respondió: "¡No es una carga ordenar a un buen sacerdote!" En Ars, sólo un puñado de ancianos asistió a misa, "rezando", le dijo uno a Vianney, "por un sacerdote con cerebro". Pero se quedó cuarenta y dos años, cumpliendo la promesa que hizo el día que llegó. En una escultura en las afueras del pueblo, Vianney señala hacia el cielo: "Muéstrame el camino a Ars", le dice a un niño, "y te mostraré el camino al cielo". Para alguien que temía que no hubiera cielo más allá de la tumba, Vianney sonrió: "Hijo mío, hubiera sido suficiente cielo haber vivido como discípulo de Jesús en la tierra".


